Managed by Mrs. James Metcalf, the cafeteria serves food and confections to a large percentage of the student body every school day. The students are served in the large dining hall, while a smaller dining room is provided for the teachers who wish to enjoy privacy and quiet during their

noon meal. Lunches are served at 11 o'clock, 12 o'clock, and ! o'clock.

The quantities of food served daily are kept fresh and wholesome in three huge refrigerators, then it is sanitarily prepared in the spacious kitchen which is equipped with a new \$500 dishwasher. Most of the help in the kitchen and behind the counters is student labor, with a capable staff of women employed to supervise them.
