General Information

The San Joaquin Valley District, California Federation of Women's Clubs, consisting of Fresno, Kern, Kings, Madera, Merced, Stanislaus and Tulare Counties, is one of the six districts which comprise our great California Federation of Women's Clubs, which in turn is a part of the General Federation of Women's Clubs, an international organization of women working for the betterment of humanity throughout the world.

The San Joaquin Valley District has 72 Federated clubs, total membership 4,825.

DUES

District dues of twenty (20) cents per capita, and State dues of twenty-five (25) cents per capita, payable on or before January 2nd of each club year, shall be paid to the District Treasurer.

County dues in accordance with the By-Laws of each County shall be payable to the Treasurer of such County.

For clubs belonging to the General Federation, dues of ten (10) cents per capita shall be payable to the General Federation Treasurer.

FEDERATION NEWS

The California Federation News is our official state magazine. Subscribe through your District Chairman of Federation News or direct to the office at Placentia, California.

Single subscriptions are 50 cents per year, or a 25-cent rate for 100% club subscription. Clubs of 250 or more membership, subscribing in blocks of 50, may receive the magazine at a 35-cent rate.

San Joaquin Valley District has the largest percentage of clubs subscribing 100%. Refer to the back of the Year Book for list of clubs who are 100% subscribers.

FOUNDATION FUND

This fund was begun in 1929 for the furtherance of Federation work. Each club member has been asked to give \$2.50 toward this fund, although it is not a compulsory obligation. One-half of this fund goes to the General Federation and one-half stays in the state. In California, the interest from this fund is added to the Endowment Fund interest to send speakers to the clubs.

San Joaquin Valley District has the largest percentage of clubs paid, all but fifteen of the seventy-two clubs in the district being paid in full. Our goal is a 100% district.
