NOTICE.

All communications must be addressed to JOHN FALCONER, Permanent Secretary, at 102 O'Farrell Street, San Francisco, Cal.

CAUTION.—The Chief Ranger is strictly enjoined not to give the PASSWORD to any but financial members of the Court, except upon printed authority from a member's Court with the Court Seal affixed. In every case the PASSWORD must be given to each member singly and in private. The Beadles are also cautioned against the PASSWORD being heard at the portal of the Court, and that the portal is closed previous to a member addressing the Chief Ranger.

The PASSWORD must not be communicated to any member prior to the time when it comes in force. The proper time for it to be given is on the last meeting night in January, April, July and October.

COUNCIL MEETINGS.

The regular meetings of the Executive Council are held in the Council Chambers, 102 O'Farrell Street, on the first Saturday of each month, at 8 P. M., at which place the goods and effects of the High Court are kept, and from which any information respecting the order may be obtained.

Courts are requested to notify the Executive Council of any error that may appear in the sums credited to their Court in this report.

The assistance of the officers and members of each Court is solicited in the building up of the Endowment Fund.

For the information of the members of the Court, it shall be the duty of the Chief Ranger to see that the address of the Executive Council printed in the Quarterly Reports, and all other documents issued from the Executive Council, be read in open Court, at least one regular meeting night after receiving the same.

REGULATIONS FOR THE GOVERNMENT OF THE MEETING.

1. No Delegate shall be allowed to leave the High Court meeting previous to the conclusion of its sittings, unless he has first procured the sanction of the meeting to do so. Any delegate leaving without such permission shall be fined \$1, to be paid to the High Court Fund—Law 4.

2. No Delegate shall be allowed to speak twice on any subject, except the mover or seconder of an original proposition, as may be agreed between them, without the consent of the meeting.

3. No speaker shall be allowed to address the meeting for a longer period than ten minutes without consent of the meeting.

4. Any Delegate or Officer of the High Court using any offensive language toward another delegate or officer, shall be fined a sum not exceeding \$5; or using any unbecoming language to the H. C. R. to be fined a sum not exceeding \$10.

5. Any Delegate, after having been called to order, interrupting by improper conduct the business of the meeting, his misconduct shall be reported to his Court, and the High Court shall levy a fine not exceeding \$25.

6. The Subsidiary High Court to be opened each day at 9:30 A.M., and a fine of \$1 recorded against each Delegate who is not present. Roll will be called promptly at the opening of each session. This rule to apply to all sessions. Fines not to be remitted except for legal excuse.

7. The session shall be from 9:30 A. M. to 12 M., and from 2 to 5 P. M., unless otherwise ordered by the Subsidiary High Court.

8. Every resolution offered in the Subsidiary High Court shall be stated in writing on its being put from the Chair, and every proposed alteration of a law shall come separately before the meeting, and the loss of one motion shall not invalidate the next, but each notice on the paper shall be put to the meeting for and against, and decided upon its merits—no motion for “the law to remain as it is” to be put to the meeting.

9. Cushing's Manual shall govern where not otherwise provided for.

TO THE OFFICERS AND MEMBERS OF THE COURT:

We herewith present you with our Sixth Quarterly Report, and in doing so are reminded that the term of our stewardship is rapidly drawing to a close, and that in a few weeks we shall meet in High Court session and be called upon to surrender our trust to our successors. In reviewing the progress and continued success of our Order during the term now nearly closed we may say, with just pride, that we are in such a substantial condition, both numerically and financially, that the future is pregnant with much greater success than ever before in our history.

Let the good work continue. It is by a constant display of energy and activity that the goal that we are striving for will be to make "The Ancient Order of Foresters" the first and foremost Fraternal Society on the Pacific Coast.

NEW COURTS.

During the quarter ending March 31, 1895, ten new Courts were added to our Order, viz:

In the membership of these New Courts, we have received valuable additions to our Fraternity, since March 31, we have organized Court Violet 8356, San Francisco, Court Hydraulic 8357, North Bloomfield, Cal., and Court Magnolia 8358, Napa, Cal. a gain of 62 Courts since the meeting of Subsidiary High Court, at San Jose, November 5, 1893. Making a total in this Jurisdiction of 143 Courts.

SUSPENDED.

Suspended during the term, ten Courts, leaving 133 Courts with a membership of 7797, a net gain of membership for the term of 1599, with a net increase of 51 Courts.

ENDOWMENT FUND.

We will repeat what we have stated on previous occasion, let our members look into this very important feature of our Order. If thoroughly understood, there would be an increase of over one thousand members in a short period. Brothers, do not forget that this fund may prove a real friend in the time of need! But for this Fund much misery and suffering may be encountered by widows and orphans of our deceased brothers, who may be thrown upon the Benevolence and Charity of the Courts to which these Brothers belonged. By joining this Branch of the Order, each member is providing against calamity and protecting his family from want in a manly and independent manner, and you may rest at ease when the call from the High Chief Ranger of the Universe comes. Delays are ever dangerous.

UNIFORM RANK.

This branch of the Order has not received the support it should have received and we recommend that some action be taken at the coming session, so that it will receive the support of every Court and member.

JUVENILES.

This branch of our Order is represented by Star of the West Juvenile Court, and its success is most gratifying. We should have more Juvenile Courts in this jurisdiction. The importance of this branch cannot be overestimated, and it behooves every brother to assist in establishing Juvenile Courts within this jurisdiction.

A. O. F. HALL ASSOCIATION.

The A. O. F. Hall Association has been a great help to our Order. It is the home of Forestry, and should receive the hearty support of every Court and Circle.

PERMANENT SECRETARY.

We would not be doing our duty if we did not say a few words in favor of Permanent Secretary John Falconer. The labors in this office are continually increasing, and only those who are familiar with the work of his office can appreciate the amount of labor performed by him. A great deal of credit is due his devotion and zeal for the prosperity of the Order in this jurisdiction, and we hope he will long continue to serve the Order as faithfully as he is now doing.

CONCLUSION.

In concluding this report we wish to return our sincere thanks to the membership of the Order for the assistance they have rendered us during our term of office.

Thus we place the charge intrusted to us back into your hands, with the consciousness that we have performed our part to the best of our ability.

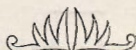

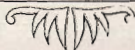

COMPANIONS OF THE FOREST.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO GRAND CIRCLE GENERAL LAWS.

FROM OAK GROVE CIRCLE 149.

ADD NEW SECTION TO ARTICLE VI—Circles electing delegates shall do so at their last regular meeting, in February of the year in which the Grand Circle meets.

Circles may elect an alternate, who shall have the right to vote in the absence of the delegate.

STRIKE OUT ARTICLE XXXIV AND INSERT NEW ARTICLE—No addition, alteration or amendment to these laws shall be made, unless presented at a regular session of the Grand Circle and adopted by a two-thirds vote of all the delegates to the Grand Circle meeting. Notice of such amendment must be made under seal of Circle or Past Chief Companion Association, attested by the Financial Secretary and sent to the Executive Board not later than March 31st, for insertion in the April Report, otherwise it will not be acted upon, subject however, to the right of the Committee on Laws and Supervisions, to amend, modify and reconstruct any and all the proposed additions, alterations, amendments, recommendations and suggestions so presented for consideration at a Grand Circle meeting, and also to make such further recommendation as in their judgment may be conducive to the interest and advantage of the Order. No amendment to the General Laws shall be received by the E. B. unless legibly written in ink.

FROM PAST CHIEF COMPANION ASSOCIATION.

ARTICLE 28, PAGE 31—From the word "membership" on fourth line, strike out all up to and including the word "member" on the tenth line.

ARTICLE IX, SECTION I, PAGE 55—From the word "to" on the third line insert "such application must be referred to a committee of three and take the same course as an application for membership." Strike out remainder of section.

FROM COLUMBIA CIRCLE NO. 150.

ADD NEW SECTION TO ARTICLE IV, TO READ AS FOLLOWS—The Treasurer and Financial Secretary and Trustees shall each, before entering upon the duties of their office, give bonds for the faithful per-

formance of their office to the satisfaction of the Circle; the amount shall be fixed from time to time; the bonds of the Treasurer and Financial Secretary shall be held by the chairman of the Trustees, and those of the Trustees by the Chief Companion for the benefit of the Circle.

FROM CALIFORNIA CIRCLE NO. 103.

ARTICLE VI, SECTION 2—Strike out last twelve words.

ARTICLE VII, SECTION 2—Strike out last line and insert in lieu thereof "notice thereof, which must be given to every member of the Grand Circle fifteen days prior to such special meeting.

ARTICLE XXIV, SECTION 2—Strike out the words from and including "failing" in fourth line to and including "time" in seventh line, and in lieu thereof insert "whose arrearages of all kinds exceed the amount of three months circle dues."

SECTION 9—Strike out the section and insert in lieu thereof.

SECTION 9—The funeral benefits provided for by this Article shall be paid in full only in case of members of not less than twelve months good standing; in case of a member of less than twelve, but not less than six months good standing, half of said benefits.

Members of less than six months good standing shall be entitled to no benefits hereunder.

Constitution of Subordinate Circle, Article 5, Section 5. Insert between "cents" and "nor" on third line the words "payable in advance."

FROM SOCIAL CIRCLE NO. 118.

ARTICLE II, SECTION 1—On second line after the word "be" insert "Junior Past Grand Chief Companion." Strike out Section 4 and 5 of Article 5, Subordinate Constitution, and insert new section to read as follows:

The initiation fee of beneficiary members for subordinate Circles shall not be less than

From 16 to 25 years, \$2.00

From 25 to 35 years, \$3.00

From 35 to 50 years, \$4.00

The initiation fee for social member shall not be less than \$2.00, with monthly dues of not less than twenty-five cents.

A social member desiring to become a beneficiary member, shall apply for the same in open Circle and shall pay the balance of initiation fee, from date of application.

New Section 5: Social members shall be eligible to all offices and

privileges as regulated by these laws, but should not be entitled to receive any of the sick benefits.

Provided, however, that a new Circle may fix the initiation fee at \$2.00, irrespective of age for the first term of six months.

FROM OAK GROVE CIRCLE, NO. 149.

ARTICLE VI, SECTION 5.—Subordinate Constitution, fourth line after the word same, insert, “and if six months in arrears, shall not be beneficial until three months after payment for such indebtedness.”

Add new Section to VI Subordinate Constitution, to read as follows:

“Members of the Order residing permanently within the Circle limits of a Circle not their own, shall be privileged to place themselves on the visiting list of the Physician of the Circle nearest their residence while in good health. Any expense incurred on that account to be charged to the Circle of which the Companion is a member; failing to do that, they shall receive nothing more from the Circle to which they apply for relief (other than their own Circle) than visits and advice from its members. This shall not be construed to deprive Companions taken sick while traveling, of all benefits of the Circles to which they may apply for relief, subject, however, to the laws of their own Circle.”

FROM AMERICA CIRCLE, NO. 128.

Article XXXV, Section to be stricken out.

Recommendation to Grand Circle to appoint a committee from among the delegates to revise the Grand Circle Laws and report at the next session.

FROM SHERWOOD CIRCLE, NO. 129.

Article XXVIII—Affiliation:

“A member who wishes to affiliate with a Circle must petition in writing. Such petition must be referred to a committee of three, and take the same course as an application for membership. The member shall be balloted for, and if receiving two-thirds vote of the members present, he or she shall be declared elected; but before being admitted the applicant shall pay the minimum initiation fee. A paper ballot or ball ballot shall be used in all cases of electing a clearance member. No Circle shall grant a clearance until it has been in existence six months; and no Circle shall initiate for a less sum than \$2.00.

FROM BOHEMIAN CIRCLE, NO. 134.

Strike out Sec. 3 of Article 3.

Strike out Sec. 18 of Article 4.

ARTICLE IV, SECTION 14—After the word “shall” strike out “semi-annually” and leave blank space

ARTICLE IV, SECTION 2—On last line after the word Book, insert “no companion under 18 years of age shall be eligible to the office of Chief Companion.”

ARTICLE IV, SECTION 4—On the last line after the word determine, insert “The bond of the Treasurer must be filed on the evening of installation of officers, failing to do so the office shall be declared vacant. No Companion under 18 years of age shall be eligible to the office of Treasurer.”

ARTICLE IV, SECTION 5—On the last line after the word Treasurer, insert “The bonds of the Financial Secretary must be filed on the evening of installation of officers failing to do so the office shall be declared vacant. No Companion under 18 years of age shall be eligible to the office of Financial Secretary.”

ARTICLE V, SECTION 7—On 4th line strike out all that portion commencing with the word “Provided” up and inclusive “power to act.”

Article IX, S. L., add new Section:

“Any member drawing his or her Clearance, shall pay his or her dues up to date of such Clearance, and three months dues [in advance, and the Circle granting the same shall pay all lawful claims accruing within and during six calendar months from said date, under such rules and regulations as the Circle may provide.”

New Section: “In the event of a Clearance being refused to a member, it shall be in the power of the Executive Board to grant such Clearance upon application of a Circle willing to admit the member, providing the Circle to which the member belongs fails in producing satisfactory reasons why the Clearance is refused. Any Circle neglecting to forward their reasons for refusing a Clearance within one calendar month from the same being applied for by the Executive Board, shall be fined one dollar.”

Add new Article XXXV:

“All Subordinate Circles shall pay to the Grand Circle such per capita tax on each member annually as may be levied by the Grand Circle. Such per capita tax shall be due and payable quarterly, at the end of March, June, September and December of each year, upon each member not over six months in arrears. Any Circle neglecting to pay such per capita tax within one month after the same becomes due, as above

set forth, shall become suspended by operation of law, and without any further action being necessary. Any Circle thus suspended may become reinstated on payment of its per capita tax, together with a fine of ten per cent of the amount of said per capita tax.

FROM OAK GROVE CIRCLE, NO. 149.

Add new Section to Article XXXIII, "All fines inflicted by the Grand Chief Companion or Deputy shall be paid into the Grand Circle within 60 days from such being inflicted, failing to pay the same within the time specified shall stand suspended from all the benefits of the Order until such fine is paid."

ARTICLE VII, SECTION 1—On fifth line, after the word officers insert "by a unanimous vote of all its members."

ARTICLE XXXI, SECTION 2—Strike out the entire Section and insert "new Section."

Any member desiring to organize a Circle of the Companions of the Forest shall apply to the Grand Chief Companion or Executive Board, who may create such Companion a Deputy for such purpose, he or she may then proceed to organize the new Circle on obtaining thereby five candidates, he or she shall notify the Grand Chief Companion who will then grant a dispensation for the institution of the new Circle. No Circle shall dissolve or break up or surrender its charter, so long as not less than nine beneficiary members who are willing to continue its existence as a Circle of this Order, but the charter, property and funds of such Circle shall remain in the hands of such members willing as aforesaid to so continue the existence of such Circle, and they shall be entitled to the possession thereof."

Add on Article XXXIV on last line after the word Order, "notice of such amendment must be made under Circle seal attested by recording secretary and sent to the Executive Board, not later than March 31st.

No amendments to the General Laws shall be received by the E. B. unless legibly written in ink.

ARTICLE V, SECTIONS 4 and 5—Strike out both sections and insert new section: "The initiation fee for subordinate Circles shall for beneficial not be less than

From 16 to 25 years, \$2.00.

From 25 to 35 years, \$3.00.

From 35 to 50 years, \$4.00.

The initiation fee for social members shall not be less than \$2.00, with monthly dues of not less than twenty-five cents (25c) for each,

They shall be eligible to all offices and privileges as regulated by these laws, but shall not be entitled to receive sick benefits. The initiation fee for honorary members shall not be less than \$2.00. They shall be eligible to the office of Treasurer and Trustee, but shall not be entitled to receive sick benefits.

Social members wishing to become beneficiary members must comply with the rates of admission of beneficiary's at the time of application to change from one from branch to the other.

FROM OAK GROVE CIRCLE, NO. 149.

ARTICLE I, SECTION 1, General Law—Strike out the entire section and insert the following: "This body shall be known as the Grand Circle of California Companions of Forest, with power to make its own constitution and laws for government of the whole Order, until a Supreme Circle shall be organized."

ARTICLE VI, SECTION 2—After the word thereof, insert "providing such delegate must be a Past Chief Companion in good standing."

ARTICLE XIV, SECTION 2—On second line strike out the words "every quarter" and insert "semi-annually."

ARTICLE XX, SECTION 3: Strike out after the word "Circle" up to and inclusive "quarter", and insert "semi-annually."

ARTICLE VI, SECTION 2. Insert on the last line after the word "thereof," "Each delegate from a Circle shall be entitled to one vote for any number of members less than fifty, and one additional vote for each additional fifty or fractional part thereof exceeding the first fifty, on any question before the Grand Circle, providing the Circle is represented by only one delegate. Each Circle shall only be entitled to mileage for one delegate at each Grand Circle meeting."

ARTICLE III, SECTION 1 Strike out the entire Section and insert the following:

"Nominations for officers shall take place at the last meeting in May and November, and shall be re-opened at the first meeting in June and December of each year, when election of officers shall take place. No member shall be nominated for the office of Chief or Sub-Chief Companion who has not held some subordinate office, or at least the last four months of any term of any officer who may have died, resigned, or whose office has been declared vacant, providing such Circle is less than one year in existence, this section shall have no effect upon such Circle."

ARTICLE VI. Add new Section, 6A, to read as follows:

"The basis upon which Circles shall pay cash benefits is as follows: For the sum of fifty cents per month dues, Circles shall only furnish

medical attendance and medicine; for not less than 75 cents per month dues, cash benefits not to exceed the sum of \$3.00 per week may be paid for the first four weeks, and \$1.50 for the following four weeks, for not less than \$1.00 per month dues, cash benefits not to exceed the sum of \$6.00 per week for the first four weeks, and \$3.00 for the following four weeks, providing Circles having a treasury covering the sum \$10.00 for each member in their Circle, then they may pay a higher rate of cash benefits. No cash benefits to be paid for the first week's sickness, and no fractional part of a week to be allowed, seven days to constitute a week. No circle shall adopt two schedules of dues at one time."

FROM SOCIAL CIRCLE, NO. 118.

ARTICLE V, SECTION 2—Amend by striking out the whole.

ARTICLE XI, SECTION 1—On fourth line after the word "made" insert "and decide all appeals and questions of law."

ARTICLE XIV, SECTION 2—Amend by striking out every "quarter" on second line and insert "semi-annually."

ARTICLE XX, SECTION 1—On fourth line strike out the word "quarter" and insert "six months."

ARTICLE XXI—Amend by striking out the whole Article.

ARTICLE XXII, SECTION 1—Amend to read as follows: "the functions of the Grand Circle Arbitration Committee shall be to hear and try charges preferred against and for the impeachment of present Grand Circle Officers, for official misconduct or any wrongful act committed toward this Grand Circle, its officers, laws or funds."

SECTION 2—Strike out "appeals and" on first line. On fourth line strike out after the first "the," up to and including "committal" and insert "commission," on fifth line strike out "Appeal and," and strike out the words "or appeal" and "or appellant" wherever the same appear in Sections 5, 8 and 10 of Article XXII.

SECTION 9, ARTICLE XXII—On eleventh line, strike out the word "five" and insert "one"

SECTION 13, ARTICLE XXII—Amend by striking out after the word "to" on second line up to and including "to" on fourth line.

SECTION 14, ARTICLE XXII—On first line strike out the words "and for" and "past and" on second line insert after the word officer "and," strike out "or delegates" on the same line.

ARTICLE XXXIV—Amend by striking out entire article and insert in lieu thereof the following: "Section 1—When any doubt arises as to the true meaning of any part of these articles, it shall be determined by the E. B."

NEW SECTION 2—These laws, or any part thereof, shall not be altered or amended, except by majority vote or motion made in writing at a regular session of the Grand Circle.

Any Past Chief Companion may introduce amendments to the Grand Circle Laws. All amendments, alterations and additions to Subordinate Circle Laws shall be referred to the Executive Board and shall not be enforced until notice of their approval shall have been received from the Committee on Laws of Subordinates.

Roberts' Manual shall govern all cases when not in conflict with any laws of the Order.

FROM SATELLITE CIRCLE, NO. 148.

To change the word "fifty" to the words "one hundred" wherever in Sec. 2, Art. 6.

To change the word "seven" to "fifteen" in Sec. 2, Art. 7.

To strike out the words "whether provided for by the Constitution or not" in Sec. 1, Art. 11.

To change the word "may" to "shall" in Sec. 2, Art- 25.

Add Sec. 2 to Act 35 to read as follows: "these laws, and all alterations and amendments thereto, shall go into effect immediately upon their adoption"
