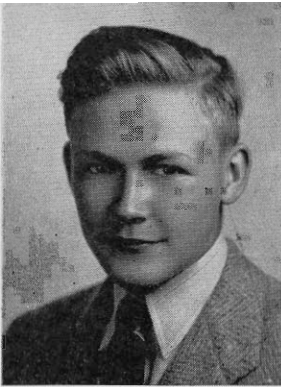
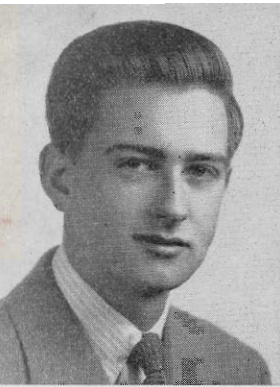

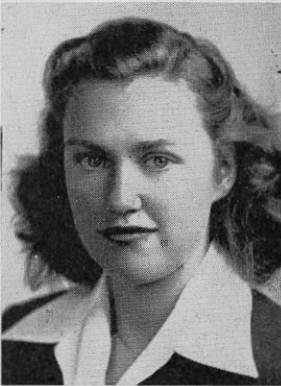


RICHARD JAMES ABBOTT

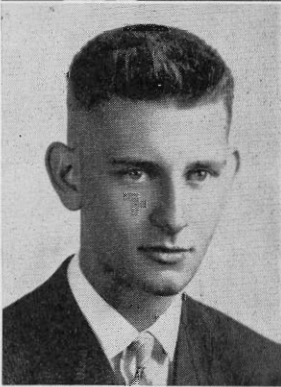
ELISE ALEXANDER

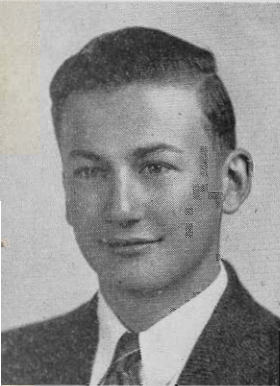


ROBERT ANDERSON

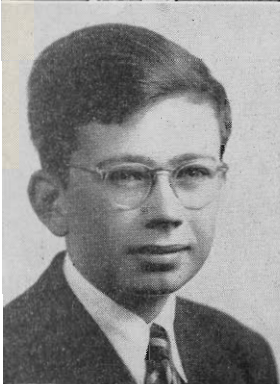


JOHN ROBERT ASHE

A very quiet boy, who took the teasing of the girls with a grin, played the violin in the school orchestra for several years, and was missed by its members when he chose another subject.

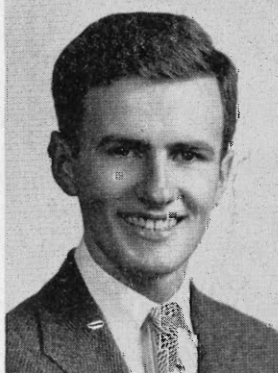


DAVID B. BLUMER

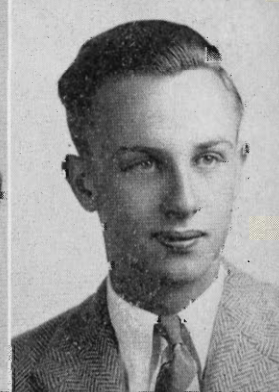


BETTY ANN BOWERS

Pat is well-known throughout the school for her outstanding musical ability. A musical career seems in the making for Pat. She also has to her advantage that certain something that gives her a way with boys.



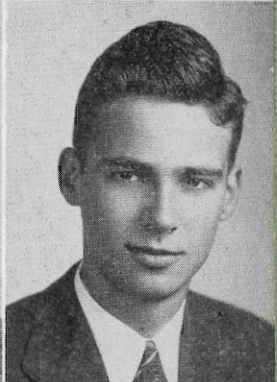

CHESTER S. DENTON, JR.

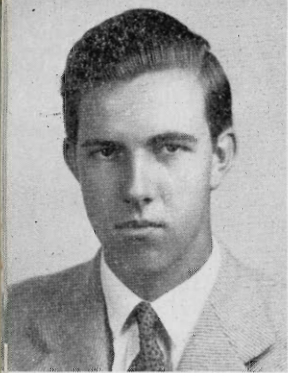

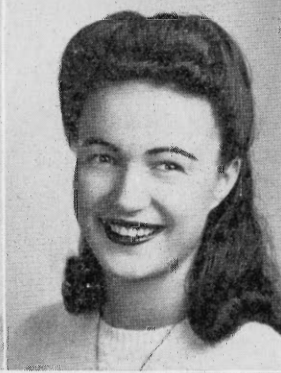
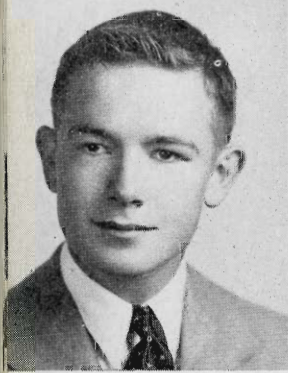


HAROLD MATTHEW DUNN, JR.

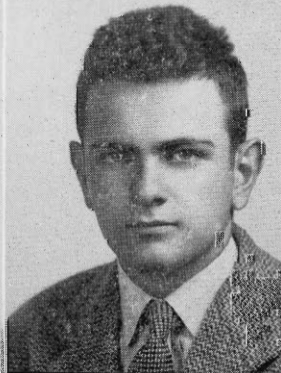
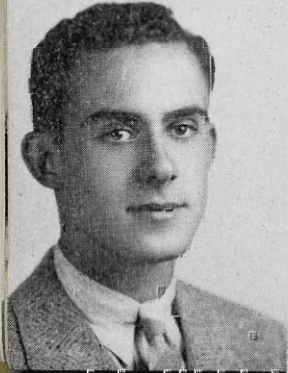


MARGARET JEAN FOLEY

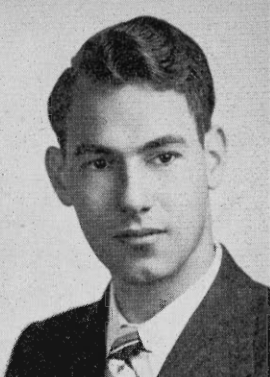
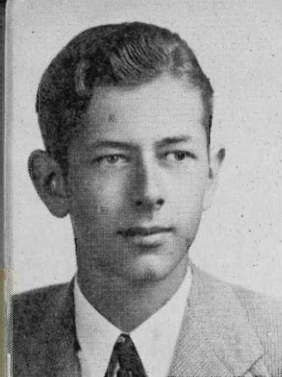
SHIRLEY ANITA HAMILTON

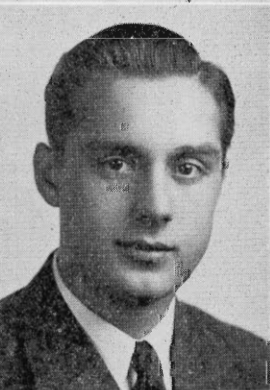
JUNE CAROL HIRSHEY

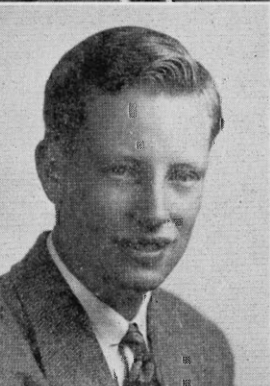


IRENE DOROTHY HOEFER

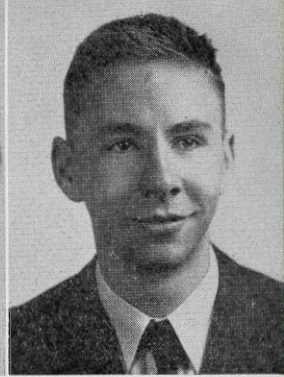
Dark, flashing eyes and wavy hair are two of Thelma's many assets. She is one of those girls who are always in a crowd; if you know her, you'll know why.

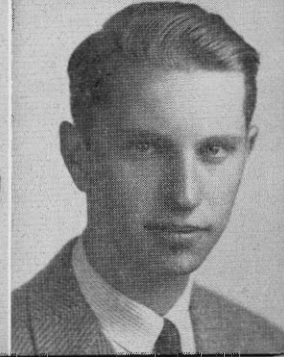


PATRICIA MAHONEY

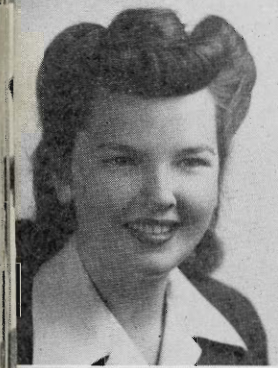


RICHARD LINCOLN STANGER
