GRIFFITH PARK PLANETARIUM—Los Angeles' Theater of the Universe. Affords an opportunity to study the motions of stars and planets. Free admission to museum halls and telescopes. Los Feliz or Riverside Drive motor roads. V car to Griffith Park bus.

MOUNT WILSON OBSERVATORY—35 miles north of Los Angeles via Angeles Crest Highway and Motor Transit. Famous Carnegie Observatory and solar museum open daily; 100-inch telescope. Elevation 6,000 feet, with a view at night of about 60 communities.

CHINATOWN—900 North Broadway, near College Street. Quaint shops and Chinese cafes on "Gin Ling Way" (Street of the Golden Palace). Take W or 5 car.

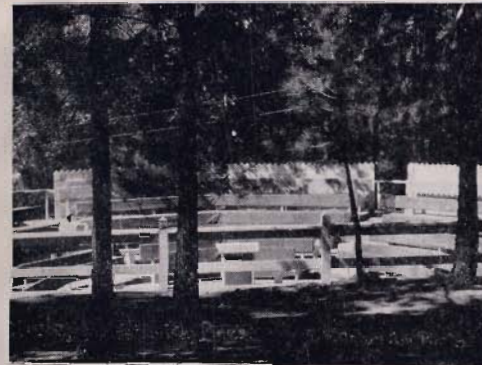
