Counselors Help Students With Many Problems

Every student who attends McClatchy is assigned a counselor. Throughout high school, the student has the same counselor who acts as his advisor in all school matters.

Counselors are a group of teachers especially chosen because of their training and ability to get along well with students and understand their problems. Students also can go to their counselor for help in solving educational, vocational, and personal problems.

If parents wish to find out information, they may go to their child's counselor.

The counseling system was established in Sacramento in 1927 and it has been developing and expanding since.

COUNSELORS DUTIES

The counselor helps the student plan a program of studies and discusses future plans with him.

He will also furnish the student information about college requirements and vocations in which the student is interested. In deciding his educational and vocational goals, student and counselor examine his individual abilities, his grades, the type of vocation the student is interested in, and what the desire of the parents are.

Every semester a new program is made out for each student by the counselor and the student.

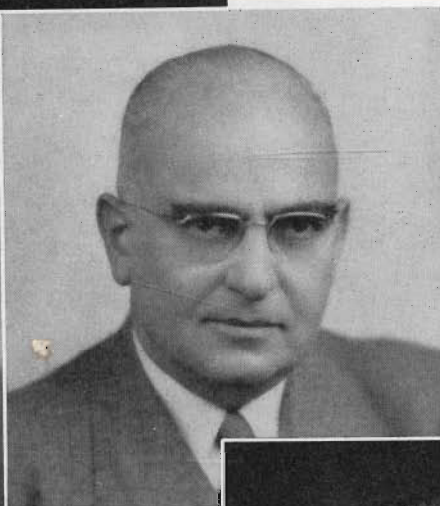

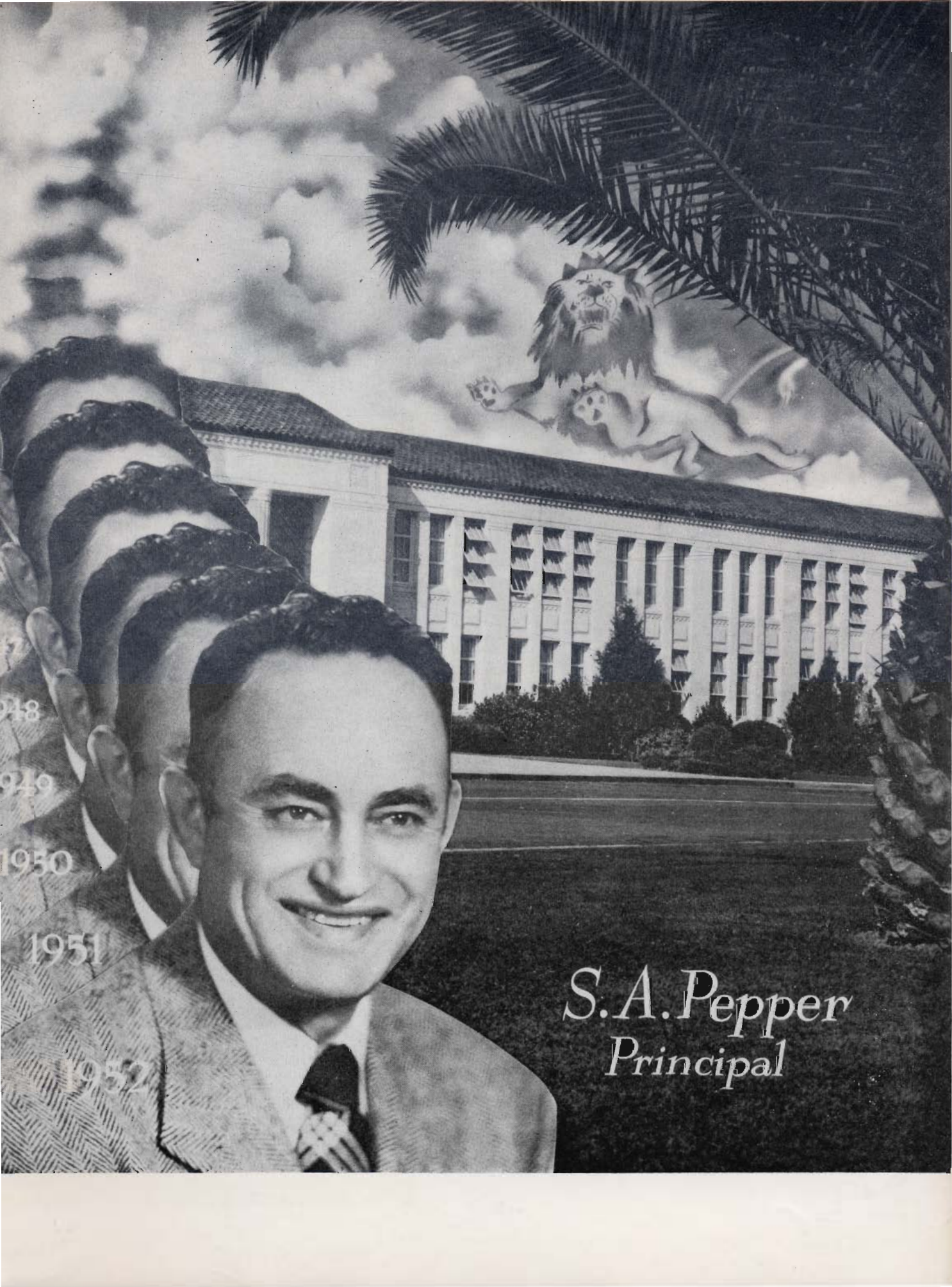

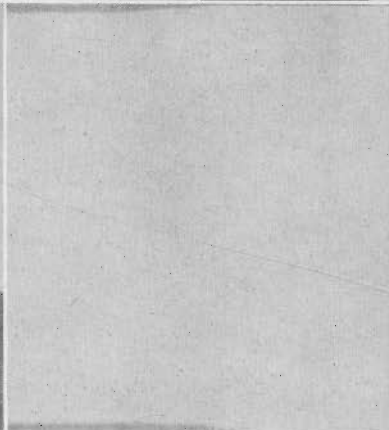
