used in the Nugget.

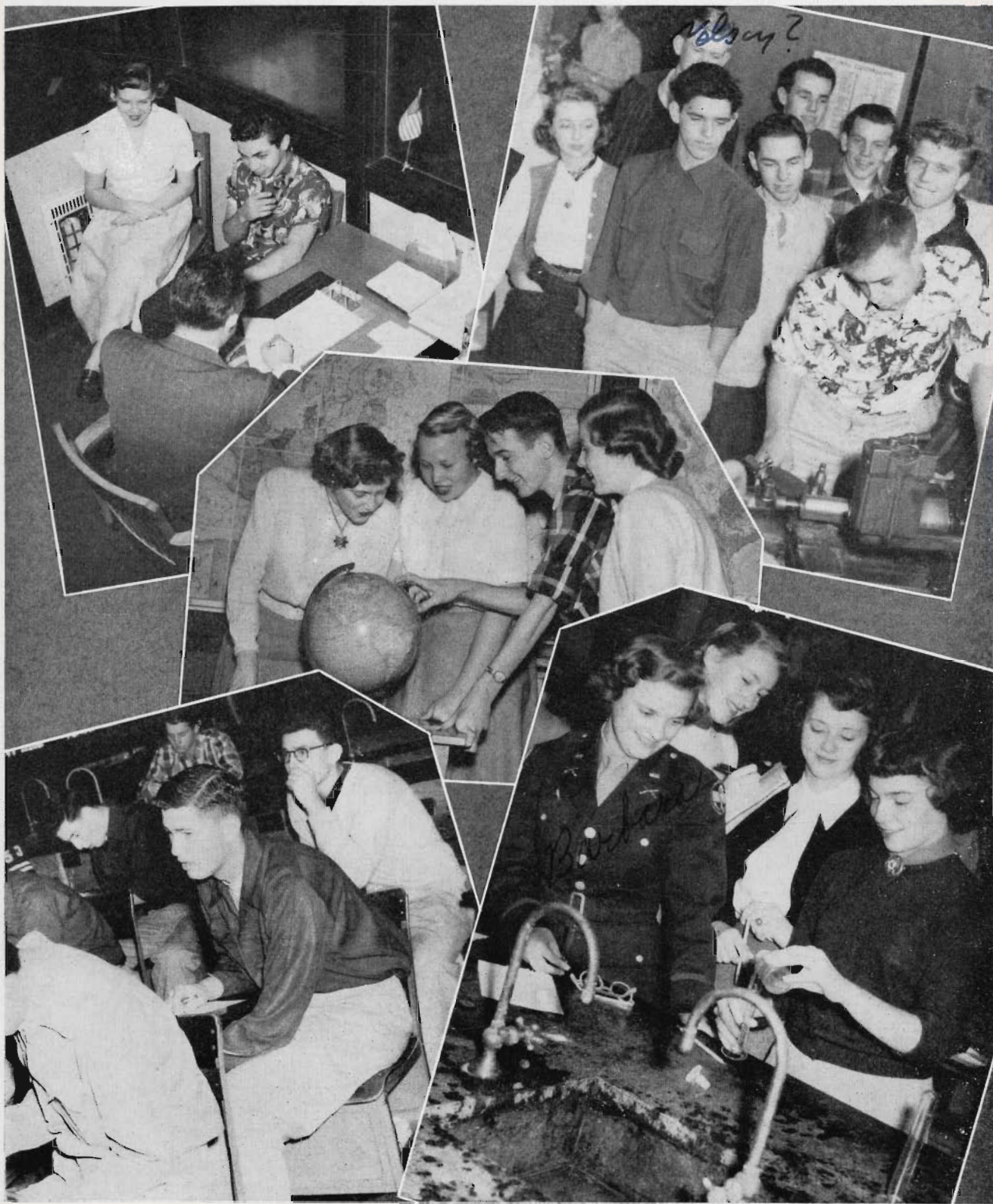

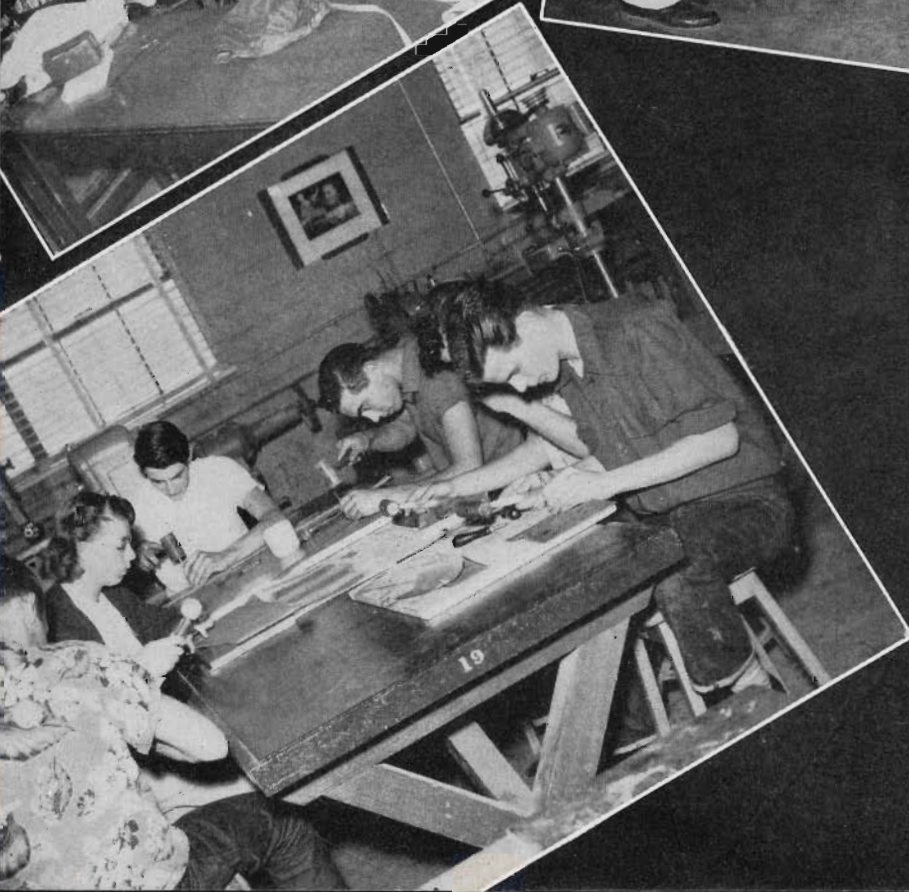

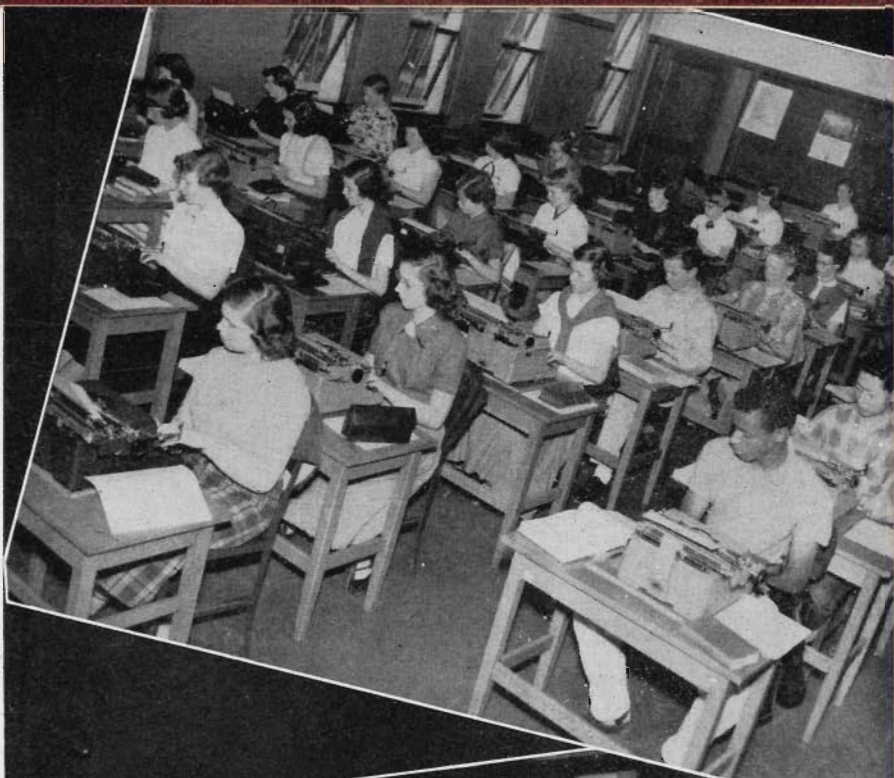
