





John Sheibley bursts into Turkey Game.



LIONS COME ALIVE ON TURKEY DAY

Although the Lions lost to Sacramento High 39-20, the game was by far their best performance of the season. George Relles ran 68 yards for a score and Charles Barr went 66 yards to set up another as McClatchy amassed its greatest single-game scoring output of the season. Chester Grant, Clyde West, and Fritz Reynolds led the defense as the offense ran wild, Relles picking up 130 yards on 17 carries and Barr 157 yards in 18 carries.







The McClatchy Lions' 1966 Sophomore football team ended the season in third place in the Metropolitan League, sporting a win-loss record of 7-3. Under head coach Roger Swearinger and assistants Kirt Schmidt and Paul Cronenwett, the Lions developed a potent offense along with a stout defense. Their superior ability was demonstrated when Joe Blight, Bob Pulis, and Terry Clark were invited to join the Varsity in the Turkey Day clash with Sacramento High.

This Sophomore team was big, tall, fast, and agile. In their 45-0 defeat over Woodland each was demonstrated in abundance. James Wallace literally ran over the opposing defense. Joe Blight hit receivers, who often made fantastic catches, and all the while the Lion defense simulated a brick wall.
