



These students have been recognized for their outstanding performance in all fields of learning. This award is granted by the California College System encouraging these students to further their education.






## BAND AND ORCHESTRA

### CHOIRS


Fine musicians abound at McClatchy. The several choirs offer an always lilting air to the school. Music offers beautiful enjoyment and relaxation and should be a part of every life.
