



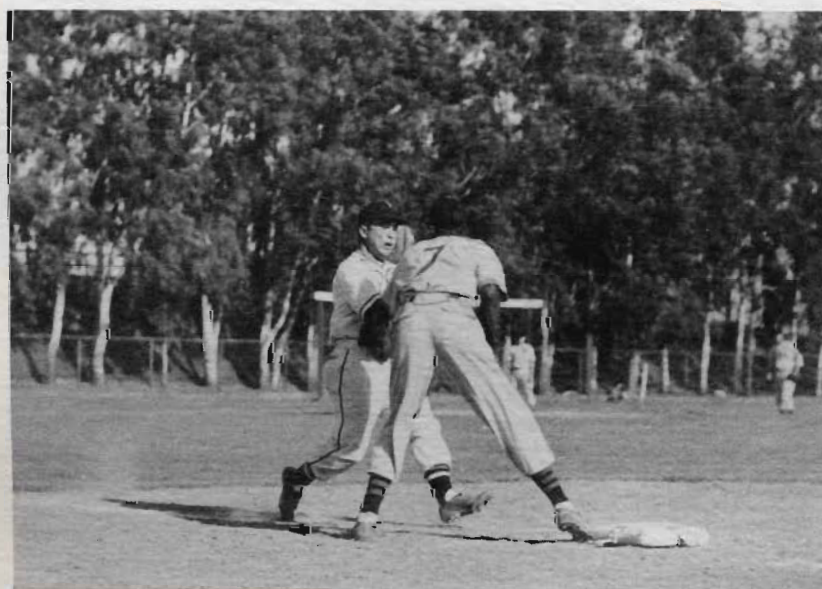

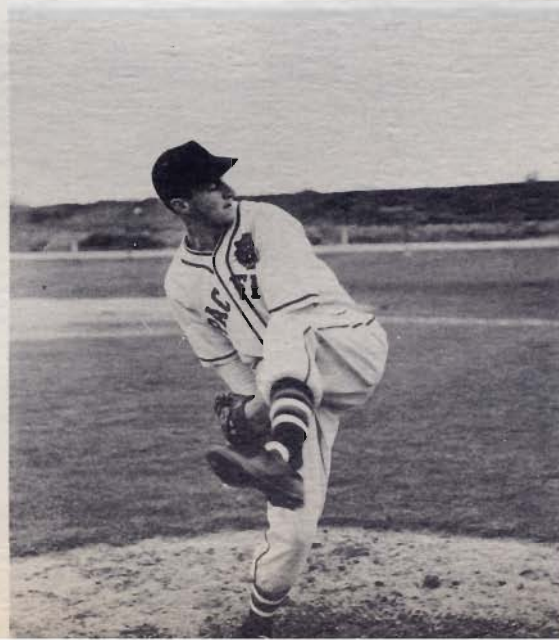

van sweet, the cub coach, is also the stockton college basketball coach in the fall...

standouts on the team are george albano, the short-stop who played second last year, vernon triebwasser, third baseman, and catcher bob graziani... the rest of the cub team consists of don madden, first base; bill sanford, second; al huff, left field; chris mooney, center, and james merrill, right...

the pitching chores are taken on by sam wilson, jack sandman, frank mc carthy, gerald griffin, and bob bondshu...

utility infielders are dave campbell and ed ingram, and the utility outfielders are jim denton and manuel martin...

helping out with the catching are pete peters and nat lane...

the cubs looked impressive in an early season double header with san francisco city college, in which the cubs won the first tilt 9-3, but dropped the tight nightcap, 4-3...

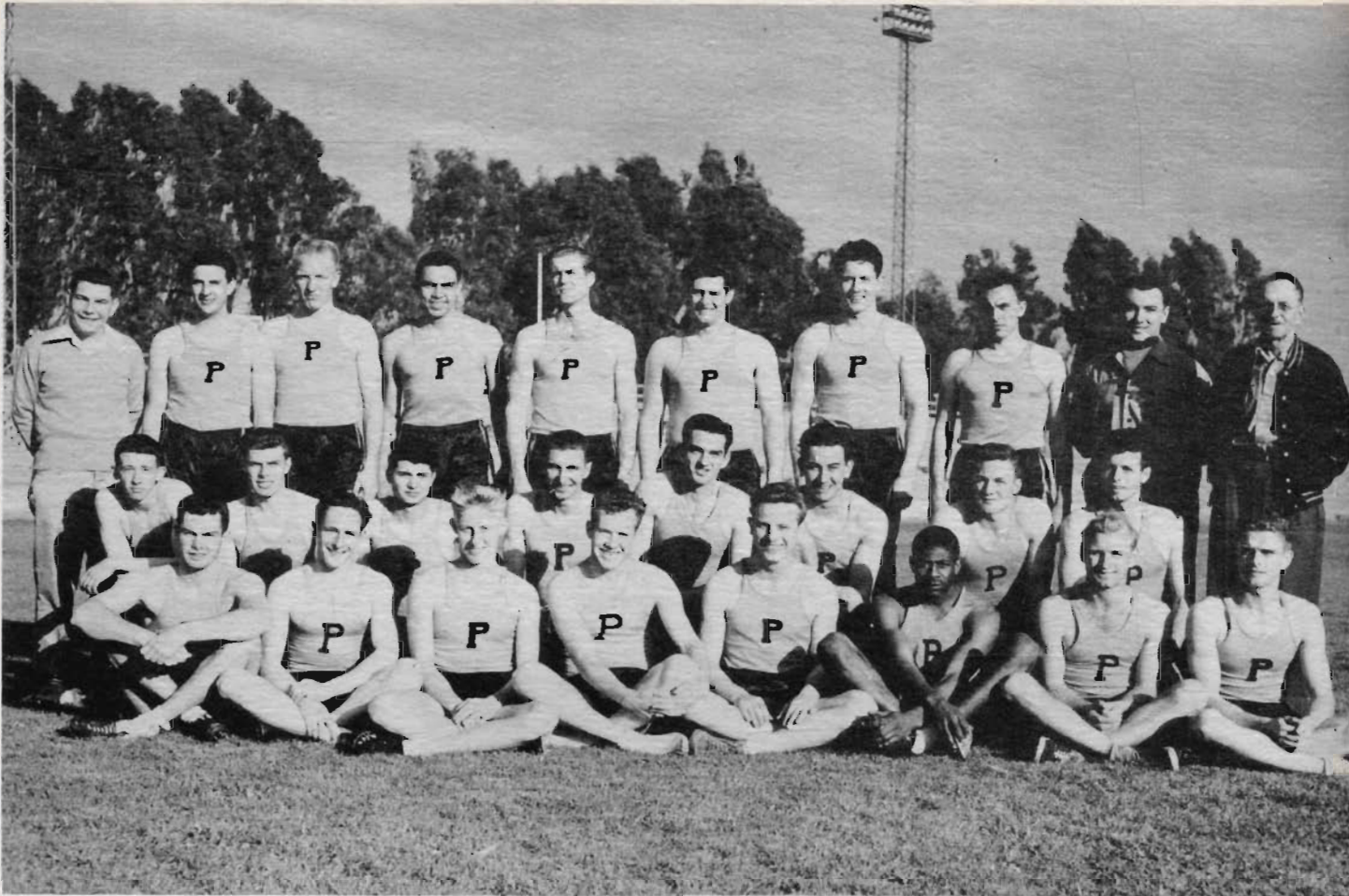

with most of last year's stockton college ncjcc champions bolstering the c o p squad this year, veteran track coach earl jackson looks forward to a good season with the pacific thinclads...

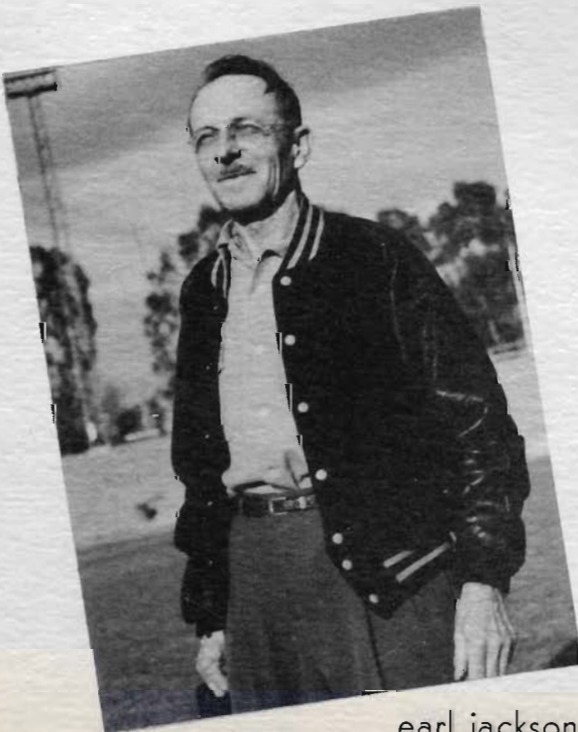
one of the high points of the season was the 71-60 pacific victory over san jose state, marking the first time that the tigers have defeated the spartans in track since 1930... four new meet records were set and two were tied in this meet... eddie macon hung up a new mark of 49.2 in the 440, pole vaulter ray kring broke his own record by clearing 13 feet, $7\frac{7}{8}$ inches; charley richeson's time of 9:55.8 in the two-mile chopped over 15 seconds off the old record, and the mile relay team of clem cope, mo hess, ken butler, and macon set a new record with the time of 3:21.1...

the tiger cindermen are strong in the track events... with don hardey, al smith, and jack ross running the 100- and 220-yard dashes, pacific's opponents will be hard pressed to win these events... cope and macon, both having cracked the :49.0 mark in the 440, team up with butler and hess in this event... butler and two veterans from last year's squad, preston garmire and ken berridge, are the half-milers... the distance runners are jack "gunder" kirkpatrick, richeson, and arner gustafson...

national junior college champion don brooks runs the high and low hurdles, along with paul murray in the highs and howard stokes, murray, hess, and walt polenske in the lows.

in the field events are such dependables as howard adams, hal buck, and bob smith in the high jump, and phil ortez and al smith tossing the javelin... the broad jump assignment is taken care of by hardey, macon, hess, and lee goff..

the shot-putters are duane putnam, who earlier in the season heaved the shot 50' $1\frac{1}{2}$ ", sid hall, and jim watters... hall and al smith are the discuss throwers...



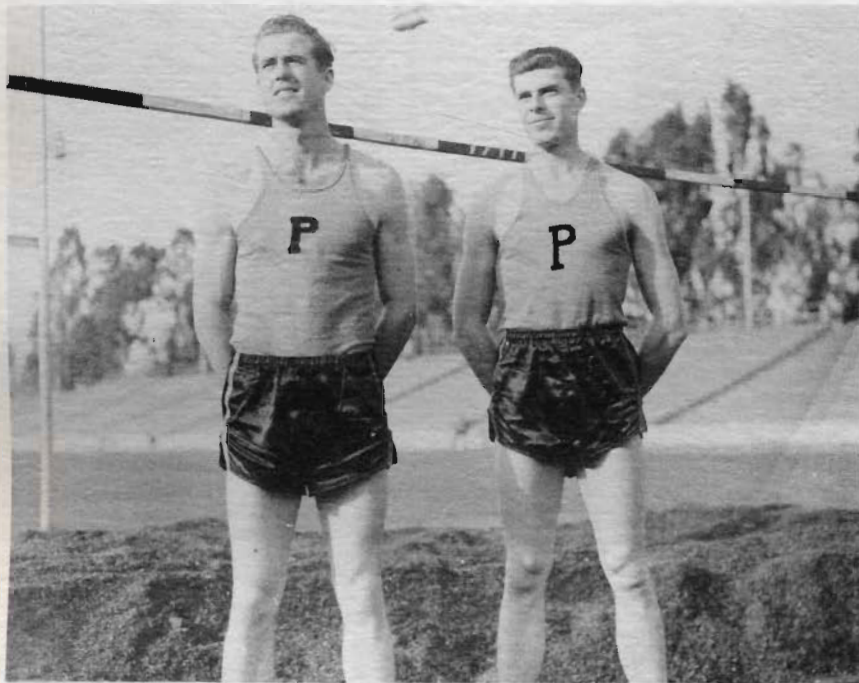

howard adams, great competitor and graduating senior, leaves the high jump event to dependable hal buck



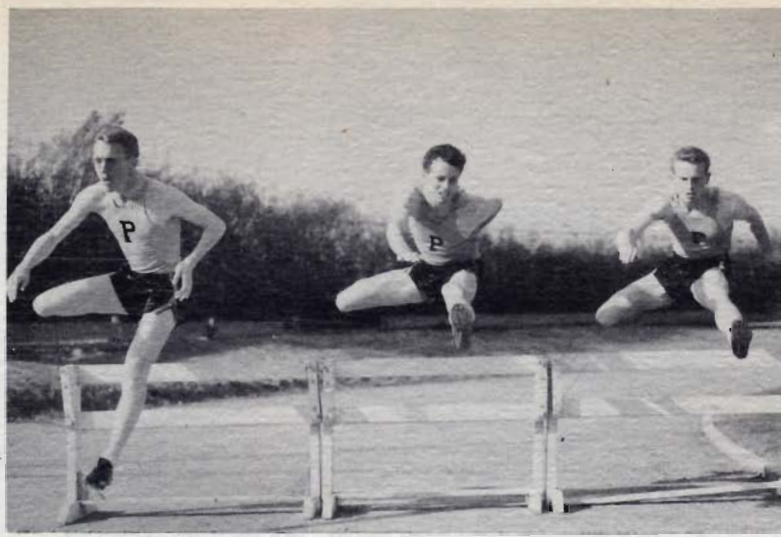

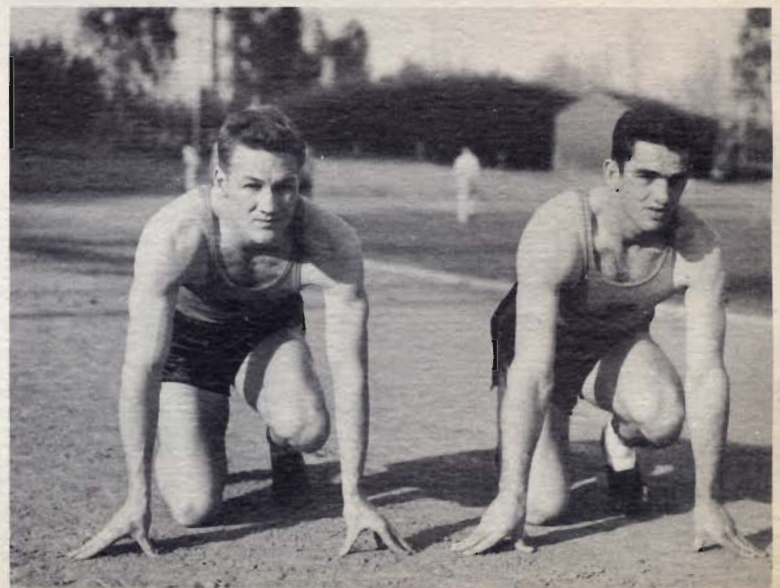
don hardy, don brooks and al smith won valuable points in the dashes for the tigers

stockton college track

the stockton college track team, under the able direction of boyd thompson, appears to be off to a good year, if early season performances are any indication...

with such outstanding men on the cub team as rayce mason, the spectacular speedster who early in the season hung up a mark of :49.0 in the quarter-mile, bob butterfield, the javelin thrower, doug smith in the hurdles, and sprinters lloyd lundstrom and jim gallagher, coach thompson's cindermen can usually be depended on to make a good showing...

other dependable point getters for the cubs are ray drew in the distance runs; bill long in the high hurdles and ben walker in the lows; dale kayser, who has hit 12' 10" in the pole vault, and john tofflemier, high-jumper don mahaney, who can usually be counted on to clear 6' 3"; weight men garth lipsky, dick gaedtker and jim fairchild; and javelin throwers bob riepling and fred cooper...

one of the cub's most impressive early season triumphs was in their three-way meet with san francisco and yuba, in which they ran away with just about everything but the officials' watches... the final score in this meet was 102 1/3 points for stockton, with 33 1/3 for san francisco and only 16 1/3 for yuba.

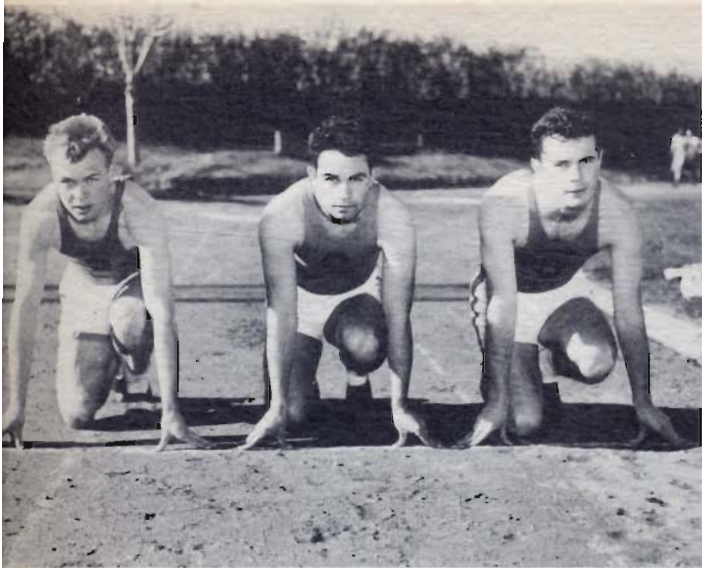

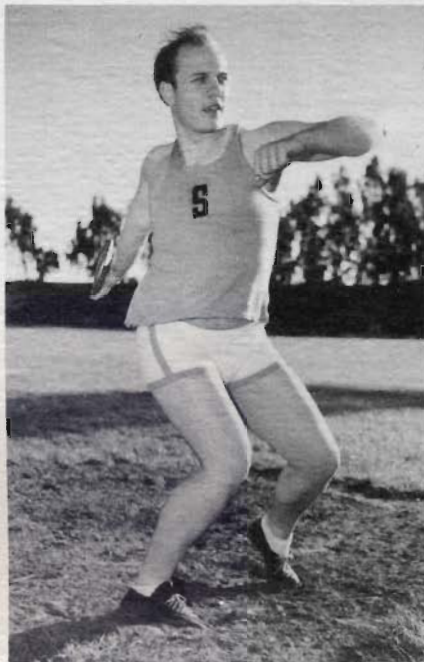

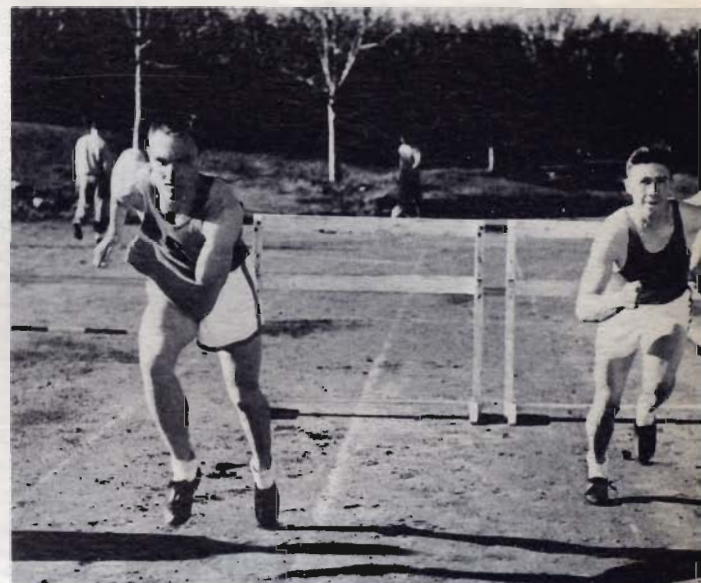
