

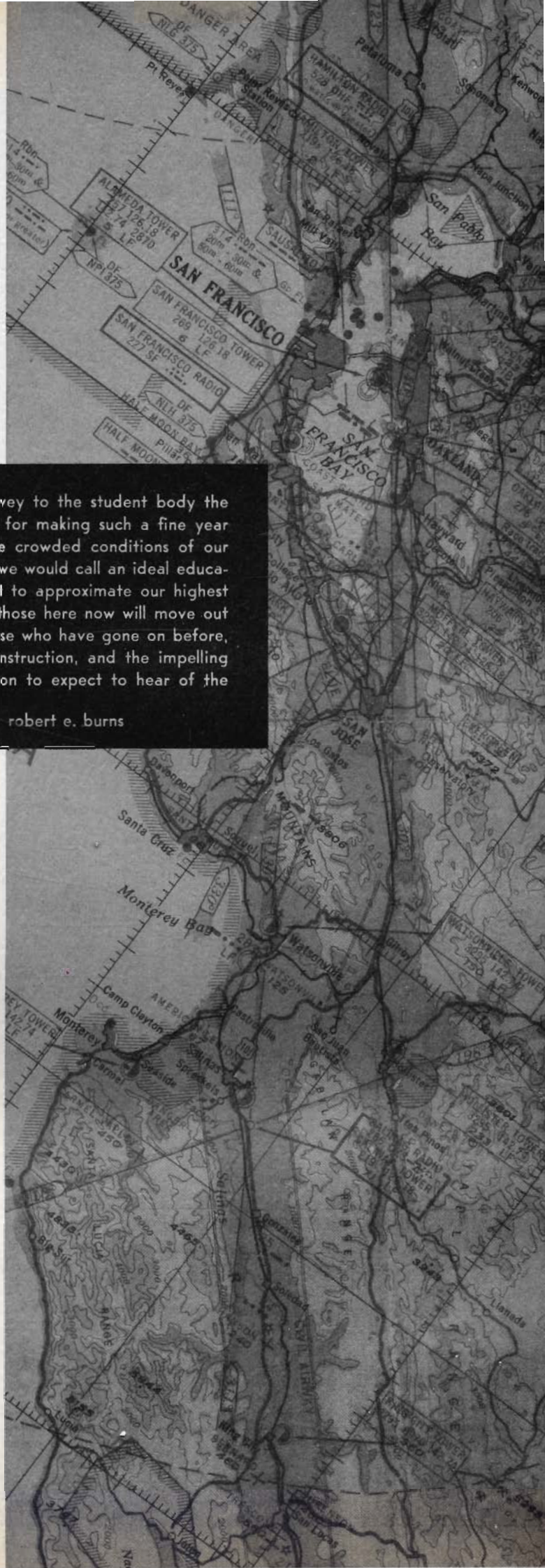

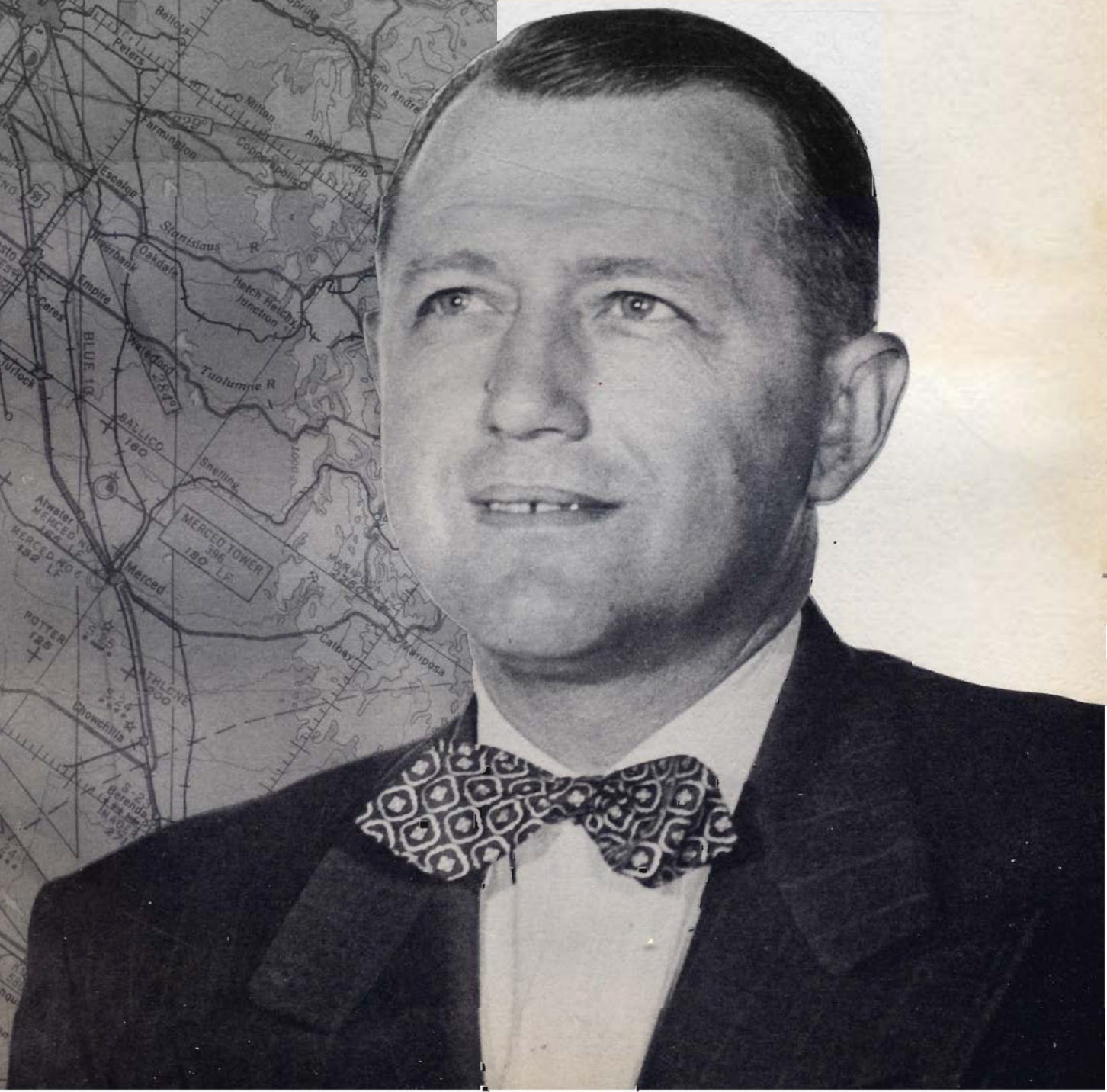

ADMISSION

The principal of any high school is permitted to register in his judgment if the student is a native-born American citizen and has completed the instruction offered. Permission to register in the Stockton Junior College will be granted upon the presentation of satisfactory credentials. Application blanks may be secured from the Registrar's Office in person or by mail. When the credentials have been accepted, the student will be notified of his acceptance.



GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

1. A transcript or its equivalent without notation of failure in any course.

2. English Matriculation examination, and the application if they are required, the court would otherwise be notified of his acceptance.

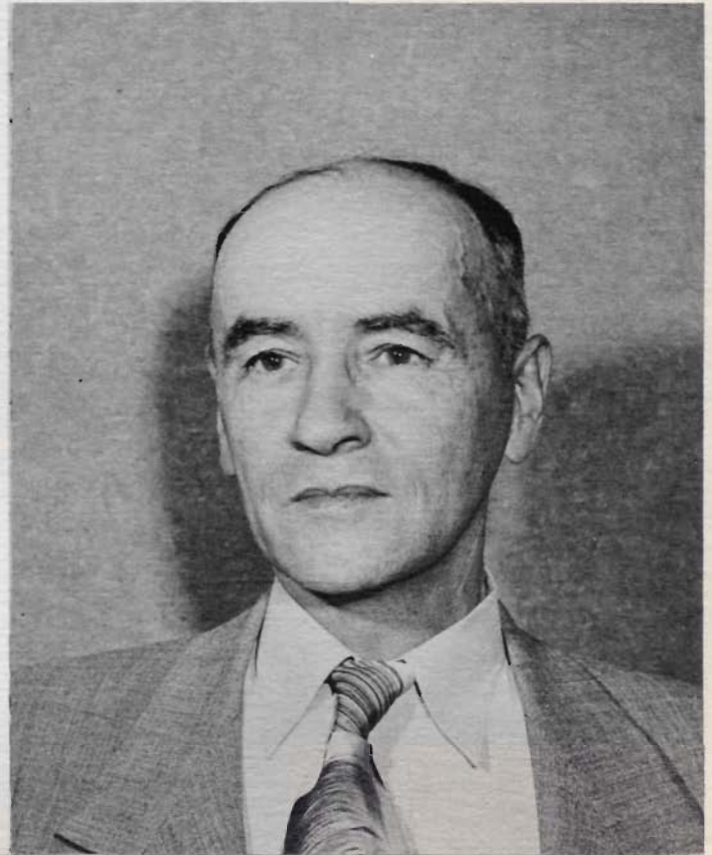

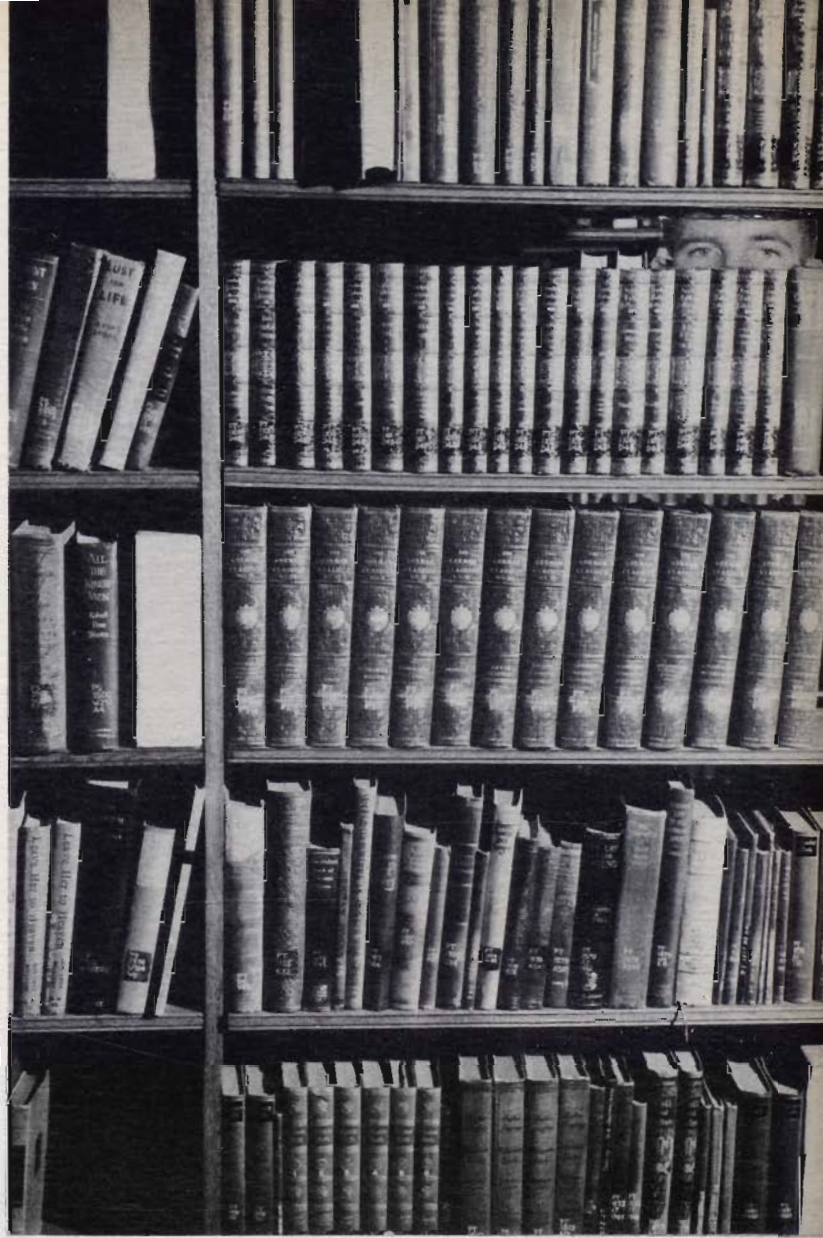
