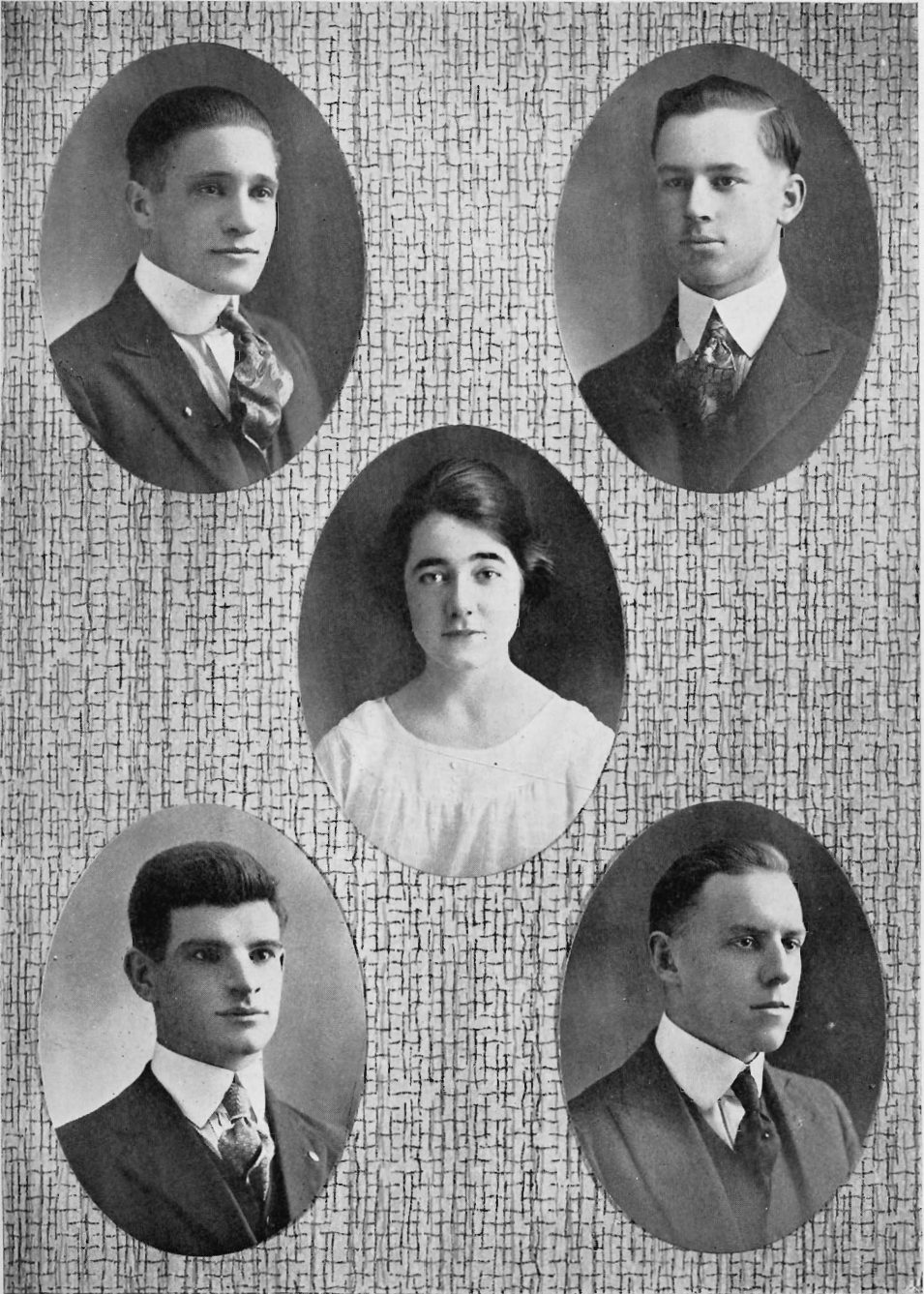
In the fall term of '18 a very important and exciting event was the selection of our class pins. A very nice little gold pin was chosen.

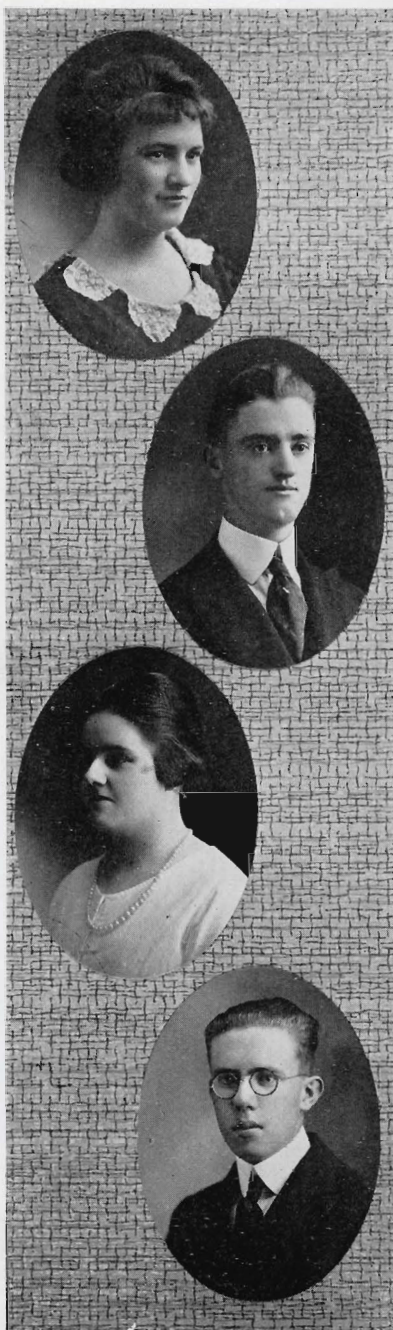

So let us class her as a friend.

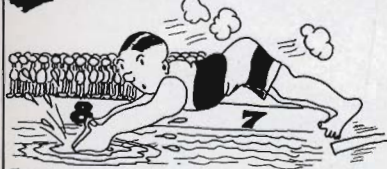
Then Davy Jones his key demands

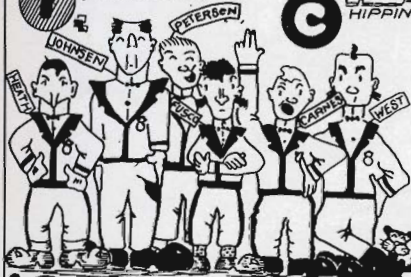

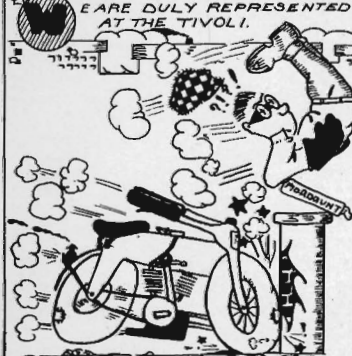
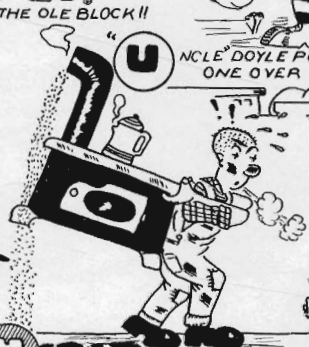
