FOREWORD

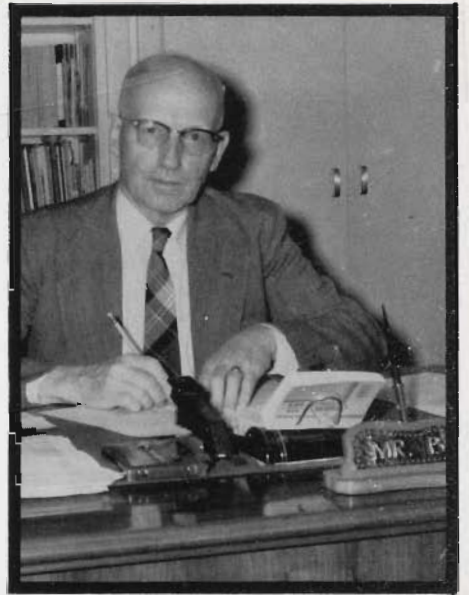
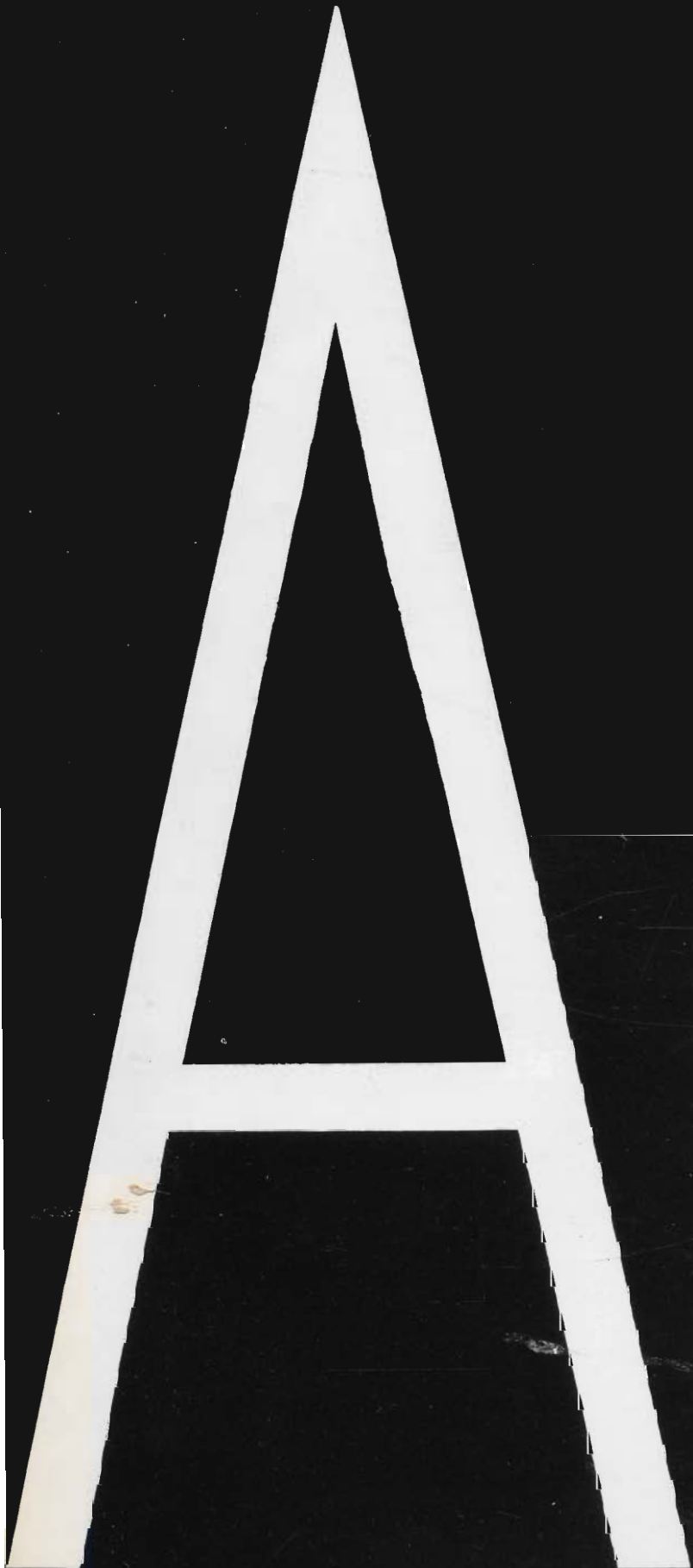

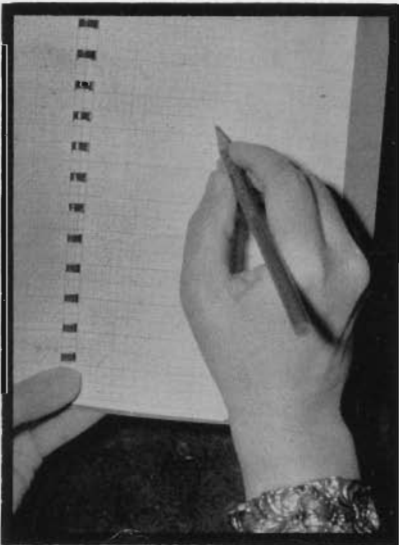
We shall remember our friends who have shared our joys and our teachers who understandingly guided and steered us through troublesome moments and whose knowledge led us to greater wisdom.

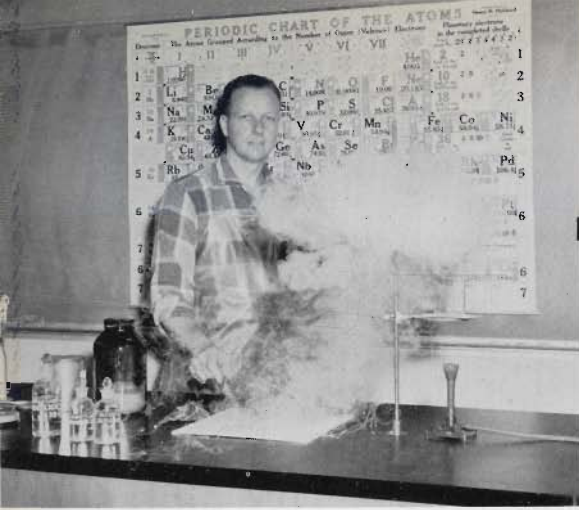
