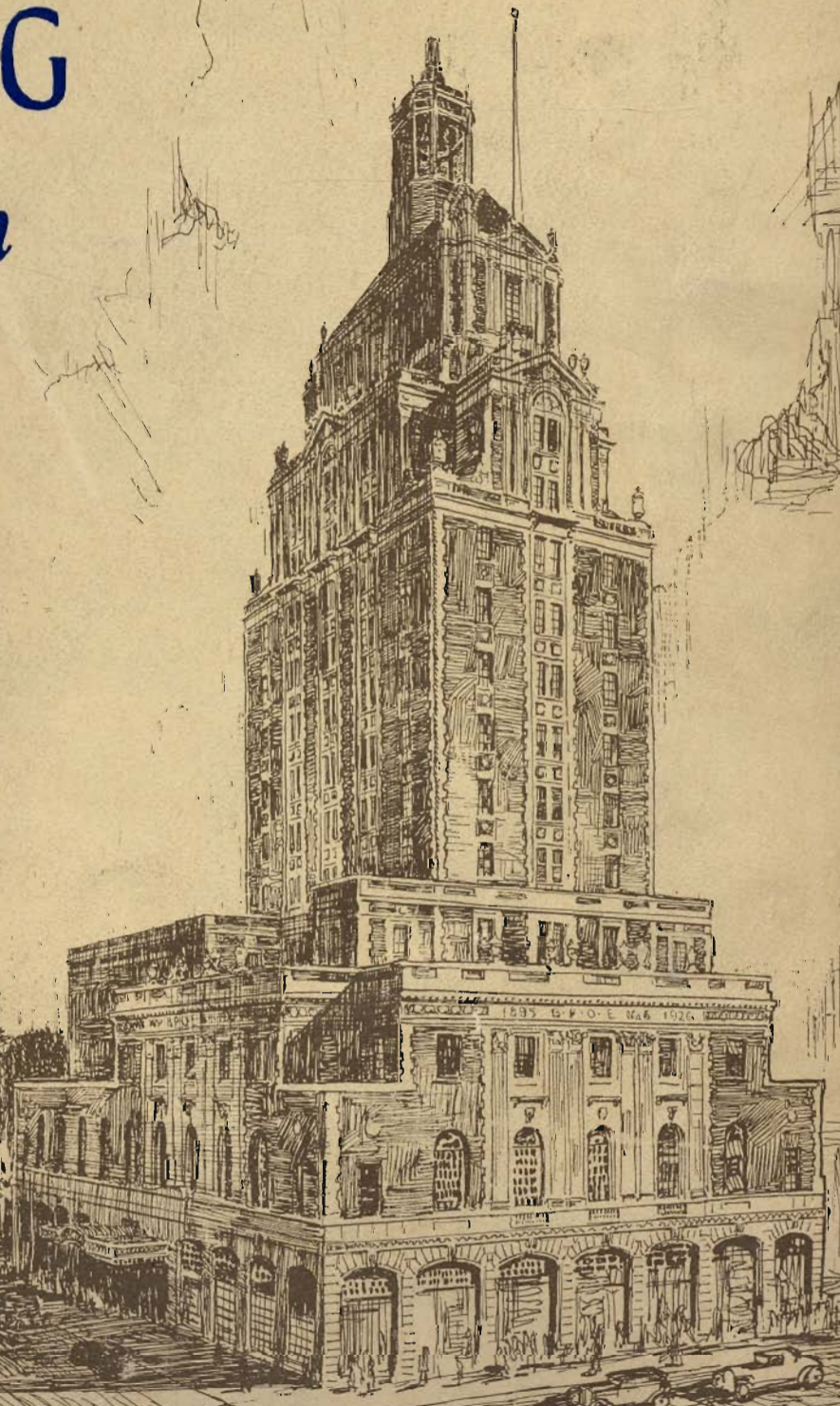

Introduction

Without a doubt, the most impressive contribution to Sacramento's architectural beauty in recent years is the new Elks Temple at Eleventh and J Streets. This magnificent structure has been erected and furnished at a cost of approximately \$1,500,000. Not only are the exterior lines and colorings beautiful and harmonious but the interior of the building is fully in keeping with what one might expect in such an attractive structure.

The Elks Lodge is justly proud of its Temple and of the work it has done to bring about the consummation of a task that seemed herculean when first undertaken several years ago, but which has been completed wholly by its own efforts and within its own Lodge.

It truly was a Titan effort to build and equip this magnificent Temple. Credit for the achievement must be given to the membership of the Lodge as a whole in general, but more specifically to the Exalted Rulers who have been in the Chair during the five years in which it was conceived and completed and to the members of the Board of Directors of the Sacramento Elks Hall Association, who put in long hours of tedious work and who thrashed out many a hard problem in finance and construction during the course of the work.

The Exalted Rulers who have been in the Chair during the period from the inception of the building to its completion are as follows: Clyde H. Brand, 1922-23; Thomas J. Flammer, 1923-24; Marco S. Zarick, 1924-25; Harold J. Thielen, 1925-26; Walter J. Hicks, 1926.

The present Board of Directors of the Hall Association is as follows: J. W. Haley, President; George W. Peltier, Vice President; Thomas J. Flammer, Secretary; E. E. Reese, Treasurer; John C. Ing, J. W. Stafford, Walter J. Hicks. Walter J. Hicks is the present Exalted Ruler. All other members of the Board with the exception of George W. Peltier, are Past Exalted Rulers.

Of the present directorate, J. W. Haley and E. E. Reese have served continuously since the incorporation of the Elks Hall Association in 1922. In addition, the following members served on the Board in the past: Max E. Hornlein, two years, 1922-24; C. C. Cotter, three years, 1922-25; John H. Miller, four years, 1922-26; C. W. Haub, four years, 1922-26; Henry N. Barton, four years, 1922-26.

The first definite step toward the building of a new Temple was taken in 1922 during the administration of Exalted Ruler Clyde H. Brand who appointed a committee for the purpose of initiating the necessary measures to this end. This committee was composed of J. W. Haley, Max E. Hornlein, E. E. Reese, C. W. Haub, H. N. Barton, C. C. Cotter and John H. Miller. The committee outlined the plan which was later followed—that of incorporating and selling stock at par value of \$100 per share. The members of the original committee were made the directors of the corporation. The original corporation was in the sum of \$500,000, which was afterwards increased to \$1,000,000. J. W. Haley was chosen first President of the Board of Directors and has remained in that capacity. The Board of Directors went arduously to work and soon realized that it had a gigantic task to perform. With the aid of the Lodge, stock sales were begun and from the start this feature met with a generous response from the members, showing that the true spirit of Elkdom pervades No. 6.

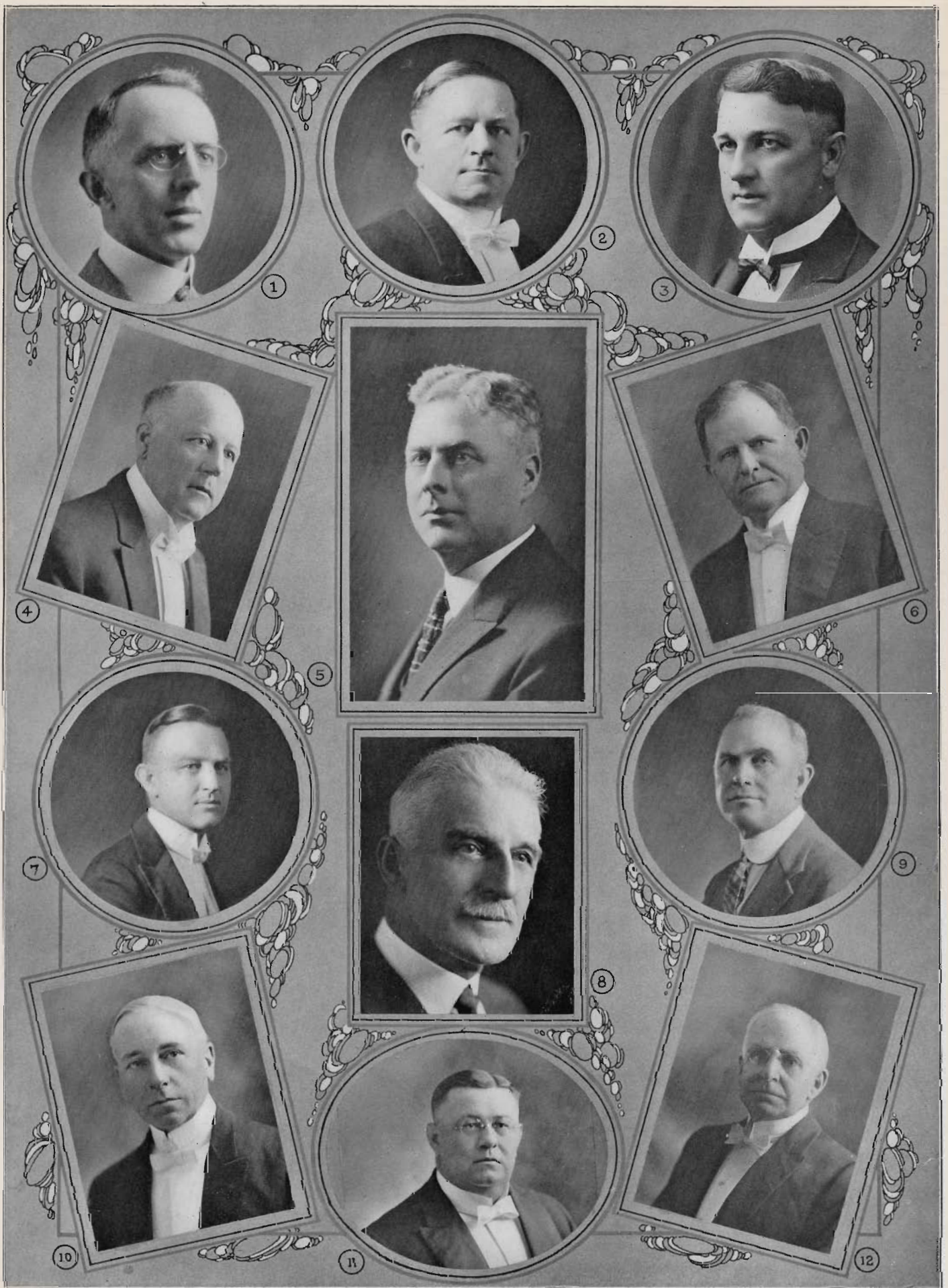
In the due course of time proposals for the structure were received by numerous architects. That finally accepted was submitted by architects Hemmings & Starks, who at first presented independent sketches, but later joined forces. After the building was well on its way, Architect Hemmings became seriously ill and later passed away. The work of carrying through the task was carried on by Architect Leonard J. Starks under the firm name of Hemmings & Starks.

The general contract was let to the firm of Lindgren & Swinnerton. The work was carried on successfully in every respect. All Elks are well satisfied with the building in every detail, with the work of the contractors, and with the work of those loyal Brothers who had a part in carrying out the great achievement.

Glimpses of the Early History of Sacramento Lodge, No. 6

Old No. 328 (Now No. 6) Came into Existence on December 21, 1895 With Due Ceremonies and 41 Charter Members

SACRAMENTO Lodge of Elks No. 328 (now No. 6), came into existence on Saturday evening, December 21, 1895. The institution of the Lodge was considered a memorable event in the history of the city, the charter list containing names of forty-one well known and prominent citizens.

The services were conducted in Foresters Hall, I Street, between Seventh and Eighth. A banquet at the old Golden Eagle Hotel, then the leading hostelry of the city, followed, the dining room on the main floor of the building having been handsomely decorated for the occasion. Brother Frank D. Ryan (deceased) acted as toastmaster. Toasts were responded to by the following brothers: Hon. Thomas J. Clunie, E. D. McCabe, Private Secretary to Governor James H. Budd; Adjutant General A. W. Barrett; L. H. Brown, Secretary of State; Robert T. Devlin, O. W. Erlewine, and others.

The first official visit of the new lodge was on March 14, 1896, when a large delegation went to Oakland, as guests of No. 171, to witness the dedication of "Elks Rest" and the unveiling of the monument. Brother Thomas J. Clunie of Sacramento Lodge delivered the oration and Brother Frederick Warde, of St. Louis No. 9, pronounced the eulogy. Both were superb addresses. The Oakland Lodge members were most hospitable and the occasion was long remembered by Sacramentans.

An impromptu reception that proved a great success took place on the evening of March 20, 1896. At that time Brother Frederick Warde was playing at the old Metropolitan Theater, on K Street between Fourth and Fifth, now only a memory, in the Shakesperean production of "King Lear." At the close of the performance he was escorted to the old Golden Eagle Hotel by the members of our Lodge, where a banquet was spread. Brother Warde responded to the toast, "The Elks," and made a brilliant talk and one that sparkled with wit.

The Lodge was now growing in membership and prestige and its success was assured.

Having completed the first three months of our existence, the following officers were elected and installed in April, 1896: Exalted Ruler, J. N. Larkin; Esteemed Leading Knight, Charles N. Post; Esteemed Loyal Knight, J. A. Nelson; Esteemed Lecturing Knight, G. B. N. Clow; Secretary, C. H. Holmes; Treasurer, F. W. Kiesel; Esquire, Charles K. Lipman; Chaplain, Frank L. Gray; Inner Guard, George W. Jackson; Tyler, A. S. Baker; Trustees, Frank D. Ryan, J. H. Dolan and William Beckman.

The members of the Lodge departed from the realms of Bohemianism on Friday evening, April 17, 1896, and gave a formal entertainment to their wives, sisters and sweethearts at the old Golden Eagle Hotel, which was the scene of so many entertainments in the early history of the Lodge. The party was a delightful affair, one of the interesting features of the evening being the con-

ferring of the fourth degree upon the fair sex present by Brother J. N. Larkin.

Members of Primrose and West's famous minstrel troupe were entertained by the Lodge on Friday evening, May 22, 1896. Brother West presided over the affair, which was held in Foresters Hall.

In April, 1897, the Lodge being a little more than a year old, new officers were installed as follows: G. B. N. Clow, Exalted Ruler; Frank L. Gray, Esteemed Leading Knight; George W. Jackson, Esteemed Loyal Knight; W. J. Hall, Esteemed Lecturing Knight; C. H. Holmes, Secretary; F. D. Tyrrell, Treasurer; P. F. McMorry, Inner Guard; Albert Lindley, Chaplain; B. M. LeLong, Marshal; A. S. Baker, Tyler.

The membership of the Lodge had now reached 137.

During this administration one of the most successful entertainments that the Lodge had ever given was the "Society Minstrels," given at the Metropolitan Theater on June 28, 1897. Among those who participated in this affair were Brothers E. C. Hart, C. M. Belshaw, Edwin F. Smith, E. S. Elkus, W. E. Lovdale, F. N. Kidder, H. A. Kidder, George Lovdal, H. A. Crocker, R. T. Cohn, Henry Kleinsorge, Henry Triechler, G. B. N. Clow, E. C. Rutherford, F. D. Ryan, D. W. Carmichael, G. W. Jackson, C. H. Holmes, A. S. Baker, J. N. Larkin, W. J. Hall, Frank E. Wright.

The first pilgrimage to San Francisco by our Lodge was on Friday, November 17, 1897, when a large delegation from Sacramento was entertained by the San Francisco Lodge. On arriving in San Francisco, our members were escorted to the old California Hotel, where a delightful repast was served. The occasion was a memorable one and San Francisco's hospitality has never been forgotten.

The second annual Memorial Service of the Lodge was held on Sunday, December 5, 1897, in the Congregational Church. Robert T. Devlin delivered the address and Judge E. C. Hart the eulogy.

To commemorate our second anniversary, a theater party exclusively for Elks, their families and lady friends, was given on Tuesday evening, December 21, 1897, at the Orpheum. Two hundred and thirteen seats were engaged and all were occupied.

The installation of officers in April, 1898, was as follows: Frank L. Gray, Exalted Ruler; George W. Jackson, Esteemed Leading Knight; W. J. Hall, Esteemed Loyal Knight; Albert Lindley, Esteemed Lecturing Knight; Secretary, Charles H. Holmes; Treasurer, Claus Anderson; Tyler, A. S. Baker; Trustees, Frank D. Ryan, J. H. Dolan and James Seadler.

The "Society Minstrels" previously given having been such a success, it was decided to give a similar entertainment and on Monday, May 2, 1898, a "Monster

Minstrel Jubilee" was given at the Metropolitan Theater under the direction of R. T. Cohn. Like the former entertainment, it was a huge success.

On the evening of July 25, 1898, the members of the lodge, their ladies and a few invited guests gathered for the purpose of dedicating what was then our new hall on the southeast corner of Ninth and J Streets. The dedicatory address was made by Frank D. Ryan. At the conclusion of the address, Colonel F. de L. Carrington, a member of our Lodge, of the Eighth Regiment of California Volunteers, was presented with a pair of field glasses, as he was about to leave for duty in the Philippines. Dr. Charles D. McGettigan, surgeon and First Lieutenant of the same regiment, was presented with a beautiful gold emblem of our order.

Stockton Lodge No. 218, was entertained by Sacramento Lodge on October 17, 1898. After impressive ritualistic work refreshments were served. This was the first fraternal visit from another lodge to our Lodge.

In April, 1899, new officers were installed as follows: Exalted Ruler, George W. Jackson; Esteemed Leading Knight, W. J. Hall; Esteemed Loyal Knight, J. M. Anderson; Esteemed Lecturing Knight, W. J. Taylor; Esquire, E. A. Crouch; Chaplain, M. J. Desmond; Inner Guard, J. A. Blair; Organist, Henry Triechler.

At this time the lodge had 250 members, with the name of only one absent brother inscribed on the memorial tablet.

This concludes the principal events of the first five years of the history of Our Lodge. More recent important events are fresh in the memory of most of our members. The Lodge is growing in good deeds, membership and financial strength. Surely, the foundation of our Lodge, as laid by the charter members, was of concrete and we have built a magnificent structure upon it.
