**Sixth Regular Meeting of the Forty-Ninth Executive Council held
April 17, 1939**

I. Proposed amendments to the Constitution and General Laws of the Grand Court of California, as follows:

From Court Livermore No. 77—

Section 2, page 34, line 1. Strike out "amendments" and insert "additions, alterations or amendments to the Constitution of the Grand Court and the Constitution of Subordinate Courts."

Section 2, page 34, line 4. Strike out "may have said amendments" and insert "shall have said additions, alterations or amendments."

Section 2, page 34, line 8. Add "and to each Subordinate Court."

Section 2 will then read—"All proposed additions, alterations, or amendments to the Constitution of the Grand Court and the Constitution of Subordinate Courts, shall be presented to the Grand Secretary at least thirty days previous to the session of the Grand Court, that the Grand Secretary shall have said additions, alterations or amendments printed and send a copy thereof to each member of the Committee on Laws and to each delegate elected to attend the following session of the Grand Court and to each Subordinate Court."

Section 3, page 34, line 2. Strike out "amendments" and insert "resolutions not intended to be embodied in the Constitution as Laws."

Section 3, page 34, line 4. Strike out "amendments" and insert "resolutions."

Section 3 will then read—"Delegates to the Grand Court may present resolutions not intended to be embodied in the Constitution as laws during the session of the Grand Court, and be allowed to make a statement of the objects of the proposed resolutions."

Section 4, page 34, line 3. Strike out "three delegates" and insert "members in good standing." Strike out remainder of section.

Section 4 will then read—"All resolutions or amendments shall be in writing and in duplicate, and must be signed by three members in good standing."

From the 49th Executive Council—

Strike out Sections 1, 2, 3 and all amendments to Articles XVI, page 31, Constitution and Laws of the Grand Court and substitute the following:

ORGANIZATION FUND

Article XVI

Source, Purpose, Expenditures

Section I—There is hereby created an Organization Fund in which shall be deposited such moneys as the Grand Court may provide in the budget or may receive from any other source for organization work. Said fund shall be under the control of the Grand Court of California and shall be administered by the Organization Committee. All expenses of organizational work shall be paid out of said fund.

Section II—Said fund shall be a continuing fund and any balance on hand at the close of any Fiscal year shall remain in said fund and shall not revert to any other use or purpose. All disbursements from said fund shall be made in the same manner as bills against the General Fund are paid, subject to audit and approval of the Grand Court Finance Committee.

Section III—The Organization Committee shall consist of the Grand Chief Ranger, Grand Sub-Chief Ranger, Grand Secretary and five members of the Grand Court, whose term shall be for five years, one term expiring each successive year. Appointments shall be so made and vacancies filled as to conform to the regular term.

Section IV—The Organization Committee shall supervise and direct all organizational activities in this jurisdiction.

(A) It shall have complete and original jurisdiction over all Courts.

(B) It shall be empowered to arrange and carry forward plans, campaigns and contests whose purpose shall be the increase of membership in this jurisdiction.

(C) It shall employ and supervise field representatives in such numbers and at such compensation as said committee may deem

advisable in view of the particular conditions surrounding the several assignments made to field representatives.

(D) It shall have the right to employ seasonal clerical help to assist the secretary of the Committee in carrying forward campaigns.

(E) It shall investigate and promote the institution of new Courts, subject to the general laws and constitution of the Supreme and Grand Court, and set the compensation to be allowed in each case to the organizers.

Section V—The Organization Committee shall require and deposit in the Organization Fund an amount of not less than \$3.00 or more than \$5.00 from the initiation fee of all candidates regularly initiated during the period a field representative may be working in any particular Court.

Section VI—The Organization Committee shall have authority to reorganize non-operative Courts and receive, if required by said Committee, the resignations of all or part of such Court's officers and cause the nomination, election and installation of their successors forthwith.

Section VII—The members of the Organization Committee shall serve without compensation except that reimbursement shall be allowed for attendance at Committee meetings or assigned visitations in the interest of organizational work, on the same basis as provided for visitations of Grand Officers. The members of the Organization Committee shall be entitled to mileage to all sessions of this Grand Court if they are not drawing the same in another capacity.

Amend Section 2, Article VII, page 15, third line—strike out "August and October" and substitute "September."

Amend Section 3, Article XIII, page 28—strike out, after word weeks, "and should his illness continue he shall receive \$5.00 for the following ten weeks." Add, after the word physician, "No member shall receive more than three hundred and fifty dollars (\$350.00) as sick benefits during his entire membership."

Amend Section 2, Article XIV, page 29—strike out, after the word suspensions, "members placed on holding list" and substitute a period for the comma. Add, after the word the, in the fifteenth line, "monthly," place a comma after the word reports, and strike out, after the word reports, "for the quarters ending in June, September, December and March of each year."

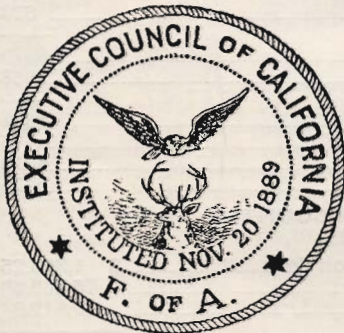
