The Class of 1986 Dedicates This Yearbook to *Mr. Key* Who Has Contributed So Much to Hillview School



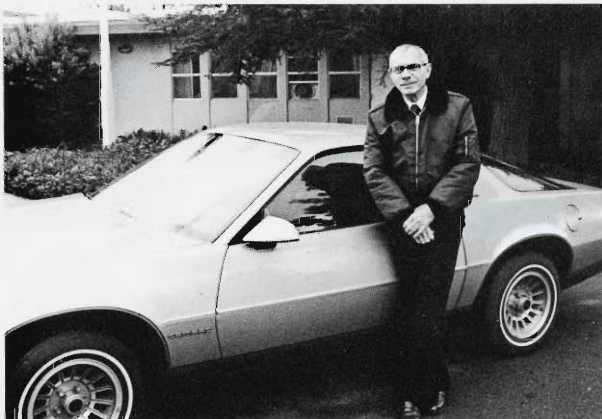
