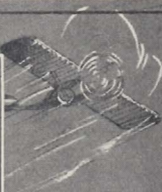

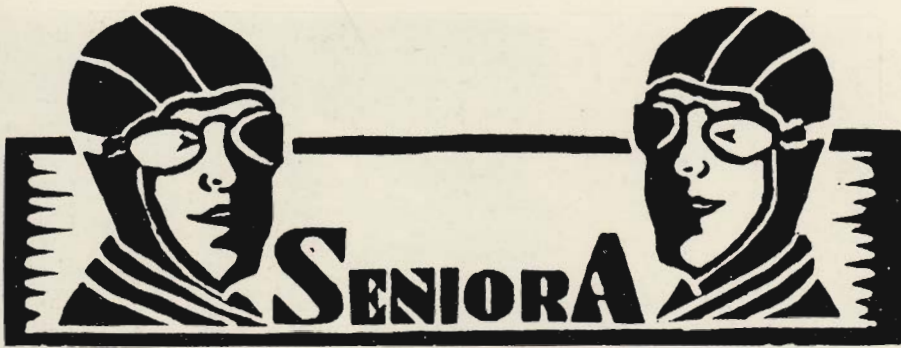

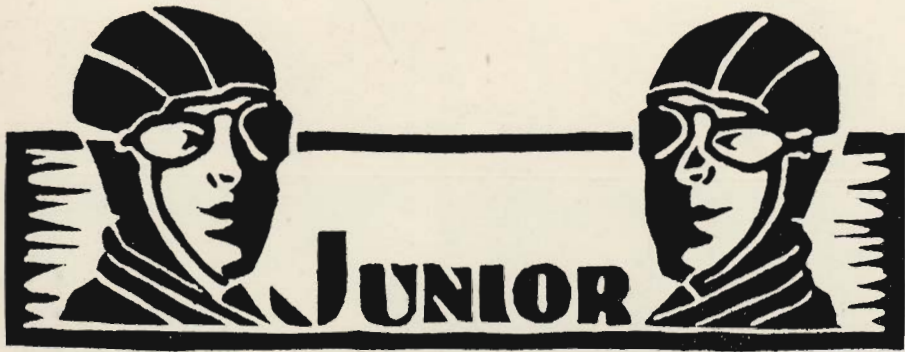
Among their number are football and basketball stars, last year's track captain, leaders in all branches of school activities, and students, high in scholastic standing.

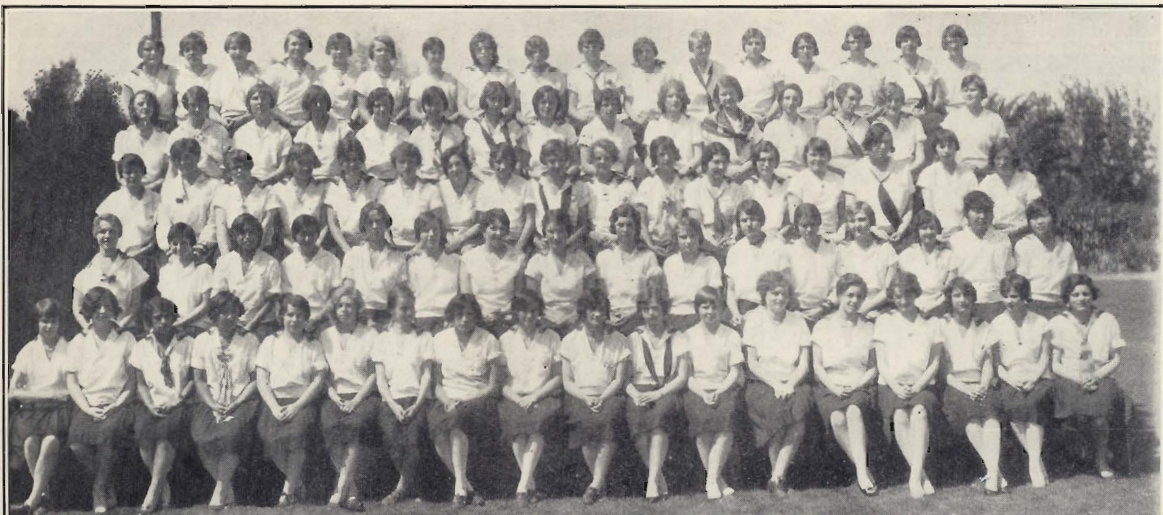
