THE band of the Lodi Union High School had unusual success this year, both as a military and as a symphonic band. In their colorful red and white uniforms, they won the admiration of all who saw or heard them.

During the Easter vacation, the band was one of two high school bands to play at the National Music Supervisors' Convention in Pasadena, a distinct honor to Lodi.

As a part of the convention program, the band played four concerts: one in the famous Gold Shell at Memorial Park; a broadcast over the Columbia Broadcasting System from KHJ; one for the opening of the convention in the Civic Auditorium; and a promenade concert at the Maryland Hotel during which Herbert Clark, famous cornetist, directed a few numbers.

On May 18, members of both the band and the orchestra participated in Stockton's Music Festival under the direction of some of the most noted conductors. Alfred Hertz, world renowned director of the San Francisco Symphony Orchestra, directed the combined orchestras. Herbert Clark, conductor of the Long Beach Municipal Band and formerly assistant director of Sousa's Band, had charge of the combined bands.

As a means of securing funds for the trip to Pasadena, the band played several concerts: one as a farewell party before the trip; one for the Legion Picnic, May 4; and several in Lodi's municipal park, one for Mother's Day and two evening concerts.

The year's success was due to the persistence of the fiery little director, Sydney A. Halsey.

THE members of the classes in dramatics, music, art, sewing, and stagecraft, including three hundred and thirty-nine students in all, worked together to produce an unusual Christmas pageant December 23. The program consisted of choral singing and the performance of the Chester mysteries: "The Shepherd Play," "The Offering of the Shepherds," and "The Adoration of the Magi," the most complete and beautiful of the medieval English mysteries.

During the plays a girls' sextet composed of Dorothy Osterman, Viva Grinnell, Edna Schmidt, Madeline Blewett, Lois Lasell, and Gertrude Ritzman sang several selections. Lois Lasell and Raymond Jackson were soloists, accompanied by Ernest Troutner. At the opening of the entertainment, old carols were sung by the combined choruses in robes.

Under the supervision of their teachers, the students worked hard to make this pageant a success. Instrumental music by the orchestra was led by Mr. Sydney A. Halsey. Nearly one hundred and twenty costumes were made by the home economics department under the supervision of Mrs. Carrie Erich and Miss Georgia Hobbs. Scenery was constructed by the stagecraft class under the direction of Mr. P. H. D. Winsor, and the art work was provided by all the art classes under Mrs. Loyda Remick and Miss Frances Suydam. The plays were coached by Mrs. Eleanor Blanchard. Mr. W. Corell Smith was in charge of make-up; properties were taken care of by Fern Lattin and Patricia Mason; staging, by Mr. P. H. D. Winsor, Joe Blanke, Edwin Hoff, Francis Mueller, Stewart Cole, and Herbert Ritzmann.

A Sunday afternoon performance of this dramatic pageant was given as the school's "Christmas Gift" to the community.
