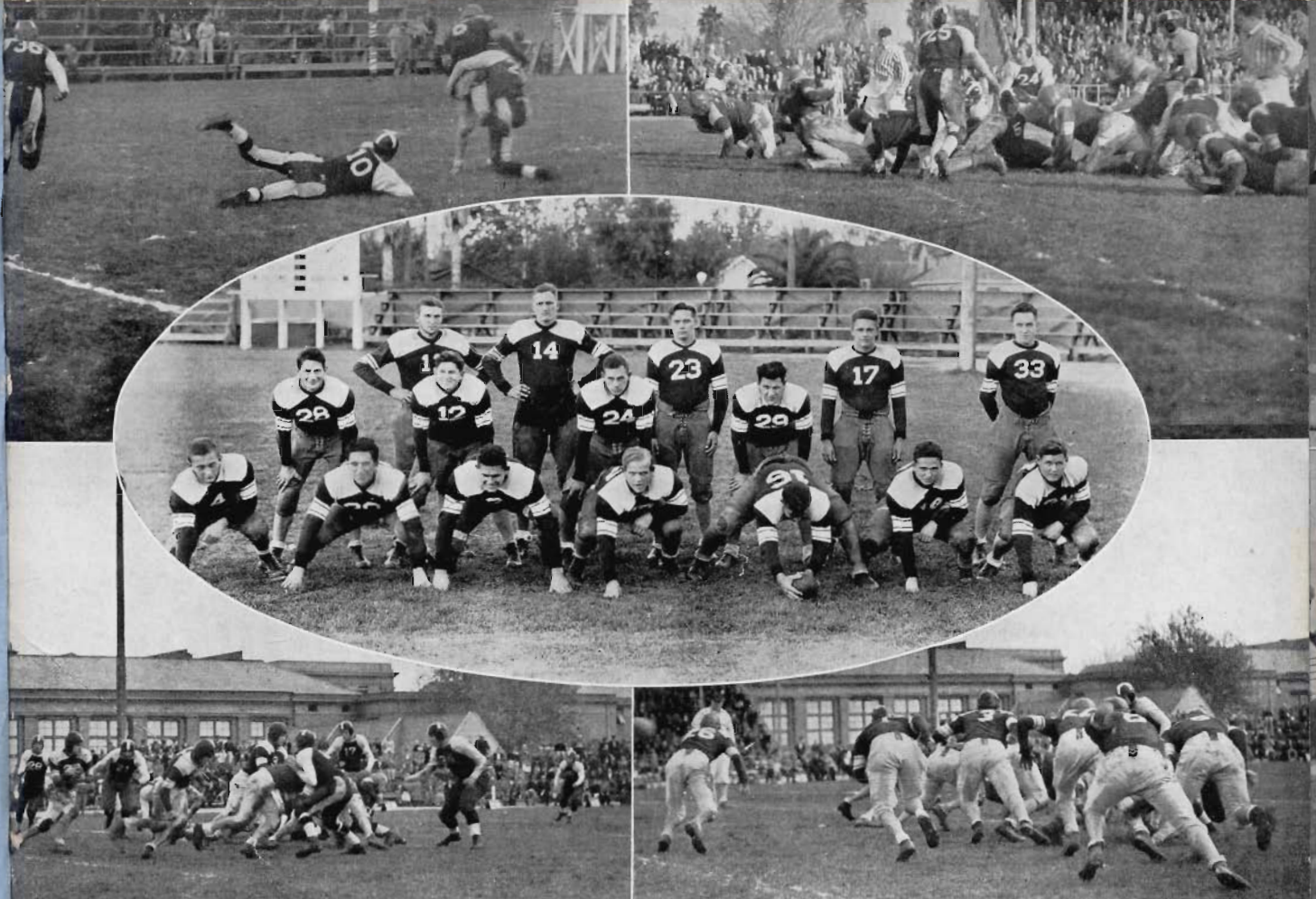

Since this fine team defeated all the teams that formerly comprised the C. I. F., fifteen of its members and its manager, Harold Leetzow, were awarded sweaters.

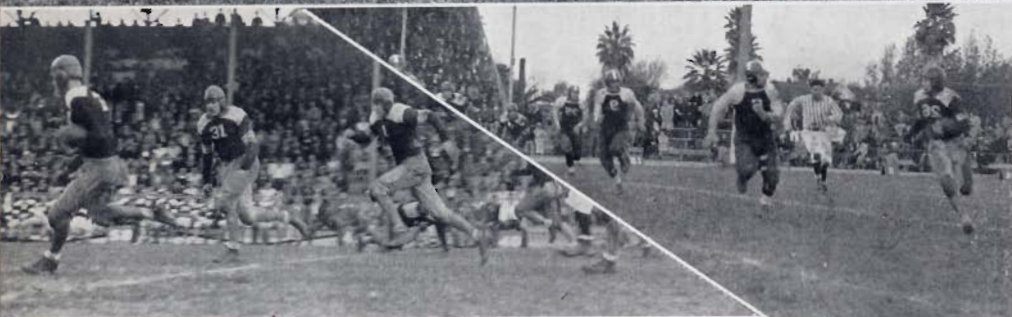
