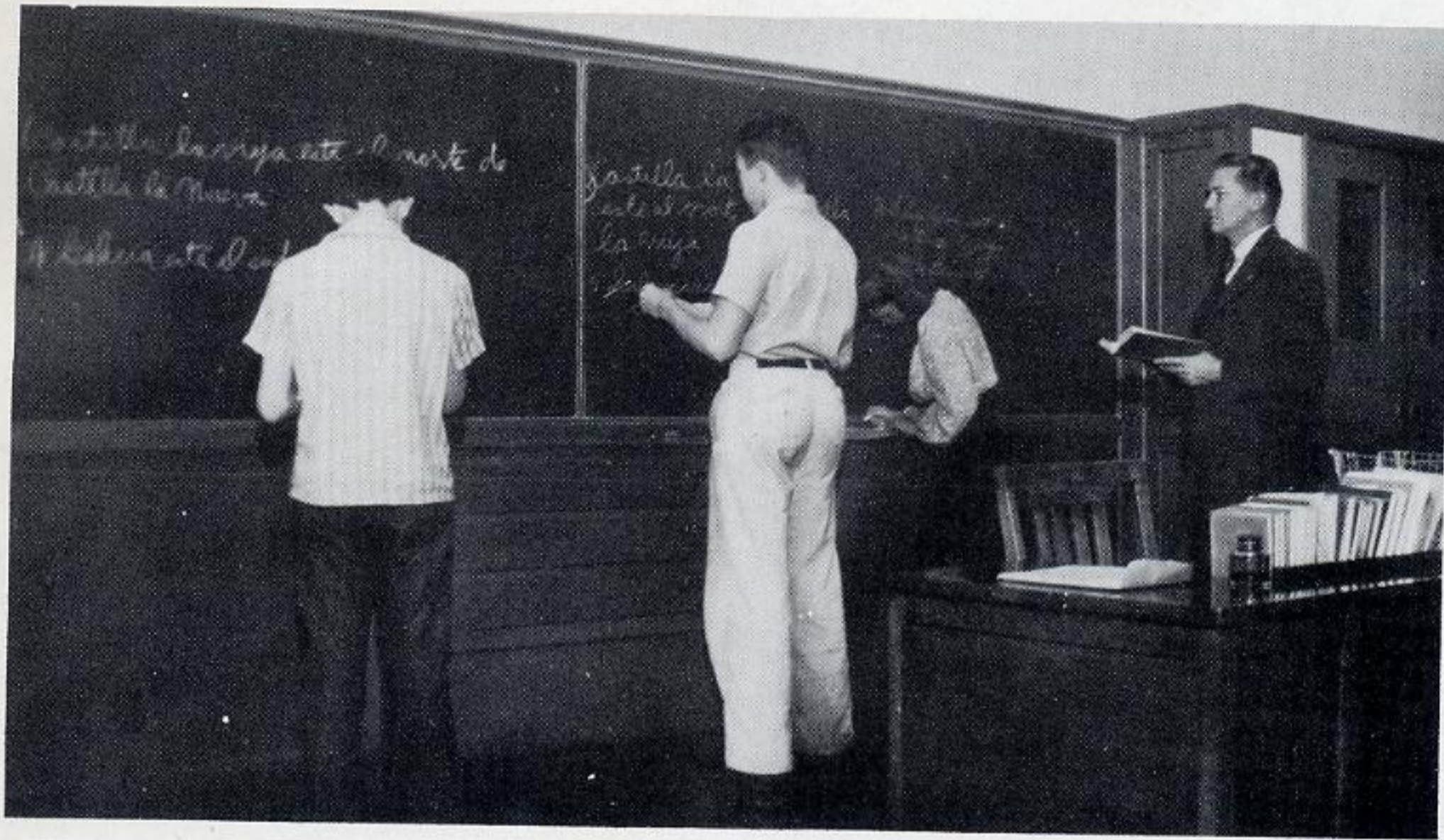

The Seniors upheld their position as upper-classmen with much dignity and pride. Throughout the year a more enthusiastic and energetic group could not be found.

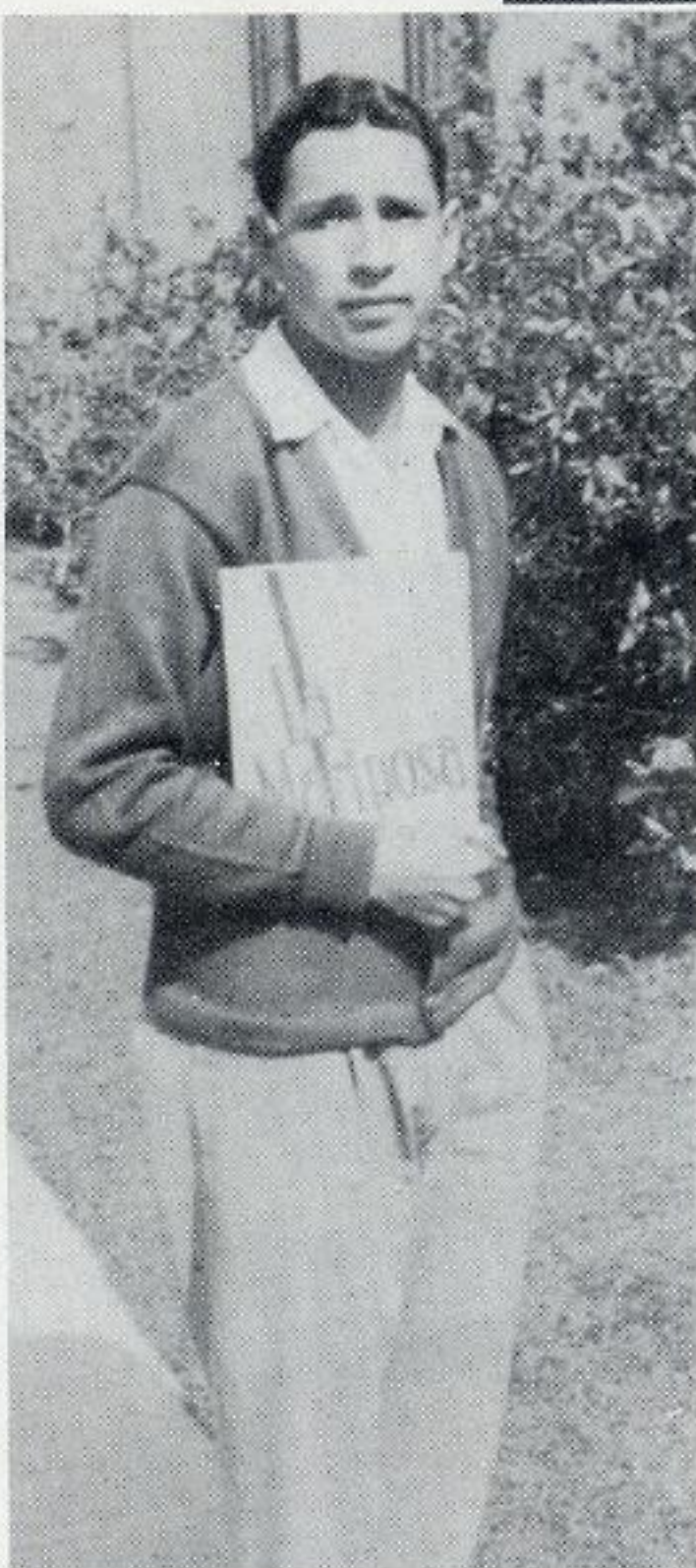
