DIRECTIONS AND INSTRUCTIONS FOR TELEGRAPHING FIRE ALARMS.

The following should be observed when a fire is discovered.

I. Go to the box, break the glass, open the door and pull the hook down as far as it will go firmly and without jerking, and let it slide back.

II. If the alarm is not immediately heard upon the small bell within, or at one of the engine houses, go to the next nearest box to the fire and repeat the operation.

III. If on going to the box to give an alarm the bell inside is heard ringing, which is an indication that an alarm is being sent in, do not open the box until it is done.

In all such cases count the signal which is being sounded and be certain it is not for the same fire.

Citizens are cautioned—

1. To not open the box except in case of fire.

2. To not give an alarm until certain of fire.

3. To not give an alarm for a fire seen at a distance.

4. To pull down the hook but once in giving an alarm.

5. To be sure, after giving an alarm, that the door is securely closed before leaving the box.

6. Wait at the box and direct the firemen to the fire.
