HARRIS MANUFACTURING CO. SHOWS PHENOMENAL GROWTH

There is probably no other industry in the city of Stockton that can show as phenomenal growth during recent years as The Harris Manufacturing Company, manufacturers of combined grain, bean and rice harvesters.

The expansion of the business of this company has been brought about entirely by the increased demand for its product and is not due in any manner to production of material for war orders.

In 1902 this company started business as a small harvester repair shop. Its founder, G. H. Harris, had previously been superintendent and manager of the Matteson & Williamson Manufacturing Company.

The first few years of the business were devoted entirely to repairing and rebuilding harvesters already in the field, although sufficient time was found to experiment along the lines of a motor-driven harvester that would withstand extremely severe conditions.

These experiments finally led to the construction of the Harris grain harvester. Within the last few years a gasoline engine has been designed and perfected which is used exclusively on Harris harvesters, and the manufacture of this engine has been added to the plant's production.

From the small start in 1902, and the incorporation of The Harris Manufacturing Company in 1904, the business has had a steady and substantial growth. In 1912 it had grown to such proportions that new buildings and equipment were necessary, and at that time the nucleus of the present plant was built.

During the past year a large brick and concrete building, a large addition to the blacksmith shop, an addition to the mill and harvester storage sheds have been erected.

During 1918 the production of the plant increased greatly over 1917, and this year's original production plans called for a substantial increase over last.

The company's most convincing argument in substantiating its claim of the superiority of their product is the statement that "the users know," and this argument is certainly justified by the growth of the business.

The utmost care is exercised in production, and not a machine is allowed to leave the plant until it has been thoroughly worked out and tested under its own power by a number of experts acting independently of each other.

Every one of the stockholders and directors is a resident of the city of Stockton, and the company is, perhaps, more strictly local than any other concern of its size in the State.

It gives steady employment the year round to several hundred skilled mechanics, some of whom have been with the company since its inception.
