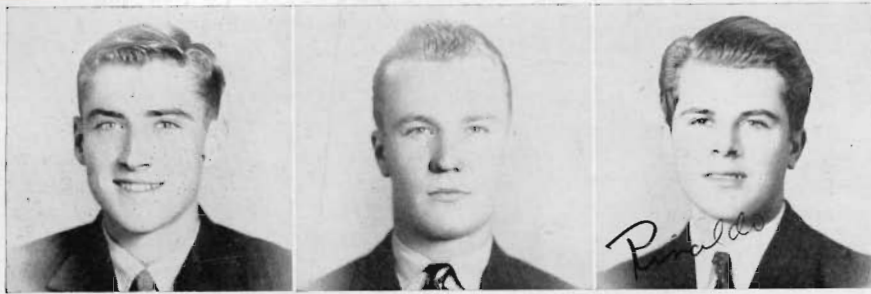

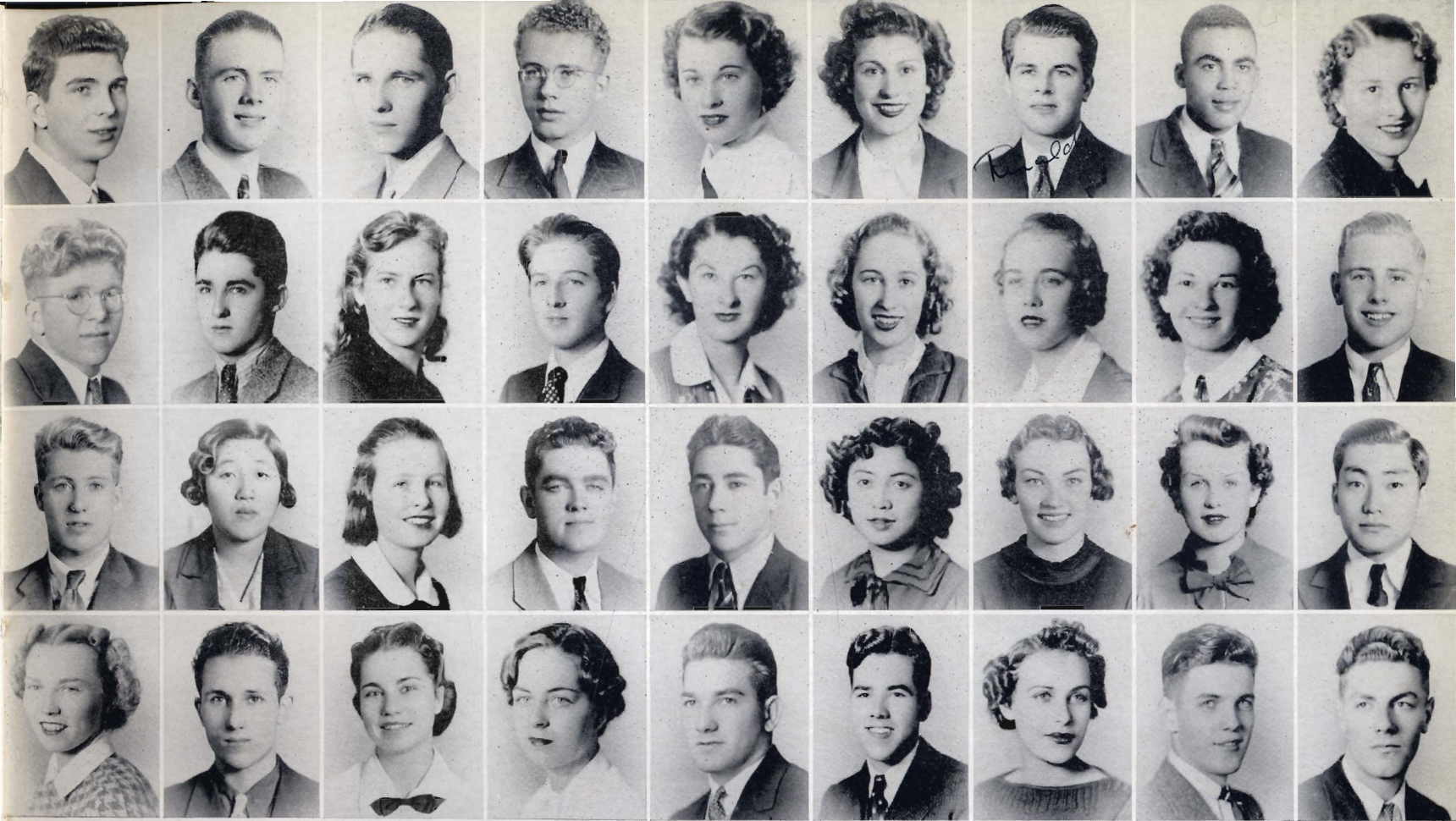

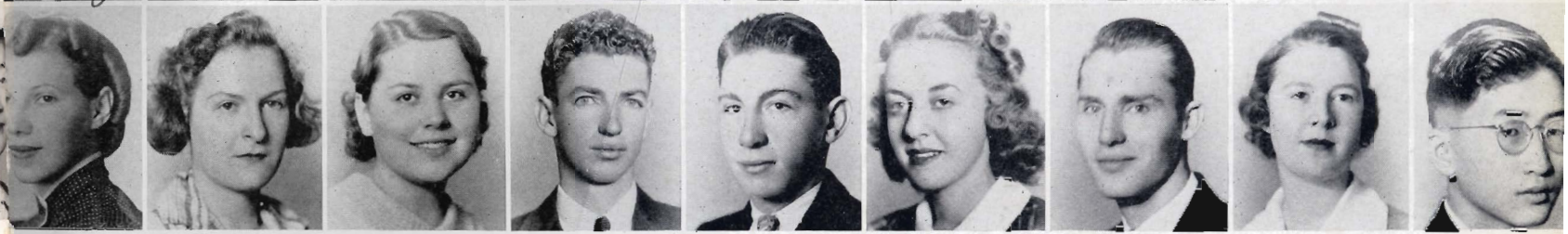

PERHAPS the greatest distinction that has ever come to a student in our high school was the honor conferred upon Ruth Ellis when she was chosen to speak for the 8,500,000 members of the Junior Red Cross in San Francisco on May 2, 1938. Her talk on "Molding Ideals Into Service" was the highlight of the morning session at which people of international reputation and national prominence were present. Not only did she achieve honor for herself, but she brought added recognition to our high school chapter of Junior Red Cross.
