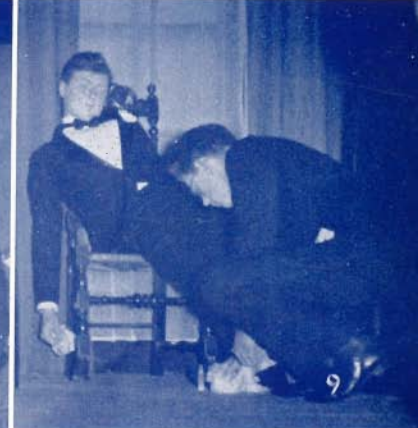
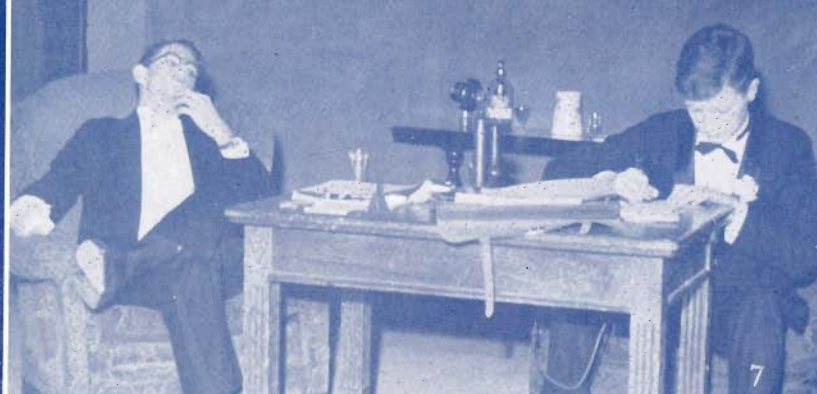
1. With Melissa Destinn (Bette Elliot), bodyguard Emery (Tom Manuel), and Baron Oswald Mahler (Gerald Crowden), Pa Hinkle (Bob Warren) broadcasts orders to his cabinet.
2. A bit of diplomacy between the Duchess (Beverly Cox) and her daughter Julia (Donna Ferguson).
3. Julia becomes petulant.
4. The King (Bob Warren) revolts against domesticity.
5. The cast—Violet Scott, Bob Warren, George Kapel, Tom Manuel, Bette Elliot, Chad Pond, Betty Behney, Marie Sala, Fred Holden, Lemoine Walton, Don LaMoine; seated—Gerald Crowden, Donna Ferguson, Beverly Cox.

7. The King knows feminine charm when he sees it (George Kapel, Bob Warren, Betty Behney).

Plot—Sir Charles Jasper and some friends hold a party on the stage of the Saint James Theatre, London, to celebrate two things—the ancient legend of the theatre that a ghost would appear at a certain time after a murder has been committed, and the fact that the host, Sir Charles, would inherit two million dollars at 11:00 P. M., if he was still alive. A distant relative of his, Maurice Mullens, plans to get the money; so he contrives a perfect alibi and poisons Sir Charles. But the legend of the theatre is fulfilled, and the ghost appears, causing the murderer to confess his horrible deed.

1. Jimmy North (Ray Hammett) consoles Lady Jasper (June Christie) who has just seen a murdered man. 2. Lady Jasper plans revenge with Mrs. Wragg (Margaret Willis). 3. The 'Woman's' (Margaret Middleton's) prophetic story comes true. 4. A draught of poison is taken by Sir Charles Jasper (Ed McNamara). 5. All drink a final toast to the apparition of Sir Charles. 6. The murderer, Maurice Mullins (Fred Holden) speaks to the audience. 7. Sir Charles signs away his life. 8. Mrs. Arthur (Martha Metcalf) attempts to frighten Jimmy North into a confession. 9. The murder of Sir Charles Jasper.

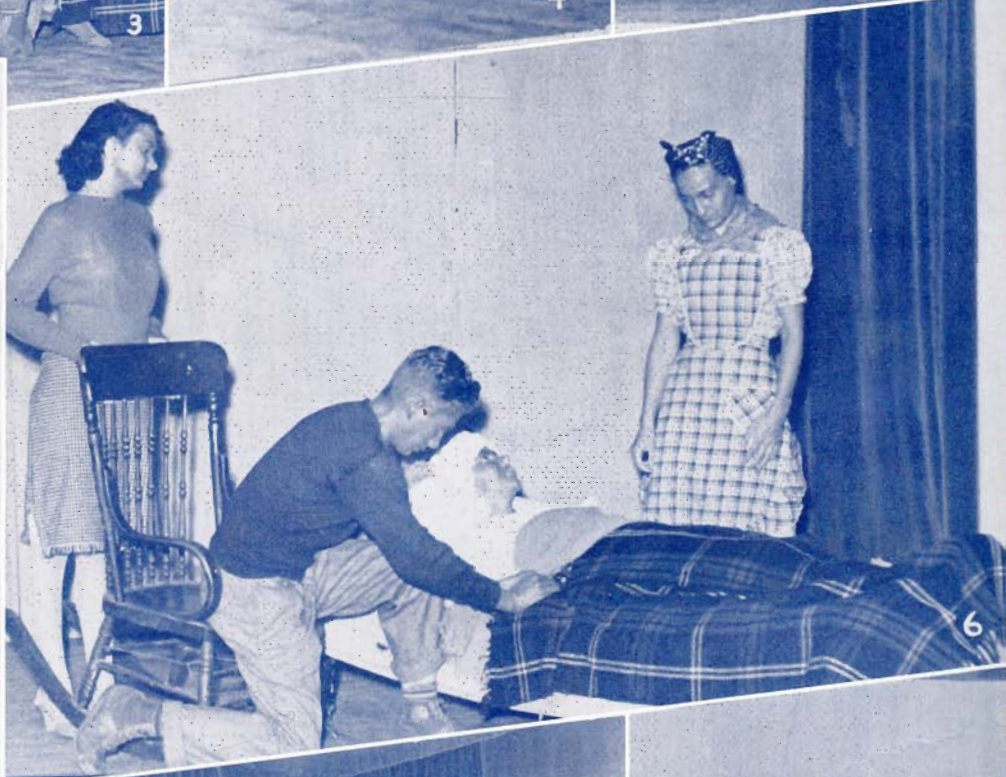


FIFTEENTH CANDLE

Plot—Papa Vedetti, a greedy Italian father, wants his talented daughter Rose to stop her art lessons and work in a factory. Rose's sister, Stella, works hard earning the money for the art lessons so that Rose can become a great artist. It soon becomes apparent that, because of her ignorant, greedy father, the fifteenth candle on Rose's next birthday cake will not find her on her way to fame, but instead will find her slaving in the factory. 1. Rose (Connie Hughes) sympathizes with her sister Stella (Charlotte Kynaston) who realizes that Rose will never be able to become a great artist. 5. Stella vainly pleads with Papa Vedetti (Carroll Clark) not to force Rose to stop her art lessons and start to work in the factory.

DREAMY KID

Plot—After murdering a man, Dreamy Kid, pursued by police, returns to bid his dying mammy good-bye. His sweetheart pleads with him to leave, but his sister and mammy keep calling him back. He hesitates so long that the police are pounding on the door when he determines to make a last stand for freedom. 2. Irene (Donna Ferguson) and Cealy Ann (Dorothy Hull) argue about Dreamy Kid (Bradford Setness). 3. Dreamy, with drawn gun, waits for the police to plunge through the door. 4. Dreamy warns Cealy Ann not to tell Mammy of his awful deed. 6. Irene, Dreamy and Cealy Ann watch Mammy slowly pass away. 7. Dreamy argues against telling Mammy of his crime. 8. Irene pleads with Dreamy to flee before the police come. 9. Irene and Cealy Ann quarrel about whether Dreamy should stay or flee.





Plot—Peg, a lively but poor Irish girl, goes to England to live with her wealthy uncle. But meanwhile he dies, leaving a large trust fund to Peg on the condition that she be reared like a lady by a respectable woman. Her aristocratic aunt attempts to do this, helped by her snobbish daughter, but Peg is like a fish out of water. Yet gay Peg manages to win the love of everyone who knows her, including that of an English nobleman named Jerry. 1. Sir Gerald Adair (Charles Broadhurst) and Peg (Martha Phillips) hold hands. 2. Ethel (Donna Ferguson, seated) and Peg are caught in their flight upstairs by Mrs. Chichester (Mary Lou Anthony). 3. Peg talks earnestly to her lawyer (Jack Devoe). 4. Sir Gerald, Peg, and Mrs. Chichester attempt to bring Ethel out of a dead faint. 5. Chris Brent (Gerald Crowden) and Ethel plan to elope. 6. Entire cast—Chris Brent, Montgomery Hawkes, Alaric Chichester, Mrs. Chichester, Ethel, Bennett, Jarvis, Sir Gerald Adair, and Peg. 7. Alaric Chichester (Bill Stretch) describes his latest infatuation. 8. Sir Gerald and Peg discover that true love always wins. 9. Peg consoles Ethel. 10. Mrs. Chichester criticizes Peg's dangling hair as un-lady-like. 11. Sir Gerald consoles Peg as she cries, longing for her daddy.
