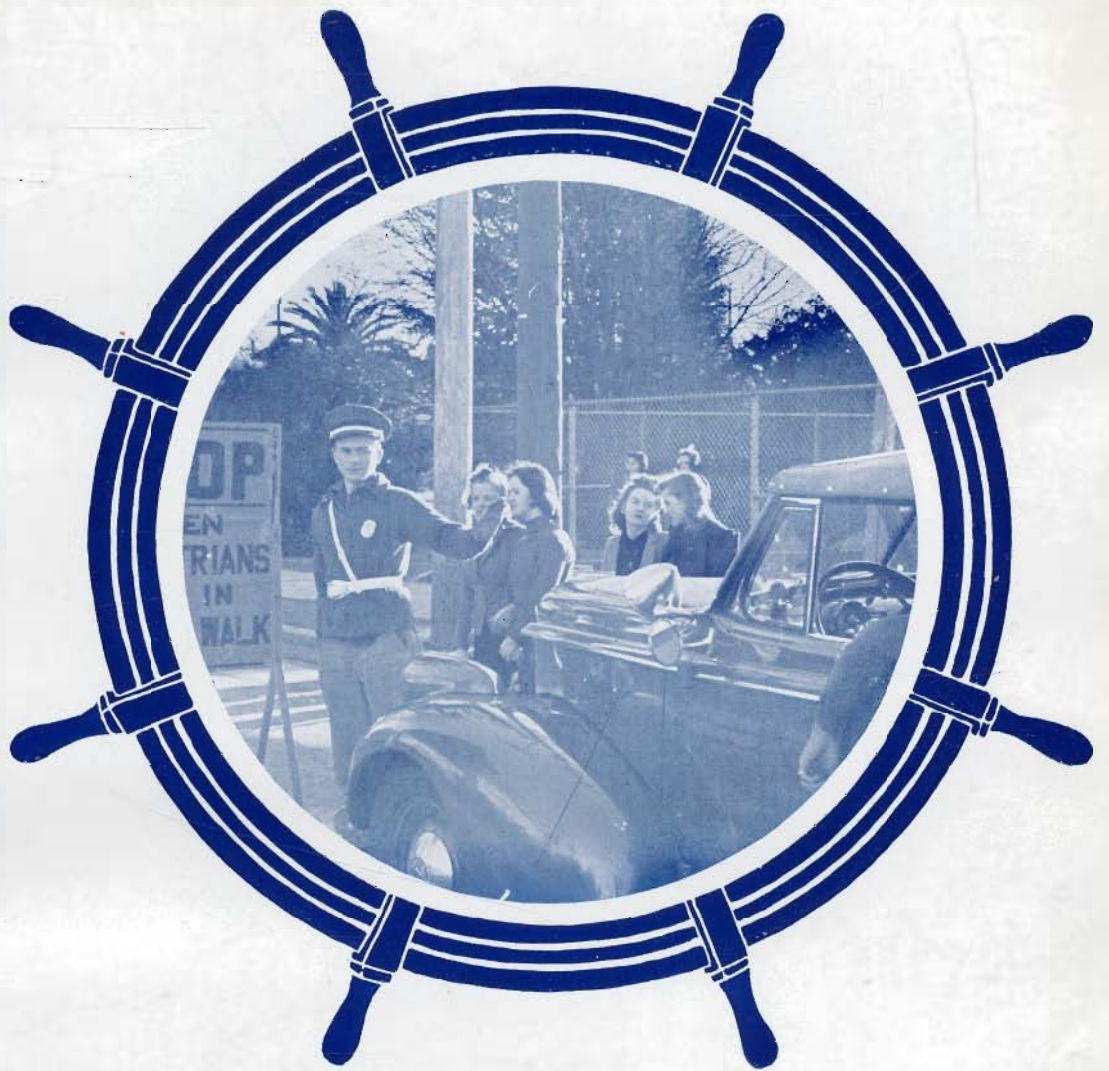
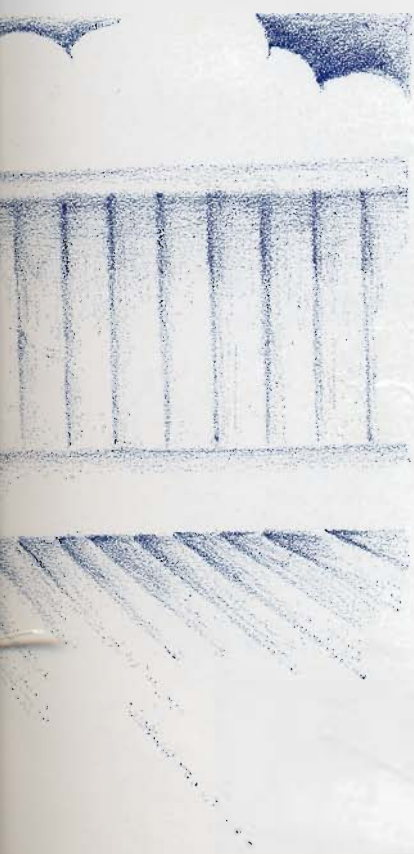

STUDENT CONTROL

During this last year about every other Wednesday afternoon, a crowd of students was seen gathering in C23. It was the girls' student control. This small group of students had the unfortunate task of turning in both friends and enemies as school law breakers, because, being responsible for the conduct of students on the campus, the control has always tried to keep its eyes and ears wide open. As most members of the organization found it difficult to be continually reporting good friends, they were glad when their term was over and they were looked upon as ordinary students.

To the many students who were continually cutting, causing disturbances, maring school property, loitering in the halls, smoking, or breaking numerous other school laws, the boys' and girls' student control were a dreadful nuisance.

When students were reported by the controls, first offenders, freshmen, or breakers of minor laws were all treated leniently with the hope that in the

future they would remember to obey school laws. Demerits were the usual punishment recommended by the controls, and in almost all cases their decisions were upheld and carried out by the deans.

The members are also stationed at all assemblies and rallies to see that students remain quiet and attentive. During the football season they are of still greater benefit to peace-lovers, for they are on duty at all games. Not only do they preserve peace and order, but they direct spectators to their seats and are of general assistance to all.

All this last term the members of the two student controls worked unceasingly to better our school. Theirs was no easy job.
