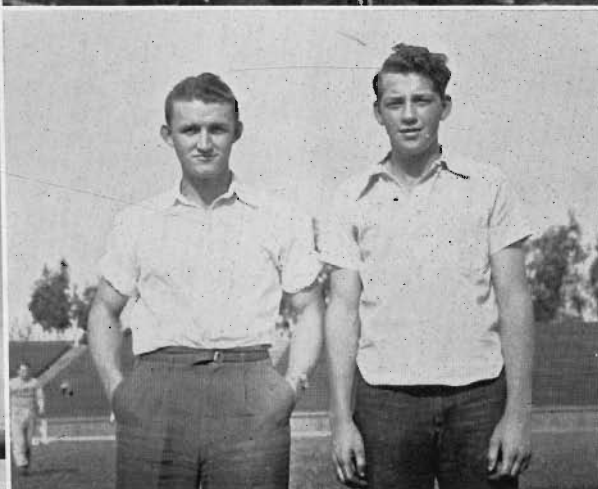

In return for their labor, managers are awarded similar athletic awards as those of the players—blocks with "Mgr." inscribed upon them or any special award which the team may get.

Another group of "forgotten" men are the yell leaders—George O'Connor, Jake Kramarski, and Dick Briggs. The former is the head leader. It is through these boys that much of the spirit and color is added to the athletic contest and rallies.

Pete Lenz, head of the boys' Physical Education Department, and Agnes D. May, head of the girls' Physical Education Department, lead two very efficient staffs of instructors, accorded as being some of the best in the state. These instructors, besides teaching the regular gym classes, lead students in special activities, in which the coach excels. In the boys' department, Coach Lenz handles varsity basketball; Pete McCain is in charge of the swimming team; Coach Solomon handles the teaching of first aid, varsity football, and golf; W. L. McKay is in charge of the teaching of hygiene, tennis, and intramural sports; Mike Garrigan handles B football and basketball, while 'Hap' Evans handles track. In the girls' department, Mrs. May specializes in the incoming freshmen, Miss Harris is in charge of after-school sports, Mrs. Sheridan handles all the modern-dancing classes, and Miss Mitchell is in charge of the tennis ladder tournament. The lower classes are handled by Miss Bliss, Miss Sheltman, and Mrs. Crane, who do not specialize in any, but are adept in all the sports.

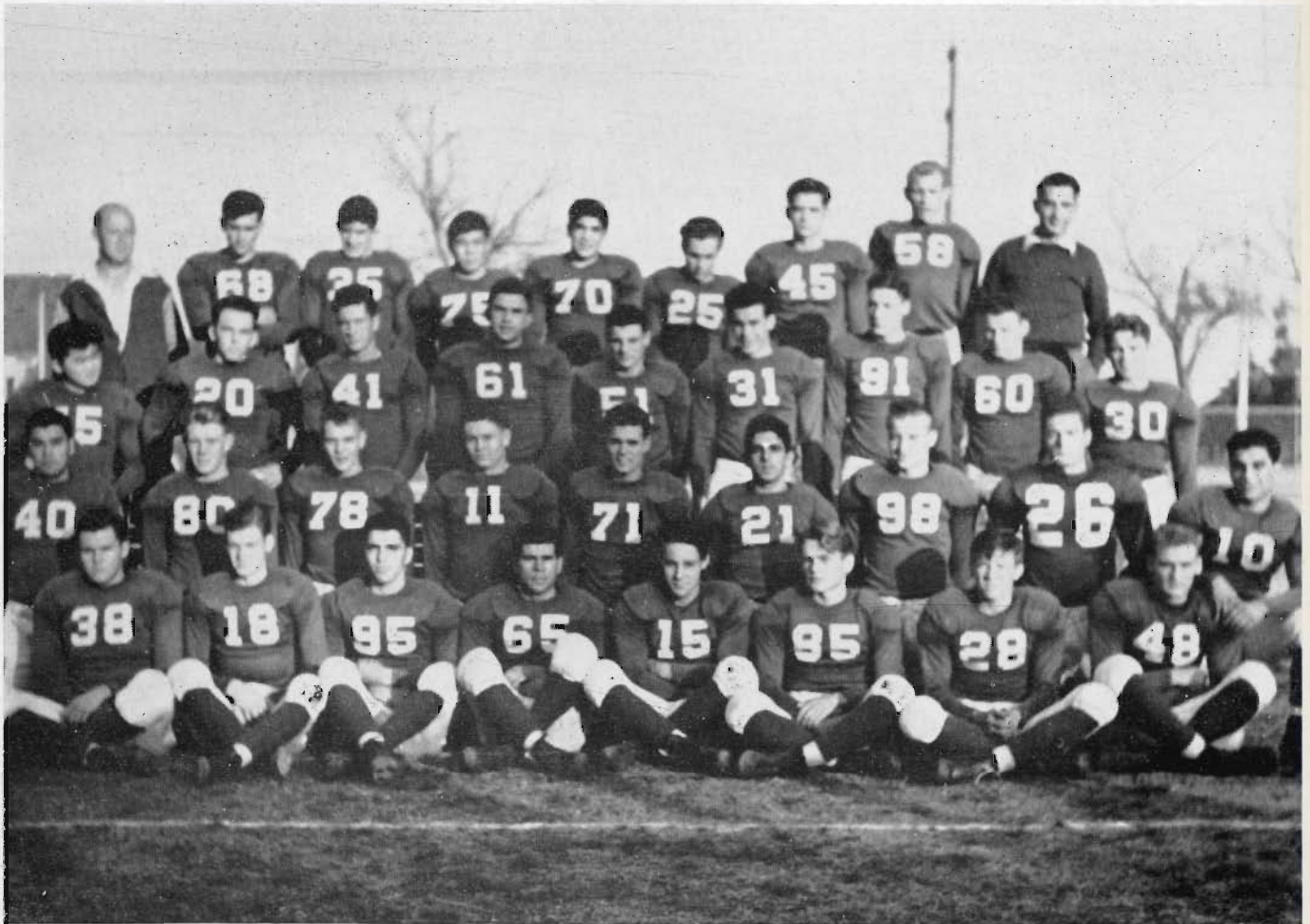

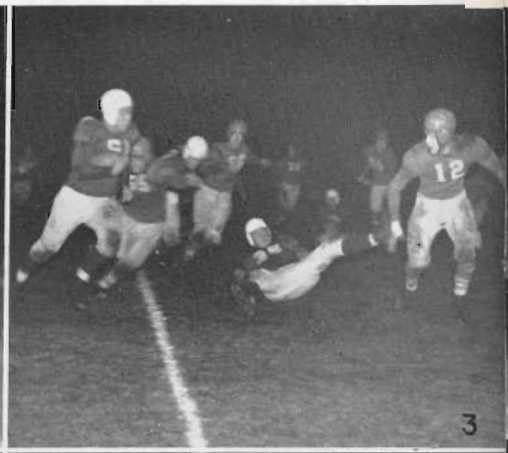

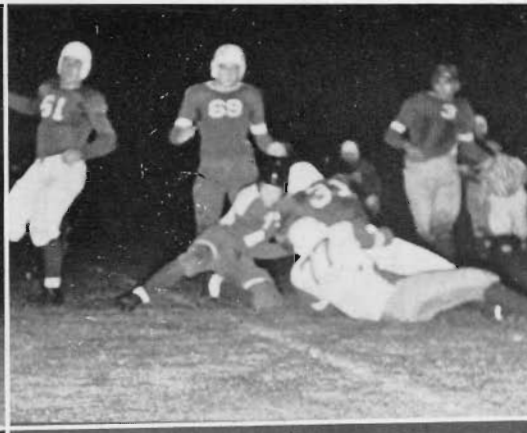
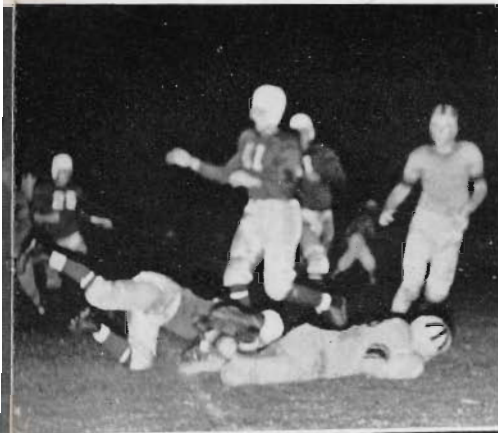
Four Pittsburg men come up to stop a Blue-clad in the season opener, which ended 9-6 in favor of the Black and Orange.

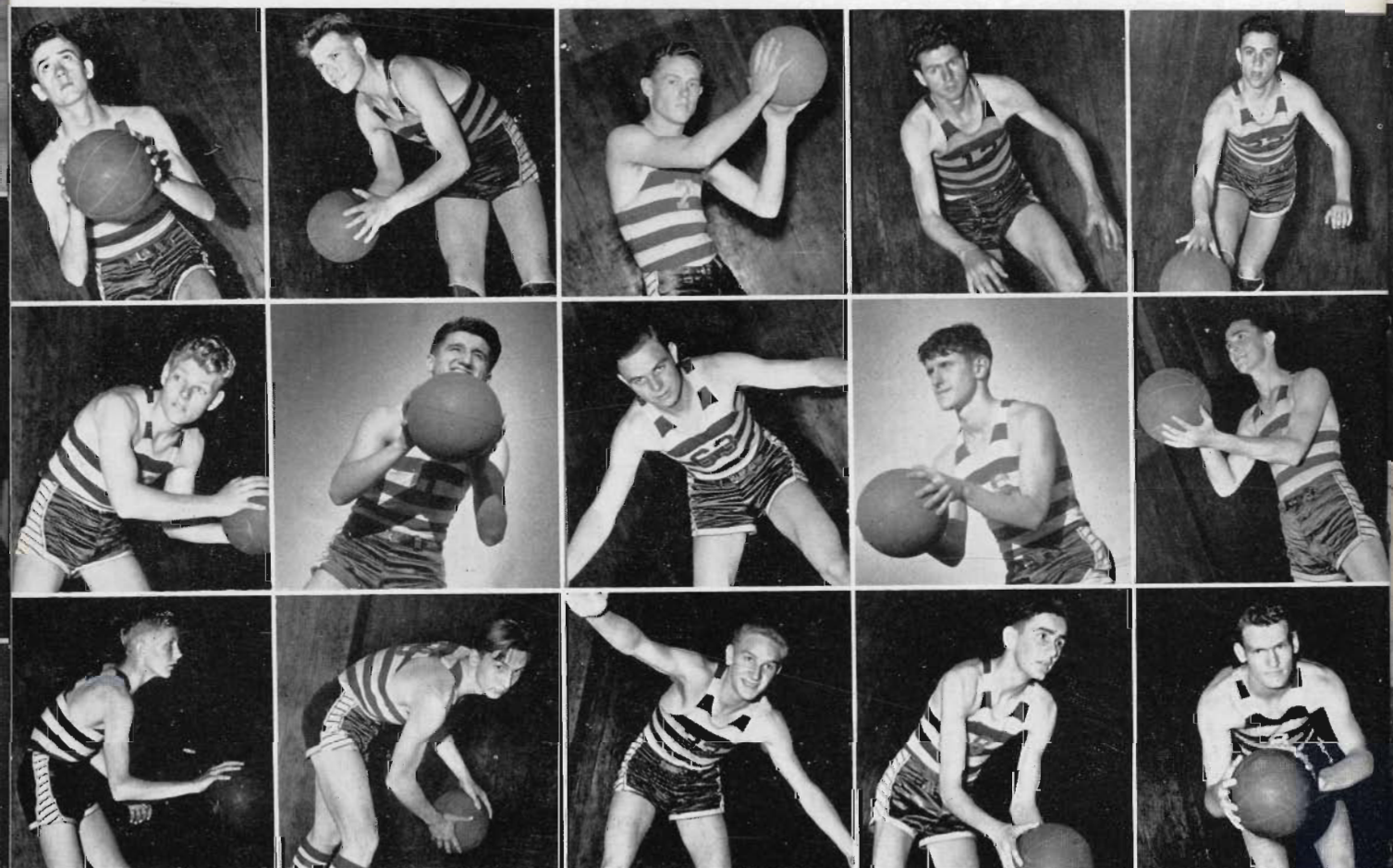

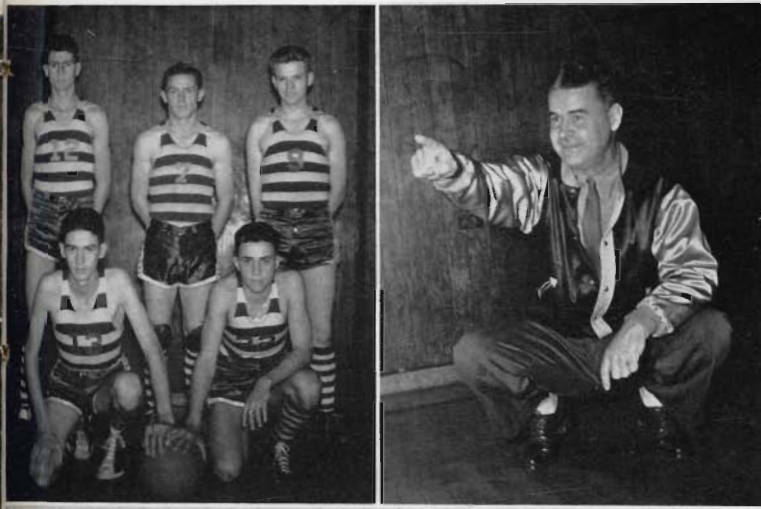

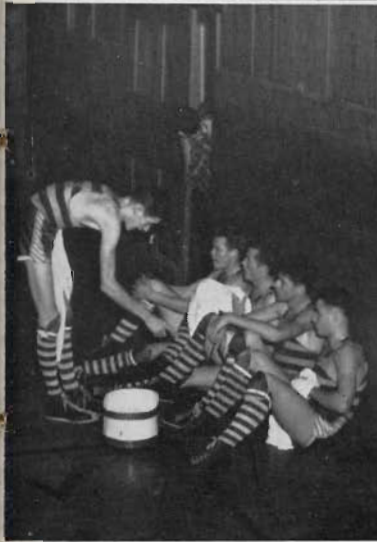

Showing brilliant team play and outstanding individual performances the Tarzans garnered thirteen wins and only two losses out of fifteen games. The Mid-term graduation took its usual toll from the Lenz-men. Graduated from the squad in February were Cates, regular forward, and Leonardini, reserve forward. Loss of Cates was a blow to Stockton, for he was a good leader besides a good player. Fred Ferroggiaro filled the vacancy and did a very good job at it. 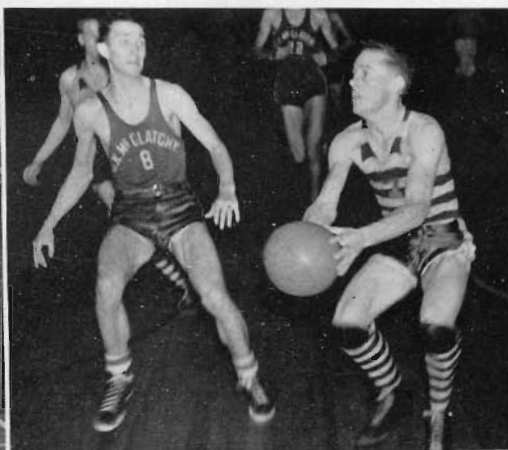

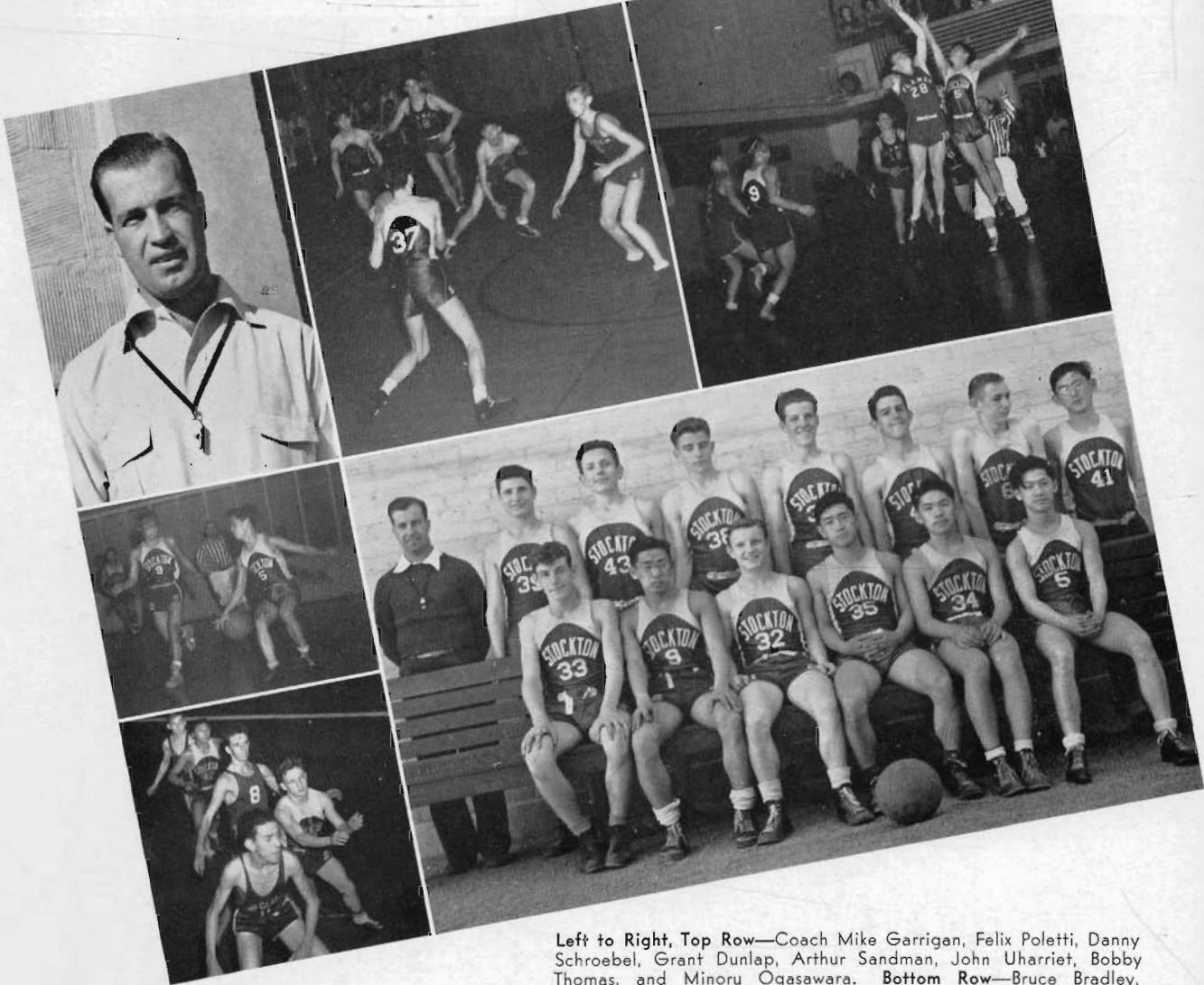
