

McKay is in charge of the teaching of hygiene, tennis, and intramural sports; Mike Garrigan handles B football and basketball, while 'Hap' Evans handles track. In the girls' department, Mrs. May specializes in the incoming freshmen, Miss Harris is in charge of after-school sports, Mrs. Sheridan handles all the modern-dancing classes, and Miss Mitchell is in charge of the tennis ladder tournament. The lower classes are handled by Miss Bliss, Miss Sheltman, and Mrs. Crane, who do not specialize in any, but are adept in all the sports.













The Convict-clads of Stockton High School successfully defended their Northern California C. I. F. title by defeating the Grant Union Pacers at the Northern Sacramento court 25-21. Showing brilliant team play and outstanding individual performances the Tarzans garnered thirteen wins and only two losses out of fifteen games. The Mid-term graduation took its usual toll from the Lenz-men. Graduated from the squad in February were Cates, reqular forward, and Leonardini, reserve forward. Loss of Cates was a blow to Stockton, for he was a good leader besides a good player. Fred Ferroggiaro filled the vacancy and did a very good job at it. Graduation on June 13 took from the squad an additional four, Murray, guard; Traphagen, guard; Wakefield, forward; and Werner, forward. Mason and Lund also played their last season of prep basketball this year; they will be uneligible next season due to the strict age restriction. The former deserves much credit for his great playing in the last three years for Stockton High School. 
