



THE SEASON was begun with the usual practice games for the "A" teamers. The first games did not give too much encouragement as the team was composed of very few veterans. But each game showed an improvement, and we advanced rapidly into the winning bracket.

The Sacramento County League championship was again captured by the San Juan "A's" for the fifth consecutive year without a defeat.

With fine spirit and plain playing ability, the team came within an ace of winning the Central California championship for the second consecutive year. In one of the fastest and most evenly matched games ever played at San Juan, our "A's" were forced to relinquish the cup to Sonora High School when the deciding basket of overtime period was won by the visiting team. The score at the end of the game was 39 to 37.

A three year veteran, Pete Codina, chalked up 65 points in 7 league games. His closest competitor, Harry Easterday, dropped 53 points through the loop. During the Lincoln-San Juan game, George Difani bucketed 19 points in the one game. It would have been impossible, however, for these boys to chalk up the points if it had not been for the excellent work of their teammates, Leon Ford and Elmer Kanoff.


