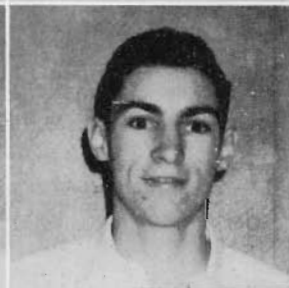
"A" BASKETBALL

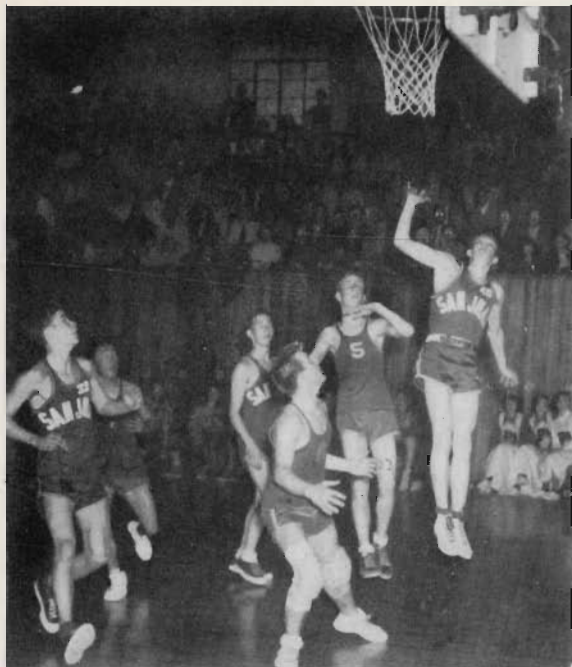

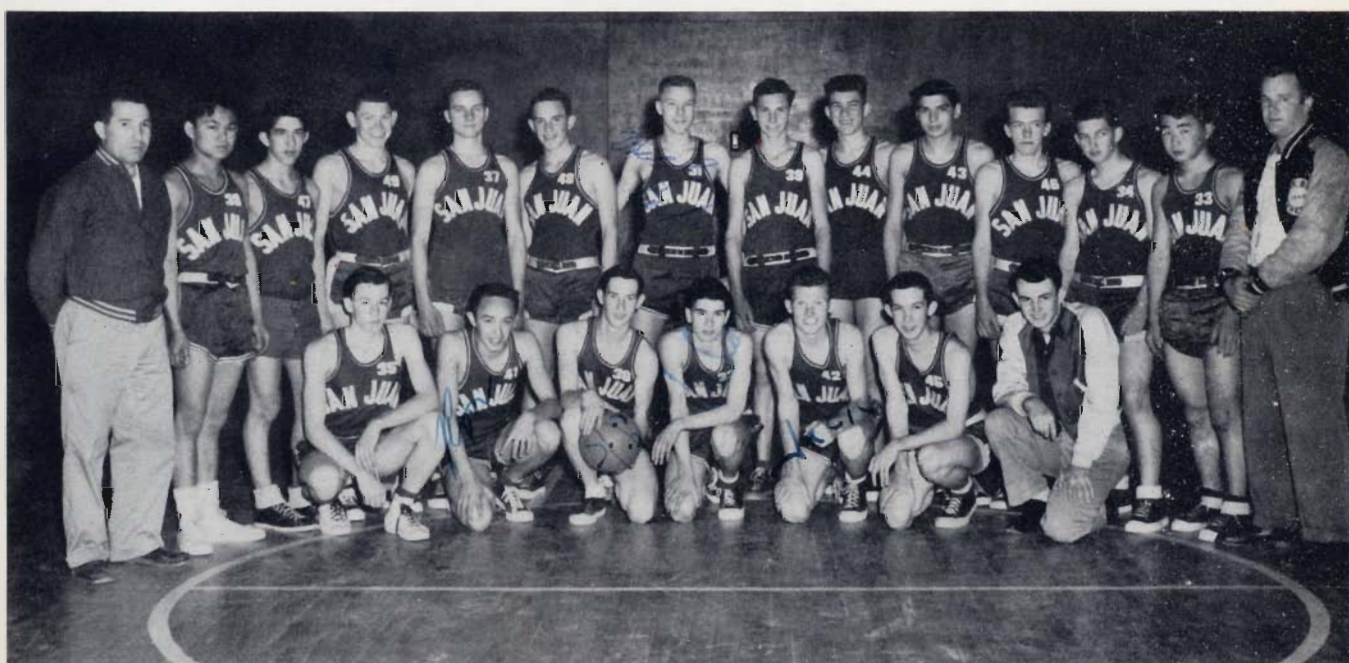

CROSS COUNTRY

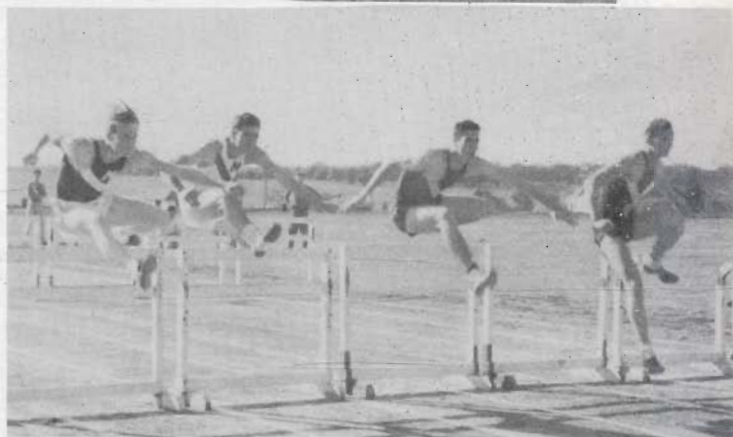

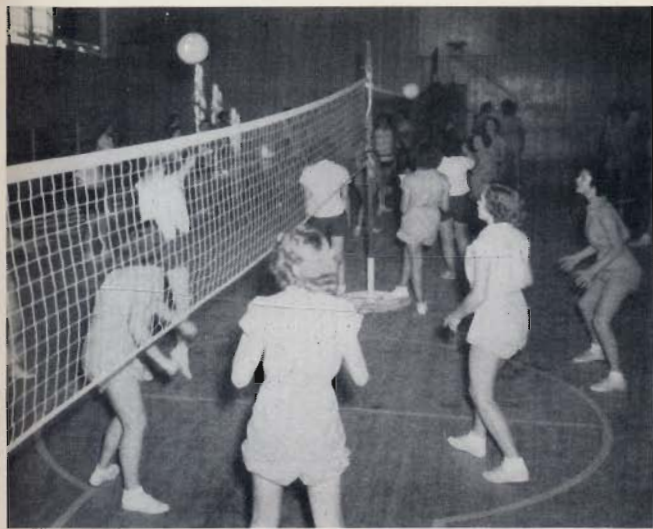

JUNE 8

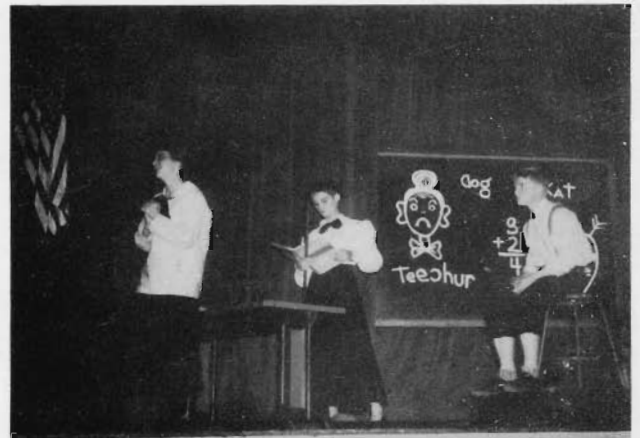
Tonight we complete our high school life here at San Juan. Never before have we realized the fun we have had during the last four years. I know our fond memories will remain with us always.
