Hi-Y

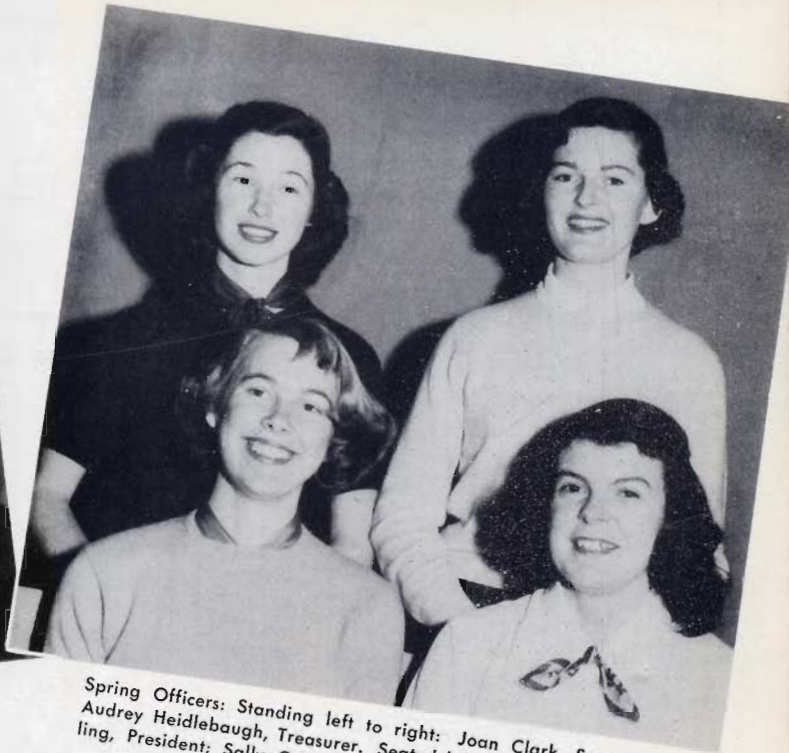

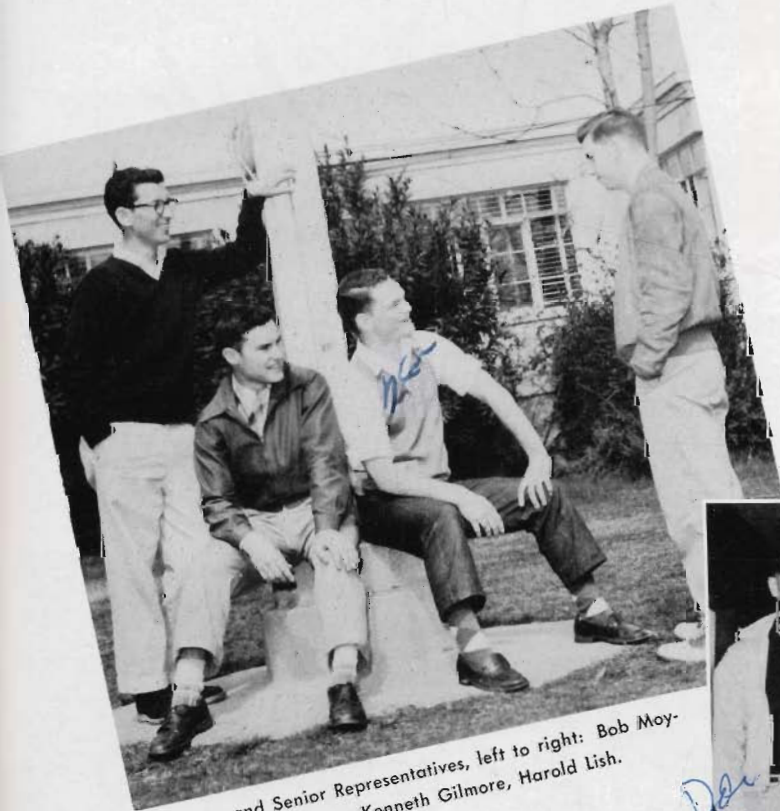
