# Stockton as an Industrial and Agricultural Center

(Prepared by the Stockton Chamber of Commerce)

---

Stockton, situated in the center of the great empire of Interior California which extends from the Tehachapis on the south to the Siskiyou on the north, has long been the industrial and agricultural metropolis and is now in the process of becoming the pivotal transportation point of this great area. With an ever-increasing system of excellent highways for truck travel, with three transcontinental rail lines and various branches now serving Stockton and with the fourth to be added soon, and the \$6,000,000 Deep Water Ship Channel project being hurried to completion, this City is taking on an ever-increasingly important aspect from a transportation standpoint.

With an extensive system of city and county highways and the steady construction of roads designed for heavy traffic, Stockton, as a distributing and concentrating center for Central California, possesses great future potentialities. The three transcontinental rail systems and the nine feeder lines, together with present water transportation through the hundreds of miles of channels and sloughs, present an interesting transportation picture. The Deep Water Ship Channel, which probably will be completed about January 1, 1933, rounds out the transportation system to a point near perfection.

While the center of a tremendously rich agricultural area, Stockton at the same time is possessed of considerable industrial wealth. There are at present 227 manufacturing enterprises employing approximately 7000 people with an annual payroll of almost \$10,000,000 and with a total annual production in 1930 in excess of \$42,000,000.

From an agricultural standpoint, San Joaquin County ranks high in the nation, being known as the first county in diversification, with more than fifty commercially grown crops which in 1930 produced more than \$54,000,000 farm value.

As a market for the products of soil and factory, Stockton has in a 50-mile radius a population of 720,000. In a radius of 75 miles, which takes in all of the Bay communities, the population figure is 1,990,000. Increasing the radius 25 miles, up to 100 miles, the population is 2,150,000, while in a radius of 200 miles, in which the Port of Stockton will draw largely for its tonnage, there is a population of 2,600,000.

The Stockton Channel on the San Joaquin River is now being dredged to a minimum depth of 26 feet, which will accommodate more than 85 per cent of all shipping which now enters the Golden Gate. This channel, which is being constructed jointly by the City of Stockton, Federal Government and the State of California, will be 450 feet wide at the surface and 100 feet wide where the depth is 26 feet or more. The main channel curves will have a radius of 5000 feet and the entire distance from Stockton west to Suisun Bay will be marked and lighted by the time the project is completed. The City of Stockton is now preparing to start construction on its harbor facilities which will include 1200 feet of docks, 800 feet of transit sheds and a belt line railway serving the docks and the industrial area.

In addition to its favorable position as an agricultural, industrial and transportation center, Stockton also possesses numerous recreational advantages both in the Delta to the west and in the Sierra Nevada Mountains in the east.
