Redwood City and Vicinity

The section of the bay side of San Mateo County from San Carlos southward to the Santa Clara County line is one of the finest locations in California. It has diversified attractions. Much of it is used for suburban residences. Floriculture is a great industry throughout the whole section. Redwood City, the county seat, is becoming an important industrial center. Atherton is a purely residential locality. Menlo Park contains many fine homes and is quite a business center. Woodside is an old settlement in an agricultural section. A large proportion of the residents are descendants of pioneer families of California. The state highway passes through this portion of the county from north to south, with finely paved roads of the county highway system radiating in various directions. Rail and water transportation are available for industrial enterprises.
