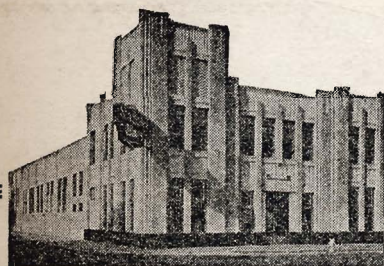

SECTION 28
COPYRIGHT LAW
In Force July 1, 1909

That any person who wilfully and for profit shall infringe any copy-
right secured by this act, or who shall knowingly or wilfully aid or abet
such infringement, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon
conviction thereof shall be punished by imprisonment fo rnot exceeding
one year, or by a fine of not less than one hundred dollars nor more than
one thousand dollars, or both, in the discretion of the court.
