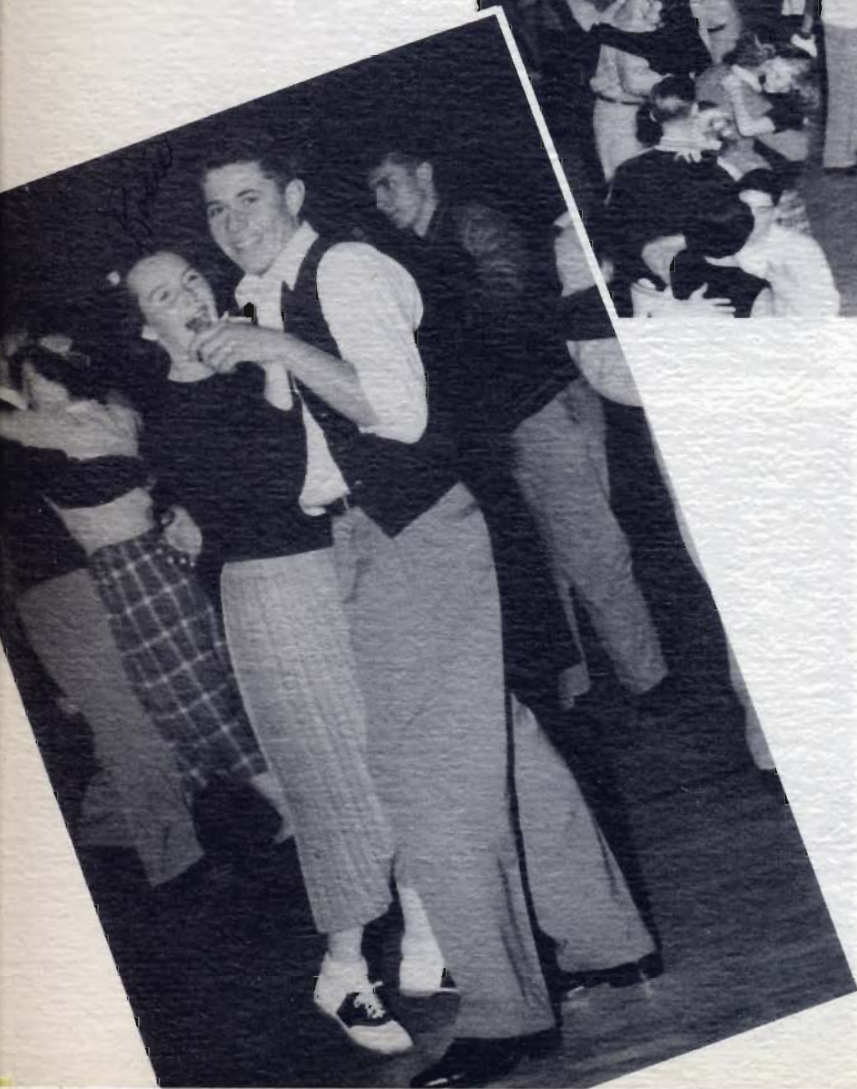






## Dances

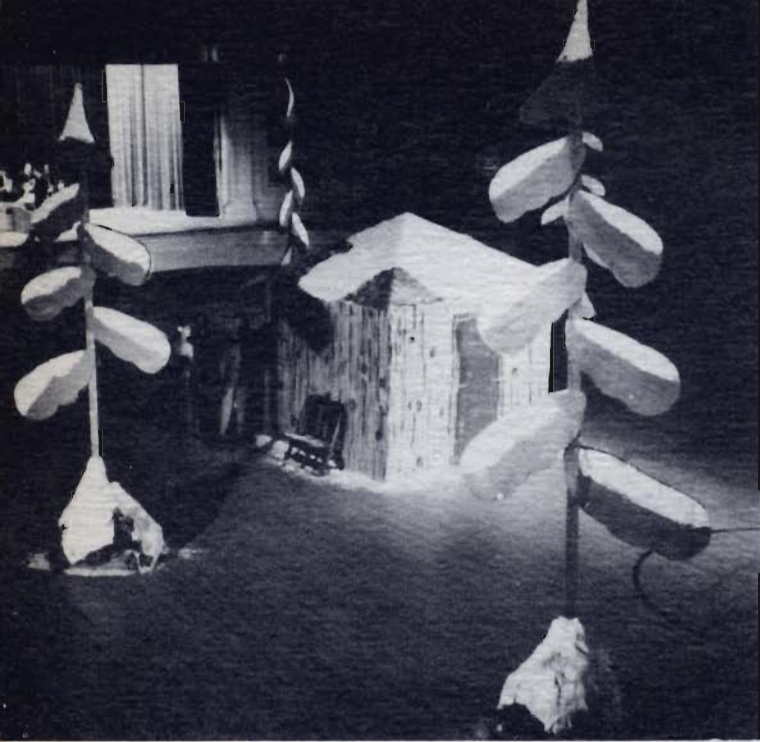






## Winter Formal

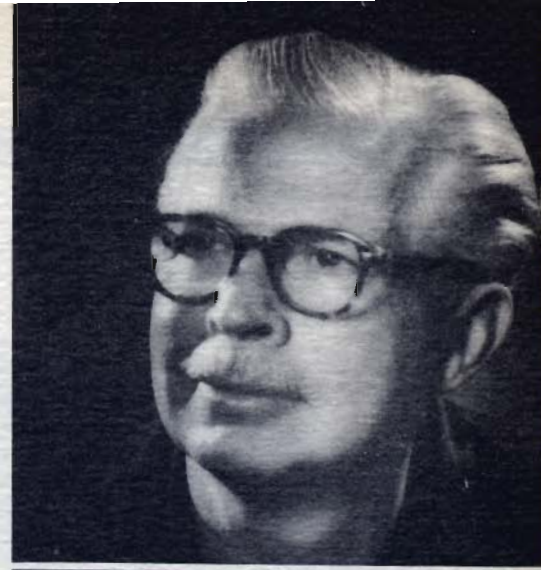




## ... of Grease Paint, etc.

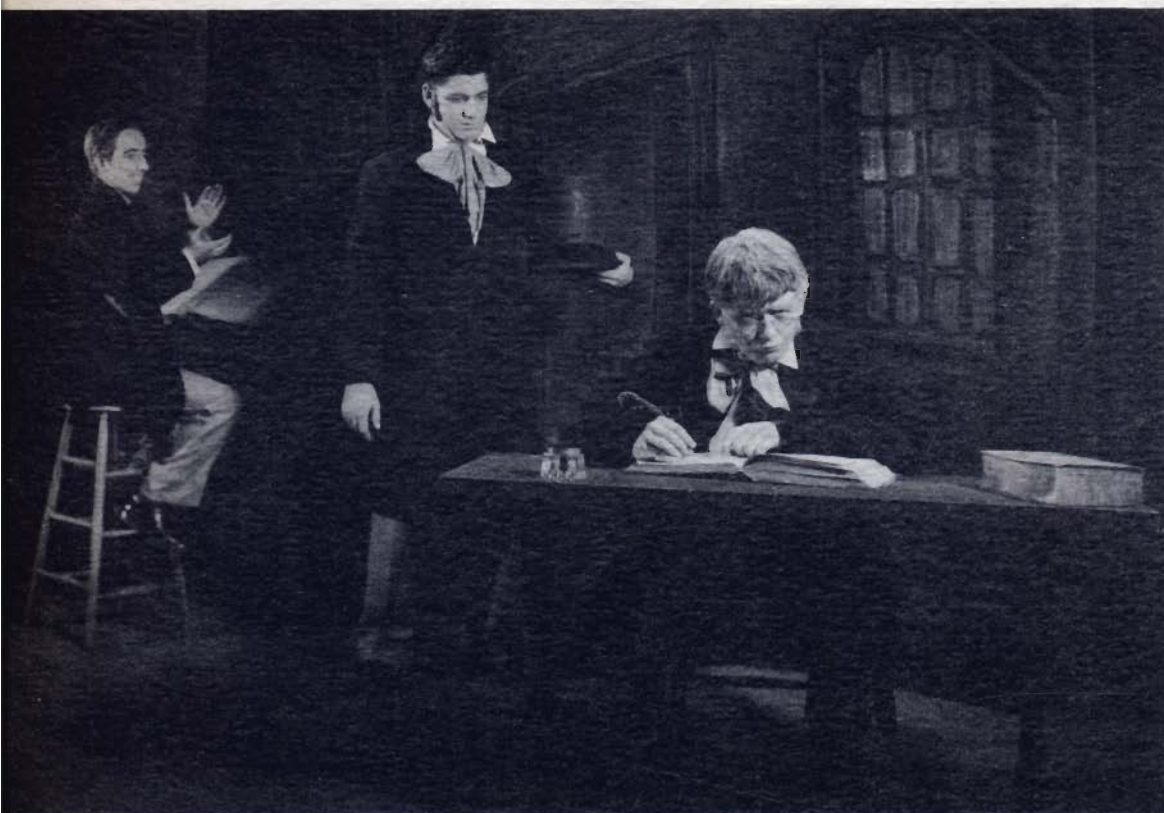


This early English comedy involved that precious article, the needle, and just what happened when it was accidentally lost, and even more accidentally found.

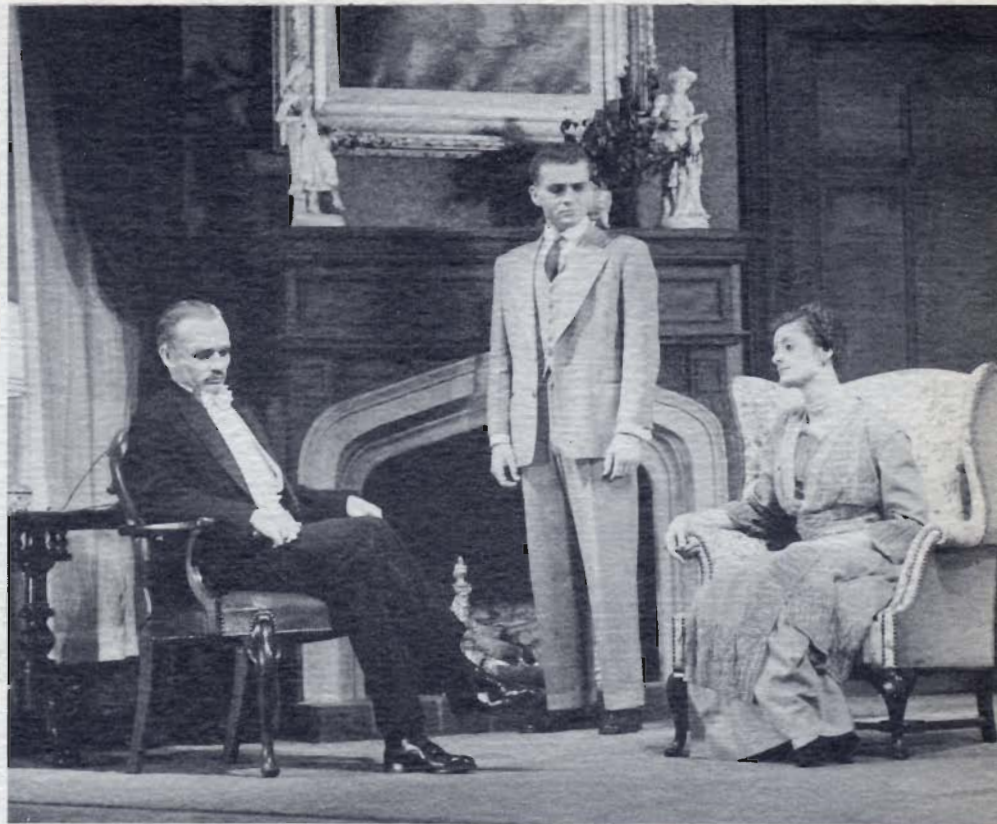




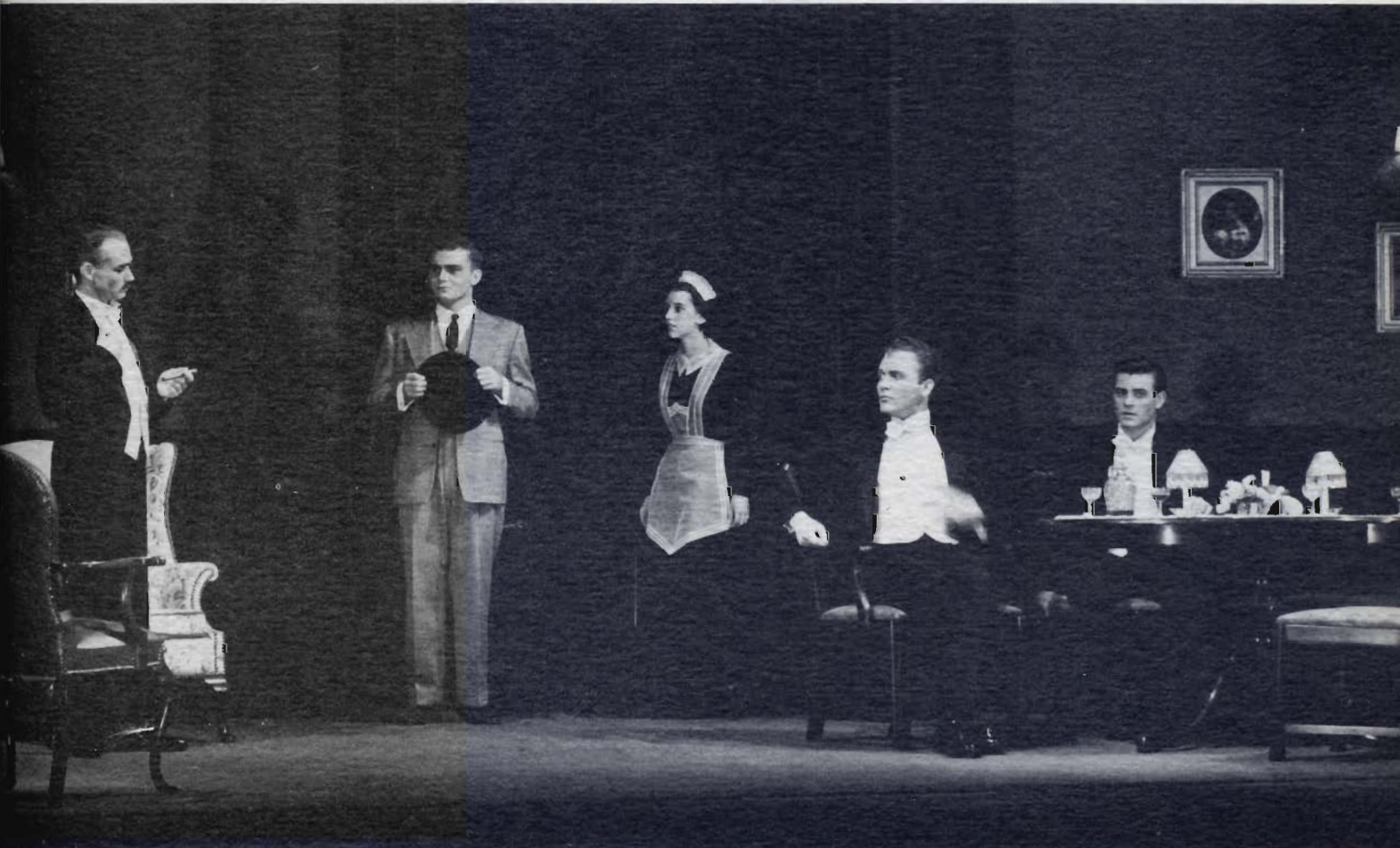

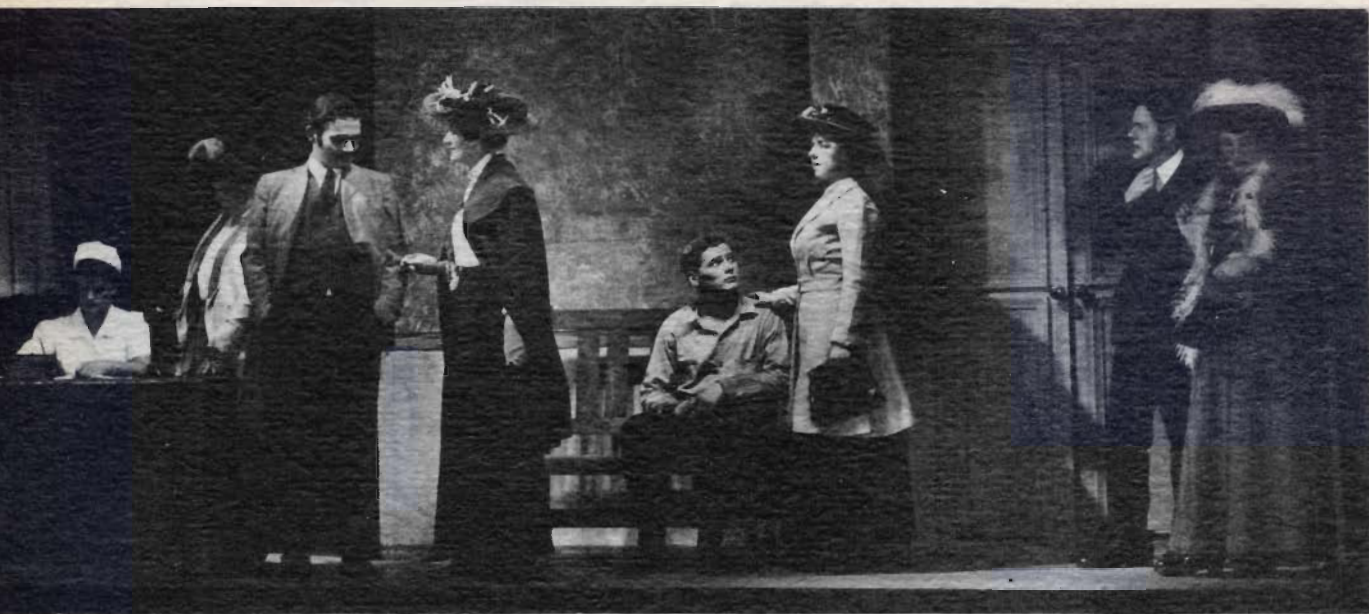
