

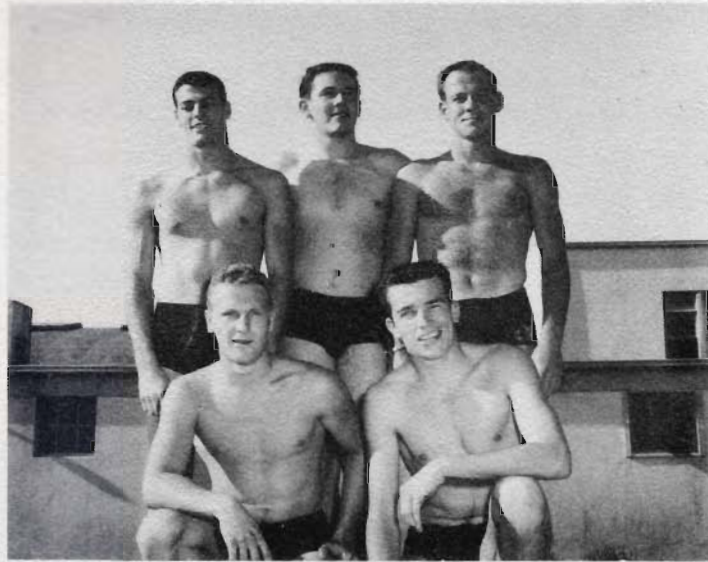
Mustang Swimming

Handicapped by a shortage of manpower due to the draft, ineligibility, and drop-outs, Coach Bill Anttila's five-man swimming squad, nevertheless enjoyed a banner year with all five of his swimmers being considered for All-American honors. They won eight out of nine meets in upholding the Mustang's amazing past seven year's record of 64 wins in 73 dual meets. Their only loss this season was at the hands of the powerful California Frosh.

Early in the season Dickson Hoogs lowered the school record in the 50-yard free style and Jim Lantz in the 200-yard backstroke. Along with their record, the 300-yard medley team of Lantz, Hoogs, and Greene posted the best junior college time in the state for this event. Much credit for the team's success also goes to team manager Paul Harrison.

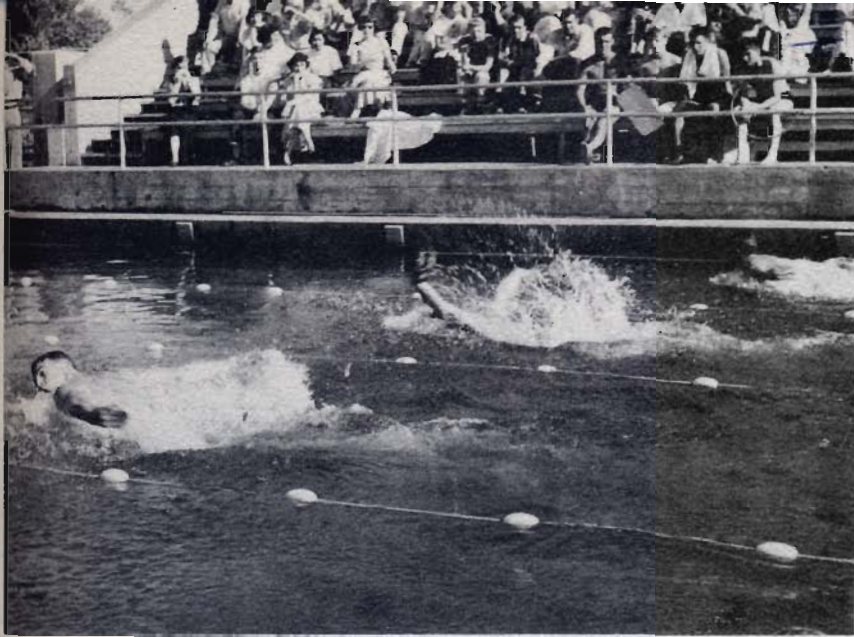

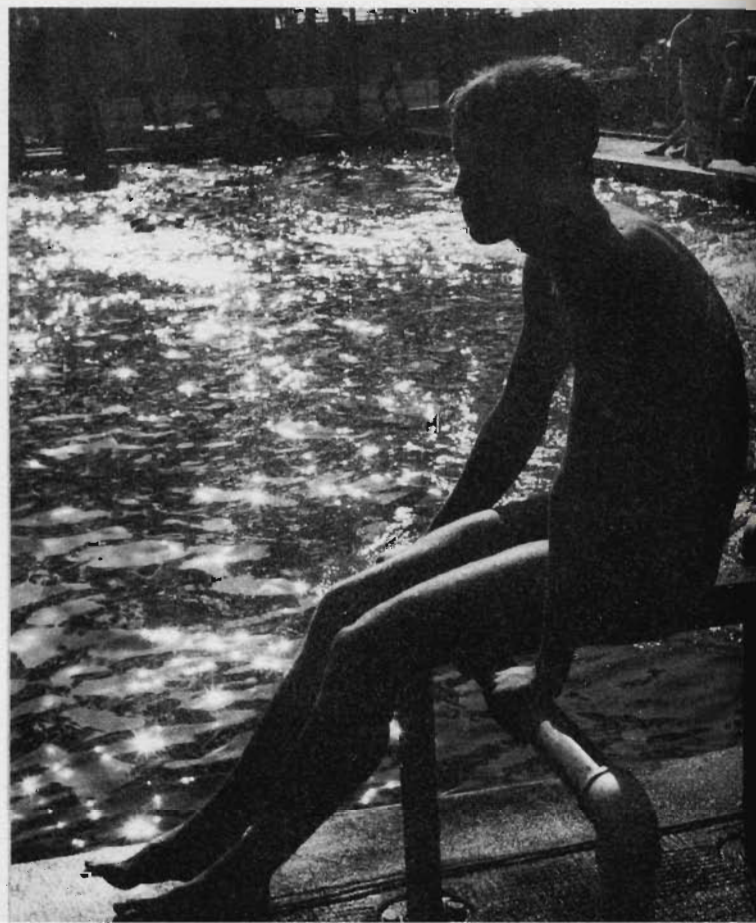

Patterson, the high-point man of the team, also lowered the school record in the 50-yard and the 100-yard freestyle. Don Smith lowered the school record in the 150-yard individual medley and David Davis has yet to suffer a loss in the diving event.

Mustang Water Polo

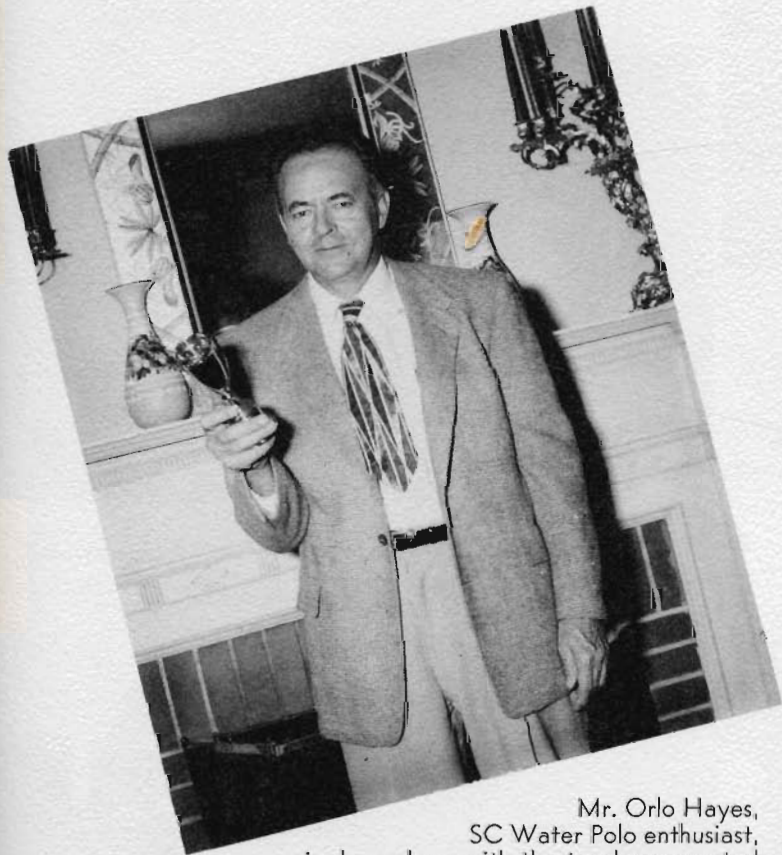

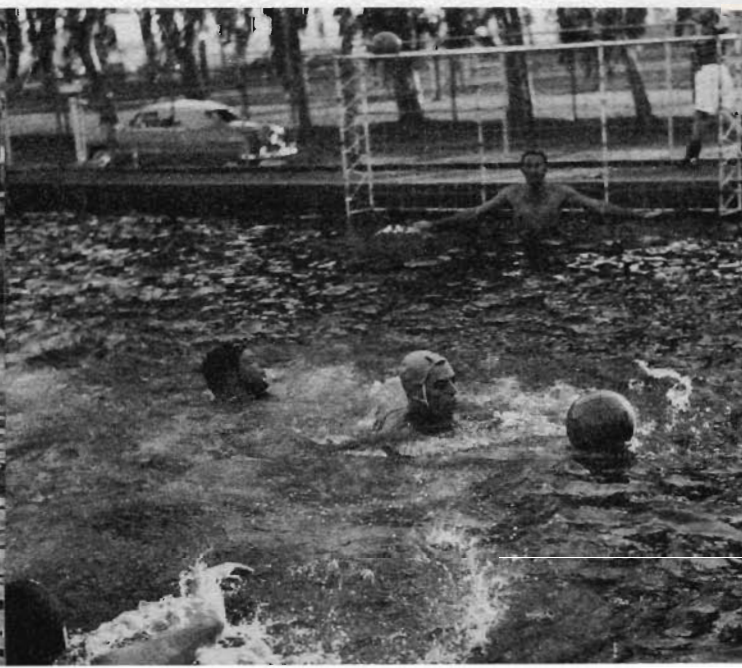
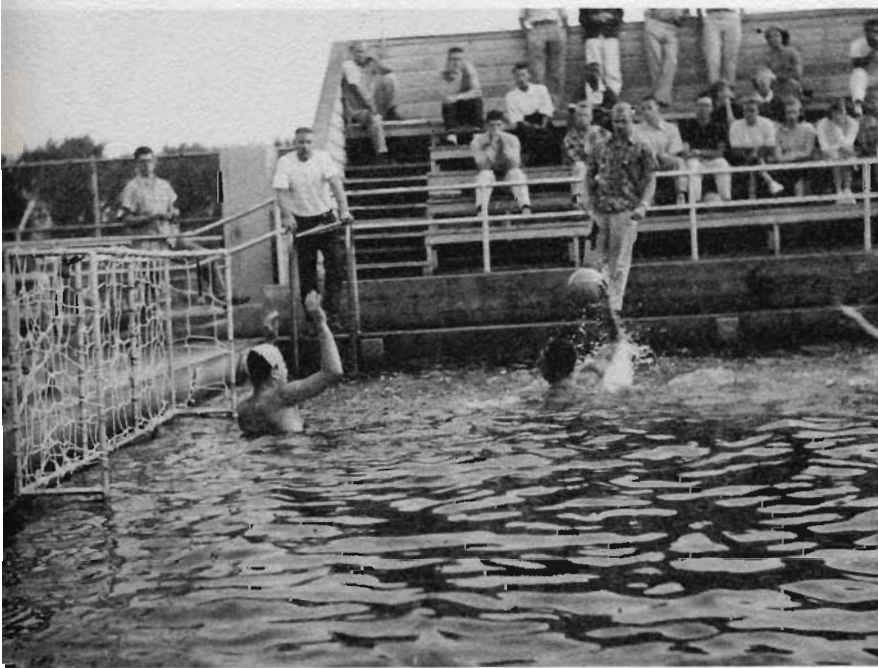
Awards went to Bob Taylor as Most Valuable Player; Roger Ditmanson, Most Improved Player; and Season Captain, Dickson Hoogs.

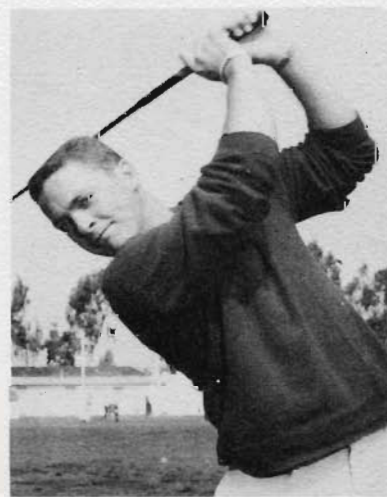

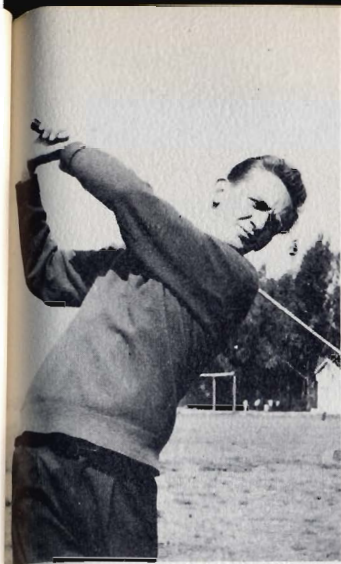
Mustang Golf

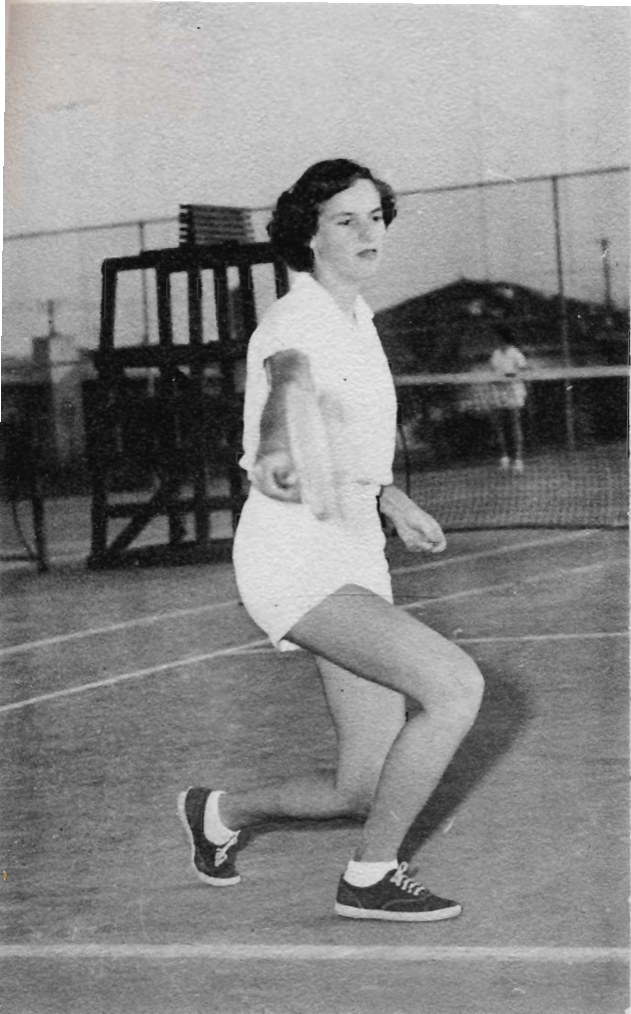

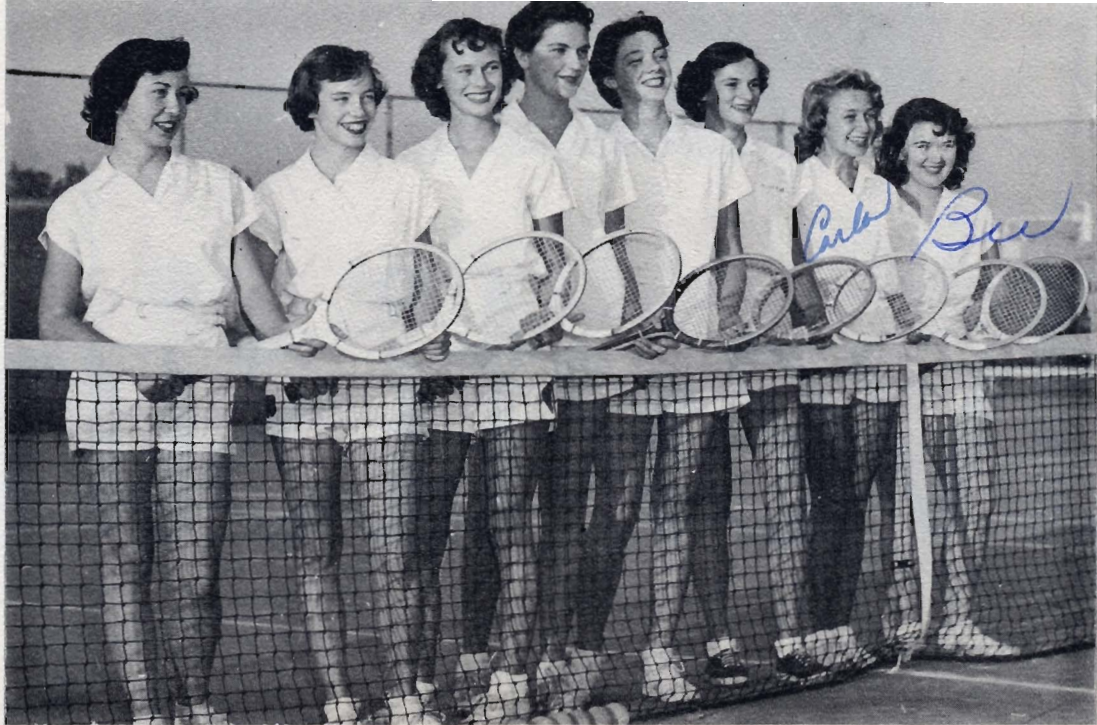
