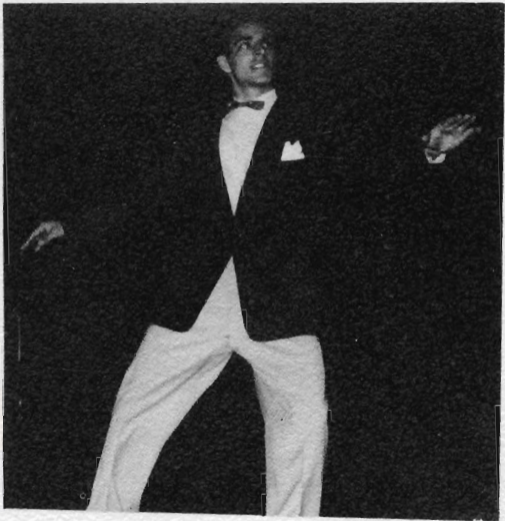

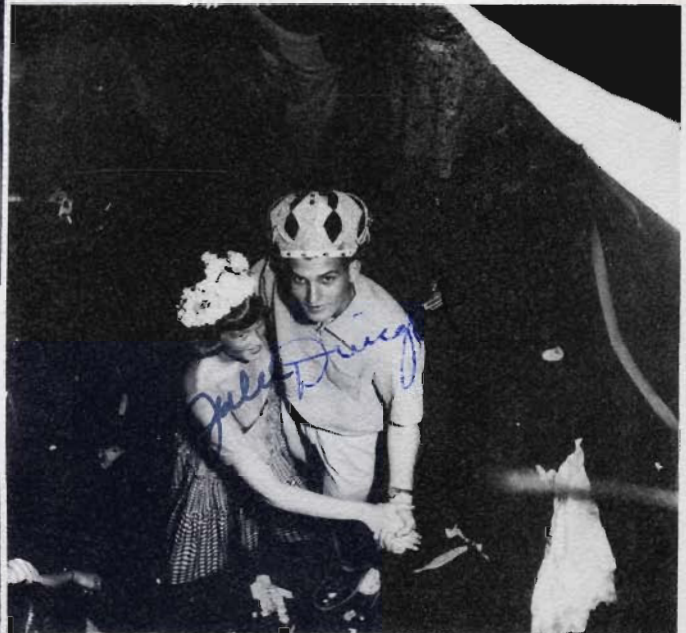
Are they studying the possibilities of this jelly-like creature as a biological specimen --- or for lunch?

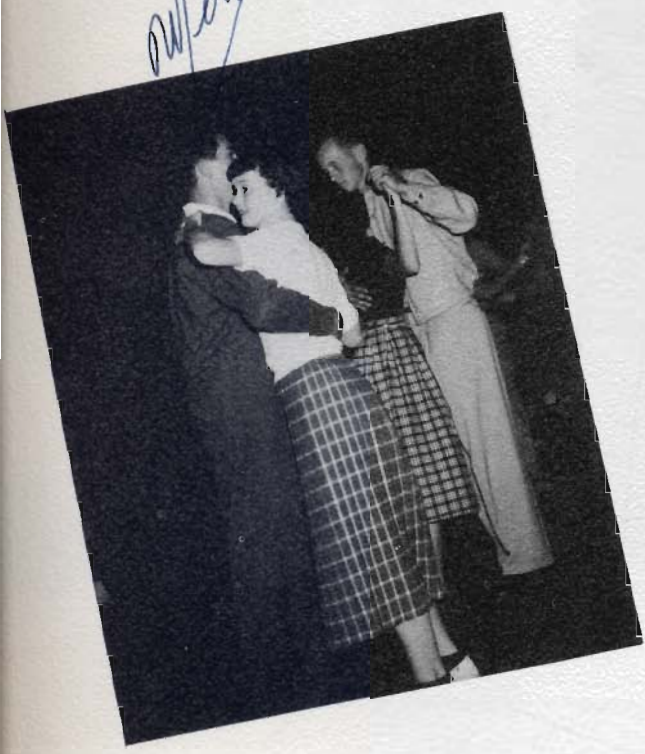


Dances...

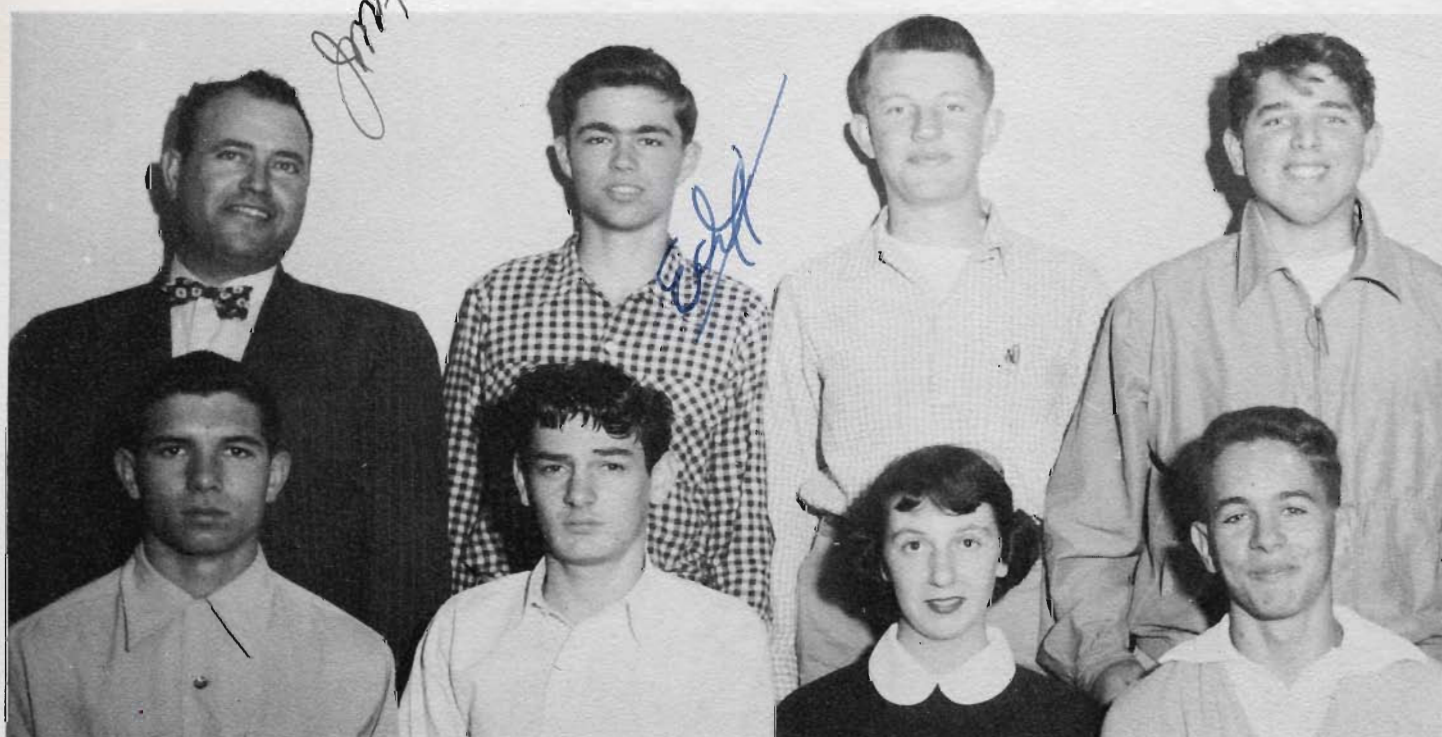

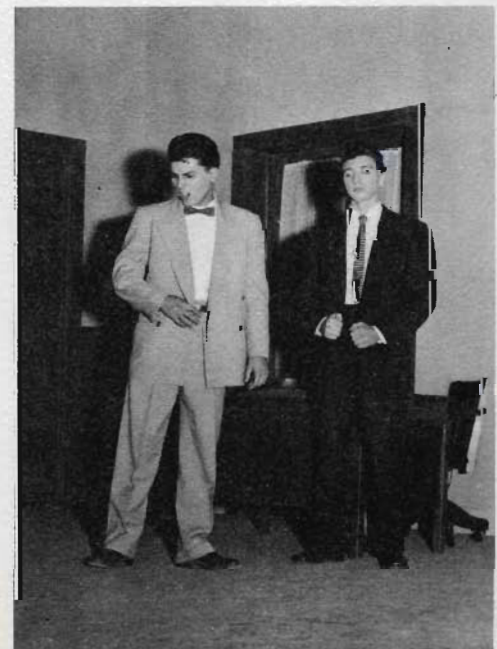
