For the seventh time in eight years the mermen placed first in the Northern California Junior College Association Championships. In the state championships the Mustangs placed fourth out of sixteen teams, using four swimmers. In this event the team won eleven medals.

Bob Gaughran won the state championship in the 100-yard backstroke. He was awarded the most valuable player spot on the Mustang team. Doug Hansen was chosen as the most improved player.

Britt Vail was elected honorary Captain of the team. Five of the Mustang swimmers were elected to the National Junior College All-American team. They are: Bob Gaughran, Britt Vail, Don Smith, Walt Patterson and Doug Hanson.

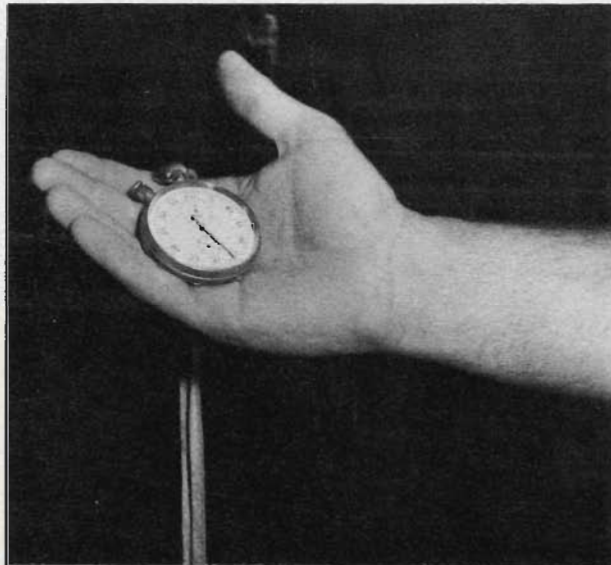

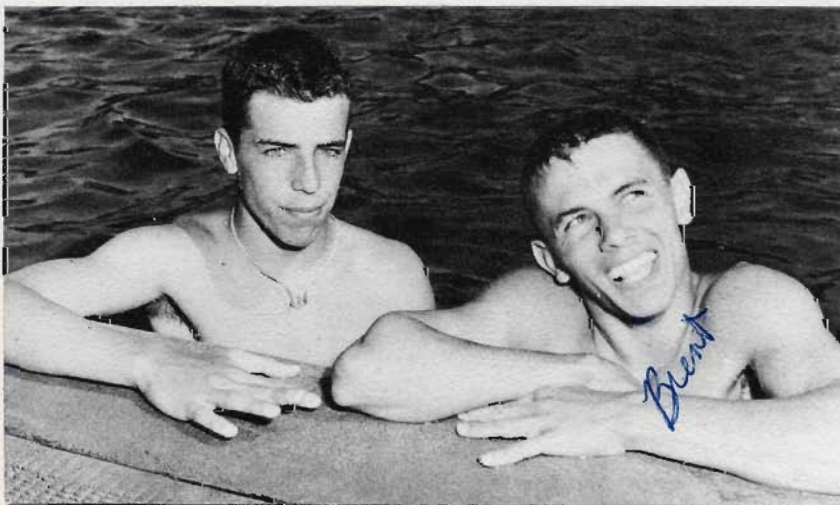

Colt relay standouts, Chris Green and Brent Heisinger.

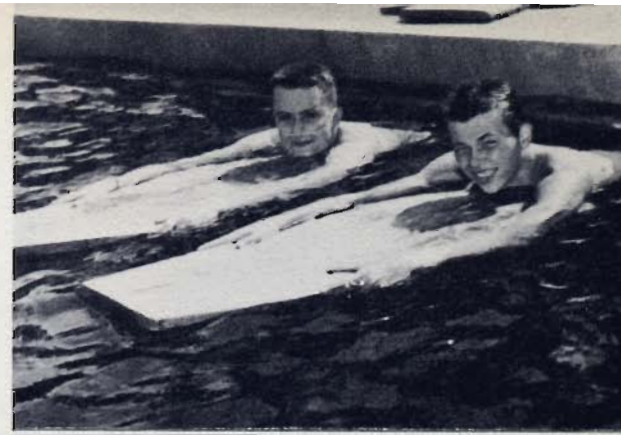

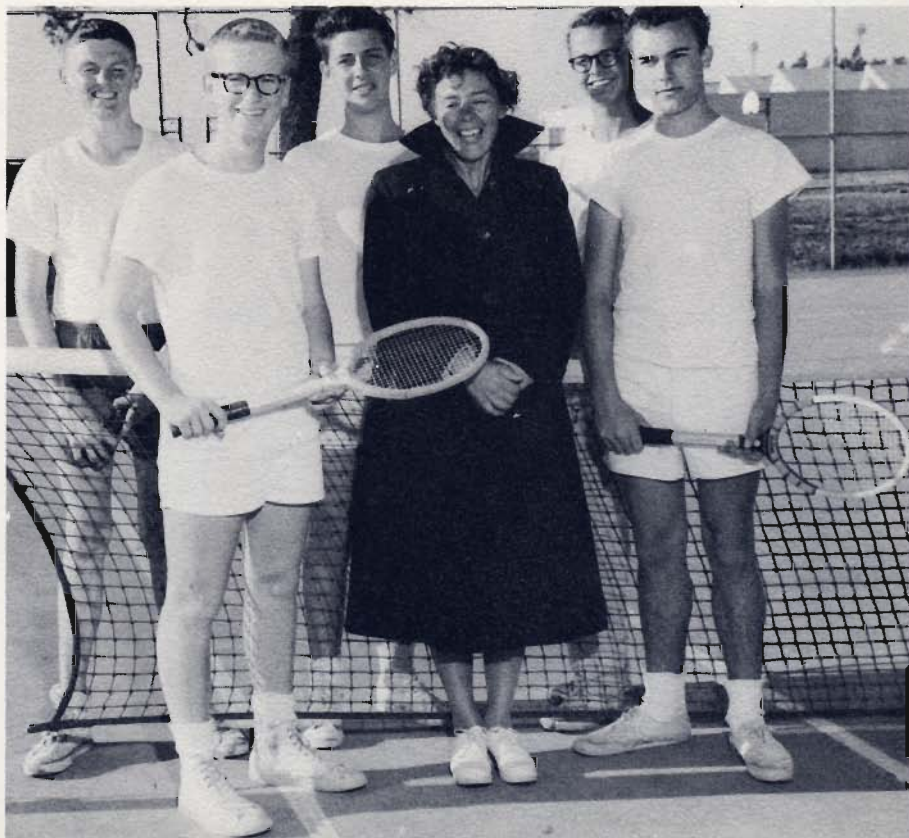


Jack MacDonald

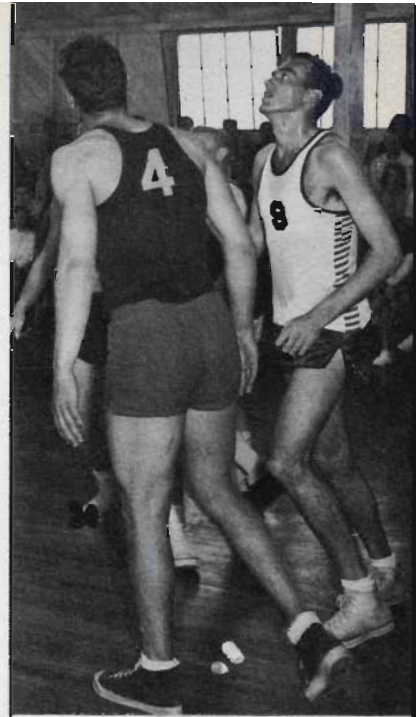

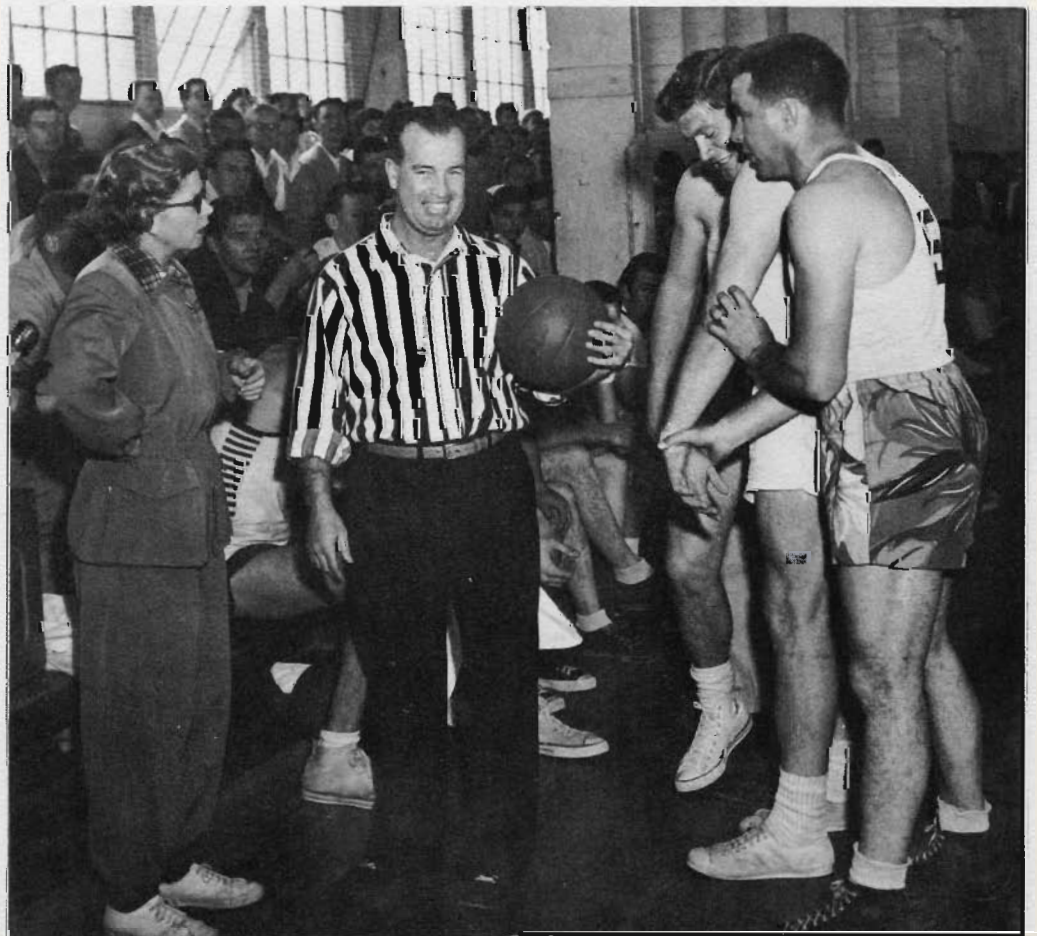
