estimation a success. Impressing people or being well known is not nearly so important as finding the satisfaction and peace of mind one gets upon accomplishing what he has set out to do."

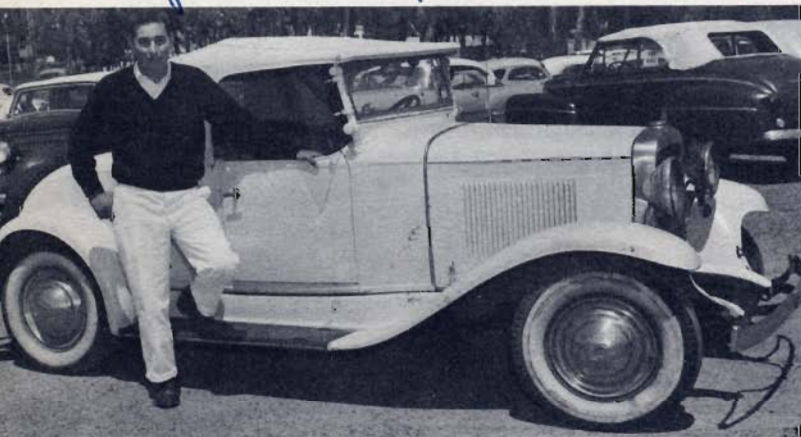

Stockton College has changed because of Al, too. Ask any student.

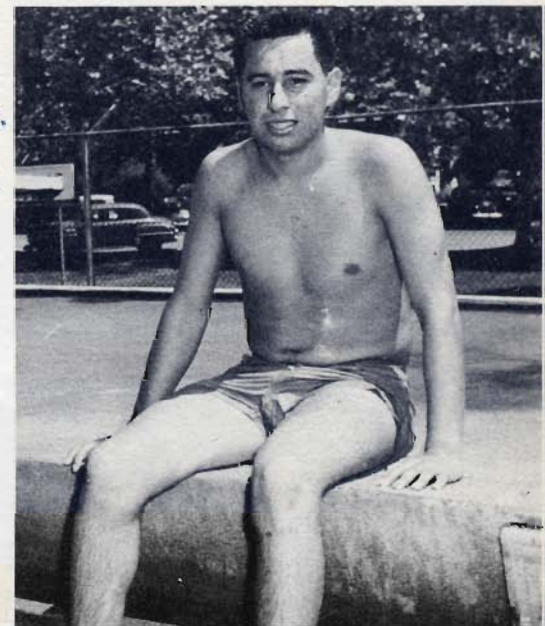

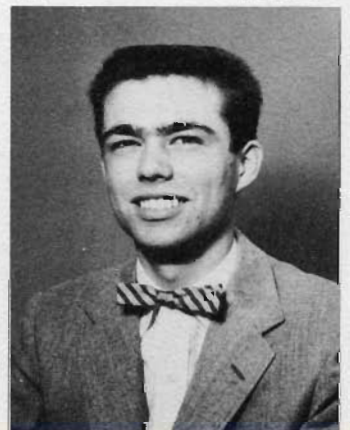

Stockton College Class Officers

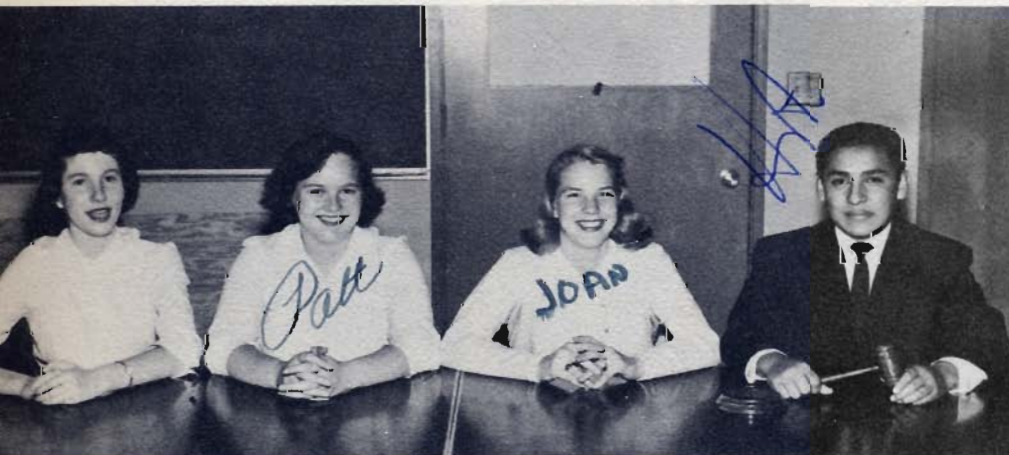
The Class officers are the people who are responsible for the welfare of the Stockton College Students. Through these people it is possible for any student to present his problems as an individual.



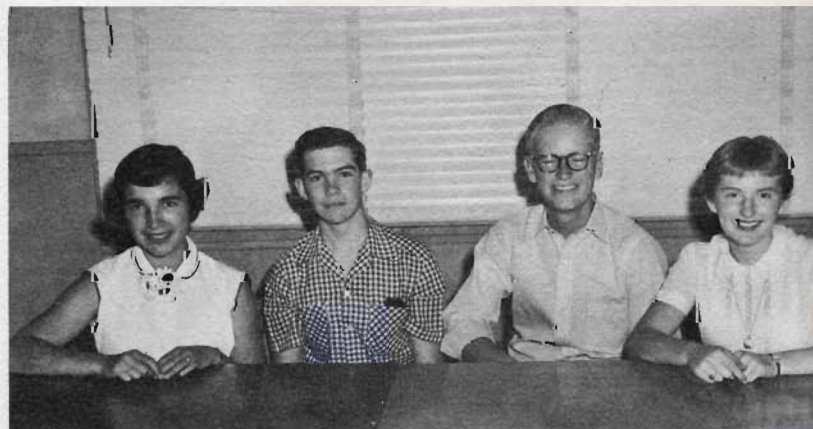

Rally Committee

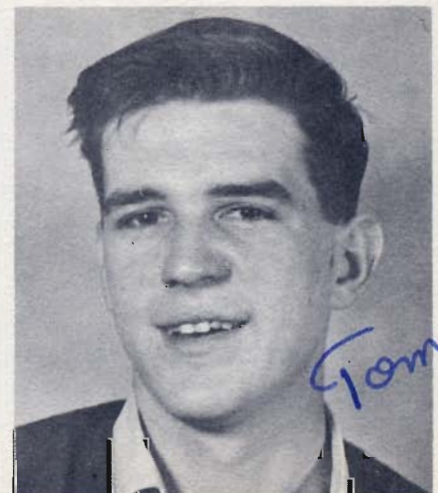
The Rally Committee is concerned with the planning and execution of all school rallies. It also runs the Public Address system. This group does much to promote school spirit.
