One of the students in the picture at the lower lefthand corner, using Miss Bonnie Clay as his model, might someday be the artist in the lime-light at the museum.

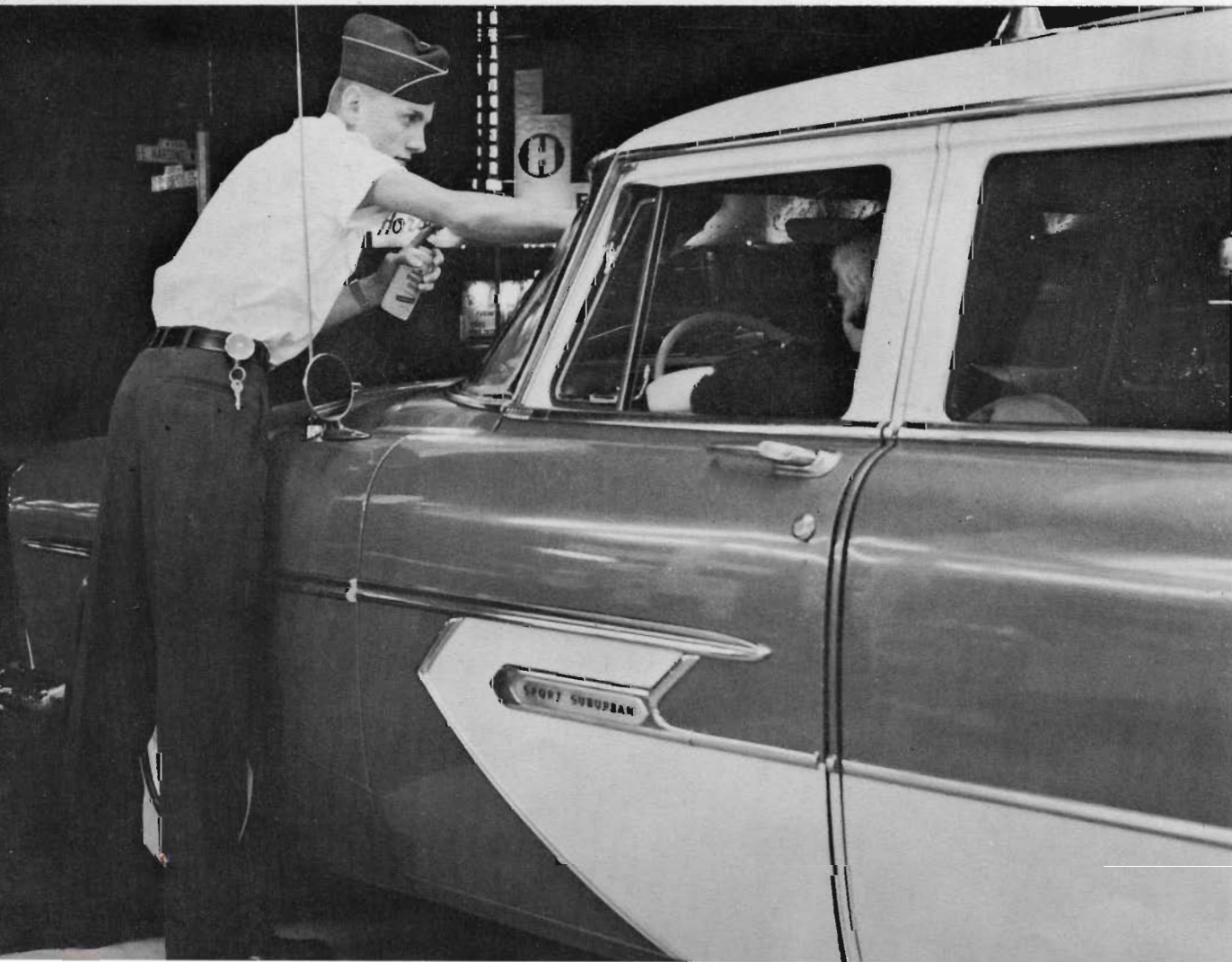

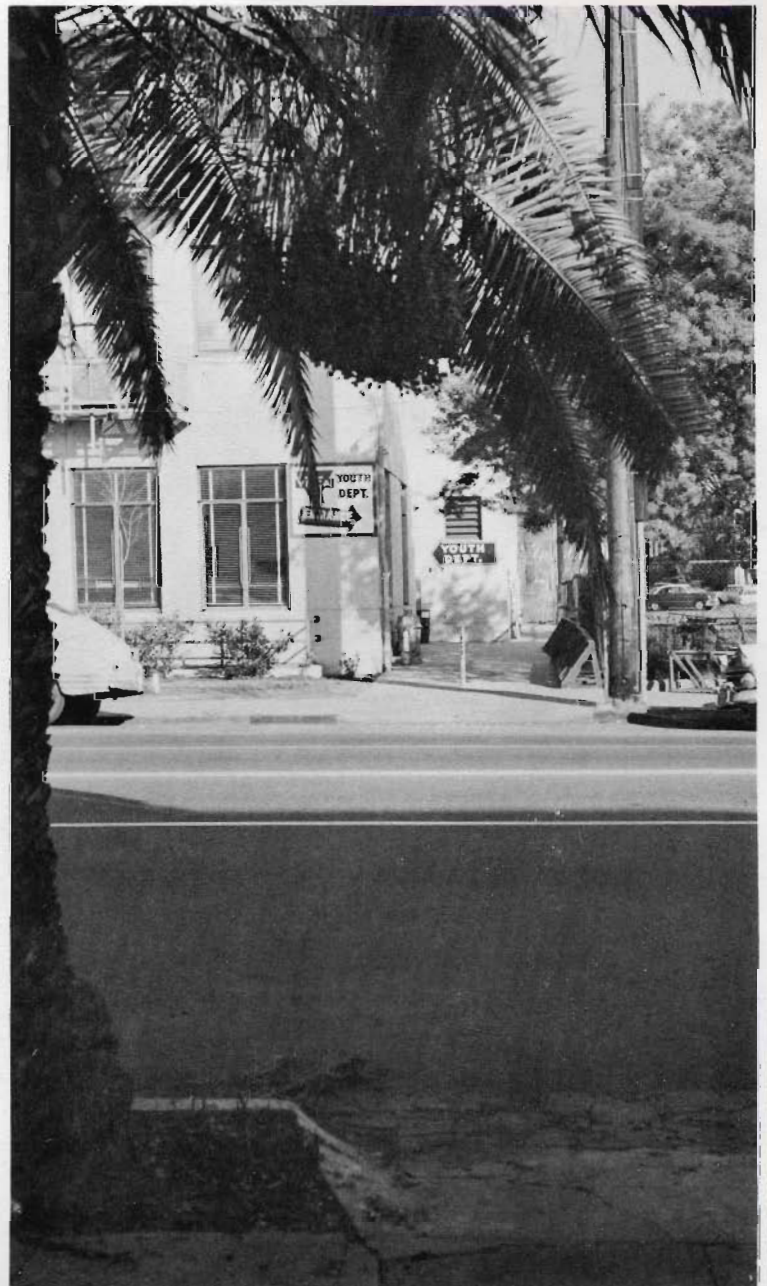
A large variety of sports activities were available to the students under Stockton College's physical education program. Here, Miss Gerry Garden is pictured on the gym field trying her skill at archery.

In the city, the youth department of the YMCA offered the same opportunities for students to learn games and meet people of their own age.



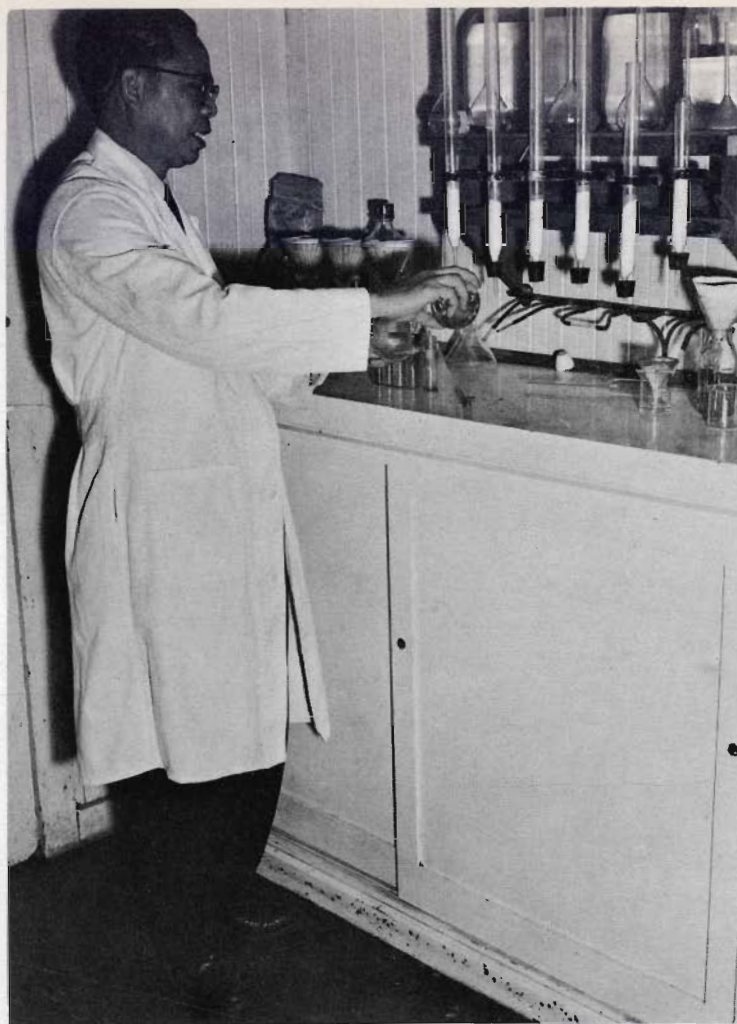

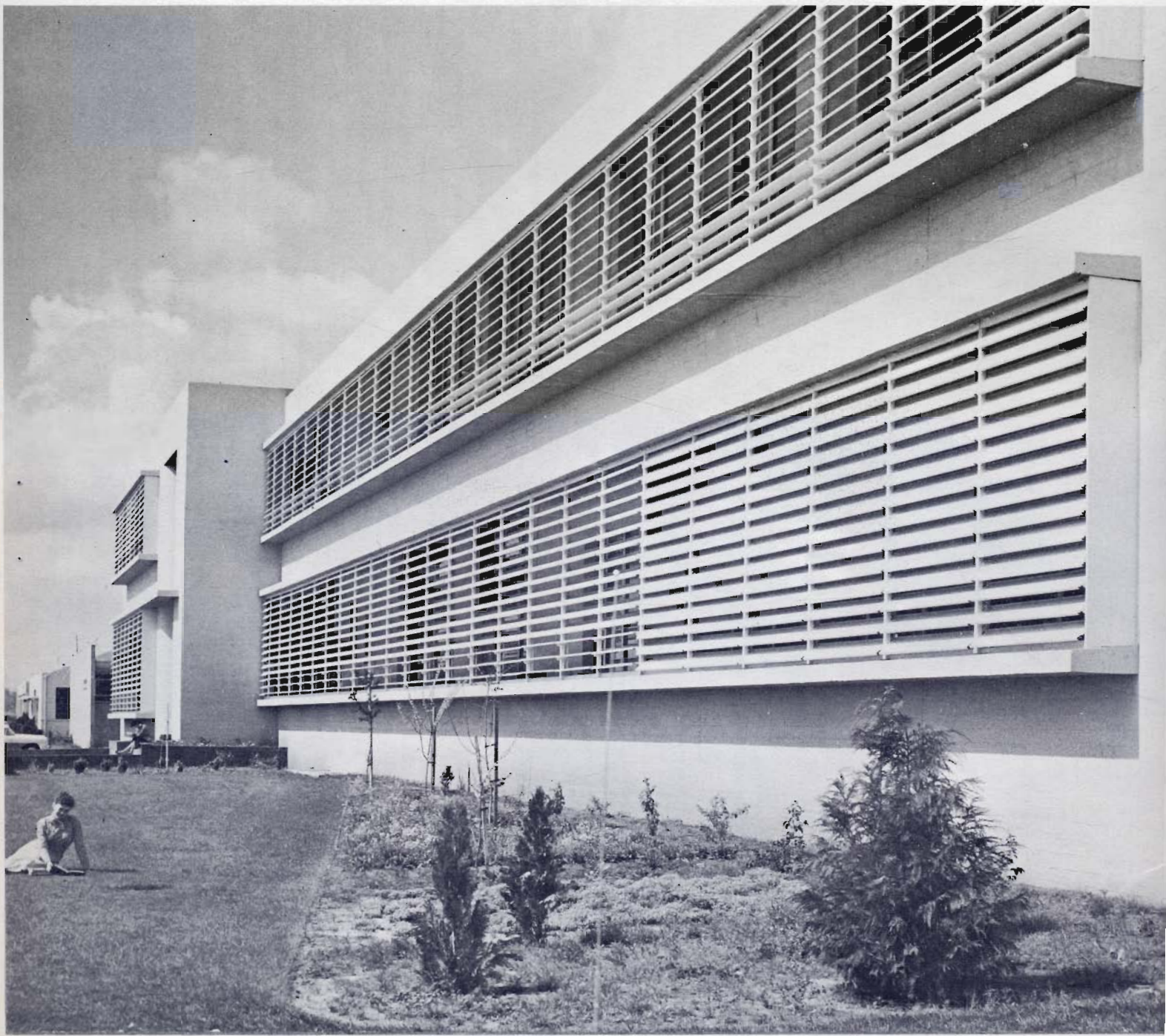
Special Services
